

## Barbers in the Civil War

In addition to Malcom, Nathaniel C. Barber had another son, Nathaniel, who served in the Civil War. Nathaniel also had a son-in-law who served.

Nathaniel C. Barber's brother, James Alexander Barber, had two sons who served in the Confederate Army: James Nathaniel Barber died (of Diphtheria) on January 11, 1862, in an Army hospital at Richmond. John C. Barber was killed in battle (around Richmond) on June 30, 1862.

Nathaniel Carmichael and James Alexander Barber were brothers of Nathaniel B. Hall's mother, Mary "Mollie" Barber Hall.

Lt. John L. Barber was also a grandson of John L. Barber, but I haven't figured out which brother was his father. He served in the 14<sup>th</sup> Alabama.
