

BEAM

Edrington's History states that the BEAMS were among the early settlers on Beaver and McClures Creeks. They moved upon the Chinguapin lands on the line of Chester and Fairfield.

McMaster's History, page 16 states: "Albert Beam had 100 acres on Reedy Creek, branch of Beaver Creek, 27 March 1773, also 50 acres 1 Dec 1772, probably settled long before this.

Ezekiel Beam has a warrant for 100 acres on branch of Mill Creek 3 May 1768"

A plat shows that one Allen Beams land was on Beaver Creek adjoining that of Dorcus Hill and near Thos. Meadow, Richard Hill and Samuel Mobley.

Elijah Beam is shown with land near that of George Powell, George Miller, Darkus Hill and Asaph Hill.
