Fairfield by M<sup>c</sup>-Master.

It says - In the Mahaley Survey mention  
is made of boundaries on lands of Meadore  
Phillips, Hart, Free, Wagner, Albert Beam  
etc.

Albert Beam has 100 acres on Reedy  
Creek, branch of Beaver Creek, March  
27, 1773 also 50 acres Dec. 1, 1772  
probably settled long before this.

Ezekiel Beam had warrant for 100  
acres on branch of Mill Creek, May 3  
1768.

He also says the Beams worshipped at  
Mahaley Meeting House.

Judge Beam was a private in Little  
River Guards in war between the States.


A. J. Beam was a private in Buck Head

Salomon Beam and his wife, Fannie, were

a Jesse Beam, probably the son of Albert Sr.

Notes & Diary of Mrs. Jennie L. Coleman  
says when the Colemans came to Fairfield  
they settled on Beaver Creek. They found  
the Wagners, Beams, and Mahleop Hessey  
here. There was intermarriage betw these  
families. The Beams came from Germany  
the Wagners from Holland and the  
Mahleop from England. The Beams  
settled on Hickory Flat. This was in  
what was known as Fort Wagner.
