Nancy Ellen, the oldest daughter married Daniel Henry Drumm and became the mother of seven children. Mr. Drumm died in 1924. The oldest daughter, Martha Barber Drumm married Robert Caldwell Bolick and they have two children, Robert Caldwell Jr and Eugene Barber Bolick.

Sarah Drum married Sam Anderson Simpson and they have two small sons, Anderson Samuel and David Malcolm. The five remaining children are unmarried. William Henry works in a mercantile establishment in Columbia. and Julian Elliott Drum is still in school. Nancy Helen the remaining daughter is a teacher in Darlington S. C. The older son Leland Barber and David Marion Drum are out on their own.

John Hamilton Barber, the only son of of Thomas Jefferson Barber, is a farmer living near Chester, S. C. He married Grutruide Brown and they had three children, John Crawford Barber, graduated in 1931 from Clemson with a B.S degree. The younger son, William Brown Barber will soon finish his course at Clemson. The daughter Johnsyne Ruth finished Chester High School in 1932.

John Hamilton Barber is the kind of a citizen who is a credit to his community and the family connection whose history this book has undertaken to record. He is one of the progressive farmers and live stock breeders of Chester County. His specialty is registered Guernsey Cattle and in this connection carries on a model dairy. He is a deacon in the Presbyterian church of Chester, S. C. and a natural born Democrat. He has one of the best farms in his county.
