Personal story about Martin Luther Lathan by William Clark Lathan, Jr. (his Grandson).

Although my Grandfather Martin Luther Lathan baptised me as a baby he died while I was still too young to get to know him. I wish had been able to know him. The following story tells you why.

In, 1971, I was a student at Carson-Newman College in Jefferson City, Tennessee. I had a girlfriend who lived out of town in Cleveland, Tennessee. She would from time to time come up to Carson-Newman, staying as a guest in a Dormatory, to visit me. As we were planning to get married soon after the end of school and she didn't drive, I offered to teach her. This was a very bad idea as I'm a very nervous driver-education teacher. During one practice session of a Sunday afternoon we choose to drive on a road that was skinny and winding. After a little while Peggy Jo became tired and informed me she wanted to quit her practice. Due to the nature of the road there was no easy and safe place to pull off and change drivers for quite some time and she became nervous. Finally a service station appeared around a bend in the road. You remember service stations, they were gas stations with a small garage for

repairs. I said she should slow down to about 5-10 mph and try to pull up in line with the pumps. As she pulled off the road, I and she realized that she was still going to fast to make the turn. She didn't make the turn as planned. She hit the first pump. It fell over dead spilling glass and metal parts across the driveway. The car, my pride and joy, had a few minor scraches but no real serious damage. However, the pump was VERY dead. Interestingly, no gas came out. I checked all the doors and windows of the station but is was closed. I went to a home nearby to see if they knew how I could report the damage. They said that they thought a church, maybe the Presbyterian Church, owned the property. That seemed strange but posible so I left my name and address and went on. On Monday, I called the name of of church member the guy had given me. Right off he said that the station was NEVER open now. The church had bought the property to use as a youth activity center. He told me to not worry about the pump that the county had been after them to remove the pumps but that he would pass my concerns along to the Session of the Church, they were to meet the next evening.

A couple of days later I received a note in the mail telling me to call a man about the pump. PANIC! When I called him he asked me if I were, William C. Lathan. I said, I was William Jr. He then said, "Well, let me see. Are you M.L. Lathan's Son or Grandson... Well, you must be his Grandson." He went on to tell me that my Grandfather, M.L. Lathan had been the minister of the Presbyterian Church at Dandridge, Tennessee. I already knew that. But the rest was a wonderful addition to my life. He said, "Back in the '30s your Grandfather was the minister in Dandridge and times were tuff. Forget about the pump. It is the least this church can do. Half the time we didn't even pay the man even though we said we would. He had to take a teaching job along with his ministry in order to keep himself and his family fed. For the record your Grandfather was the finest man I've known." No one could have a better epitaph.

Martin married Sarah Davis Melugin [12] [MRIN: 10], daughter of William Taylor Melugin Rev. [957] and Jane Elizabeth (Jenny Elizabeth) Davis [958], on 10 Mar 1909 in Ft Worth, TX. Sarah was born on 10 Nov 1874 in Bremond, Robertson Co., TX, died on 2 Jan 1963 in Lampassas, TX, and was buried in Oakhill Ce. Lampassas, TX.

General Notes: Sara/Sadie D. Melugin was educated at Brownwood, Texas. It appears that she met Martin Luther Lathan while in college. She was active in various churches that her husband pastored and was active until near the time of her death. A number of her church circle attended her funeral. She worked as a teacher in both Ft. Worth, Texas and Dandridge, Tennessee. Also, see Lillie Mae Melugin, her sister, for an interesting anecdote about REV. M.L. Lathan.

After the death of Fay, he remarried on Decemper 13, 1980, Donna Dee Melugin StClair, at William C. Lathan, Sr's. home, at 821 Westbrook, Garland, TX by Rev. Cliff Smith.

William Sr. the son of a Minister lived in a great number of places as a youth do to his fathers ministry. These were mostly in Oklahoma, Tennessee and Texas. Although he lived many years in Maryland (Baltmore, Rockville, Greenbelt, P.G County and Silver Spring) and then for 20 years, August 1960 to December 1980, in Manassas, Virginia, he always considered Texas as HOME.

In High School he was a member of the R.O.T.C. He was a music student studying Violin, Piano and Voice. He bacame an accomplished Violinist and played in his college orchestra and a number of semi-professional orchestras as an adult. He also had a trained Bass-Baratone voice and sung in a number of church choirs, notably New York Avenue

Presbyterian Church Choir in Washington, D.C. In later years opera became a great interest and he collected many recordings. He also collected and read books including the complete works of western novelest Zane Gray. He was an active church member in various Presbyterian and Methodist churches and at the time of his third marage became a baptist.

For many years he was an active Boy Scout Leader for his son's troop. Later he was a Commissioner for the Boy Scouts in the Manassas, Va. area.

He and his wife Fay were among the first members of the Osbourn High School (old site) Band Boosters where their son played flute. They were very active in fund raising for trips and equipment.

William Sr. worked for Striping Dept. Store in Fort Worth, Texas and taught school before moving east. Shortly before the Second World War he moved to Baltimore, Md. to work for the Social Security Administration. He was Drafted in the U.S. Army on June 12, 1942, Service Number: 33-202-217. After Training at Camp Picket, now Fort Picket, near Blackstone, Va. he was transferred to Camp Livingston near Alexandria, Lousiana. Later he Served at Schofield Barracks, HI and with Headquarters Tenth Army, Medical Corp, at Naha, Okinawa. He rose in rank from Private to Sergeant. When WWII ended he returned to the Social Security Administration but left to work in the field of his college education, Biology. He worked at the National Institutes of Health until retirement. Among the projects he worked on were the treatment of Amoebic Dysentery and then drug safety testing in the Pyrogen testing lab.

After the death of his wife, Fay, he returned to Tex and married Donna Dee Melugin StClair, a cousin. It was a late life marriage of convienence that provided him with a caregiver, companion and her with more security which she lacked due to divorce.

William Sr. died from the affects of a fall on November 17, 1989. He was taken by ambulance to St.Joseph Hospital in Paris, Texas where it was determined the he had some bleeding in his skull. He was transferred to Medical City Hospital in Dallas where they determined that the bleeding had stopped and was not life threatening. At about 1AM he was sent home. On the following Friday evening he complained of a severe headache and lapsed into a coma. He was taken by ambulance to St.Joseph Hospital where the doctors found that he had a ruptured vien in his brain with serious new bleeding. He was flown to Medical City Hospital in Dallas, Texas where he was operated on to fix th problem. He never returned to conciousness. An aside: Donna was not allowed to ride in the helicoper with William Sr. and drove the 90+ miles arriving at the hospital at the same time as the helicoper. Marriage of convienence?

Hazel was born on 16 Jan 1911 in Bellingham, WA, died on 25 Aug 1980 in Manassas, VA., and was buried in Tarrant Co., Mount Olive CE, TX.

General Notes: Hazel Fay Eakin was born in Belingham, WA. She grew up in Bartlesville, OK where she graduated from high school and attended business school. She held a number of jobs with various businesses in Bartlesville before relocating to Baltimore, Maryland. She was employeed at the Social Security Administration before the Second World War. She met William C. Lathan, Sr. at a Texas Club gathering in Baltimore and they married about three months later. During WWII she followed her husband into war related employement at least in part to follow his movements around the contenental United States and also so she could be near his family in Texas. In Texas she worked for a govt. agency buying and selling war materials. After the war she returned with William Sr. to Baltimore and worked with the

Social Security Administration until leaving to be a full time mother. She spent the next years raising her son and working in various volunteer positions, in particular as a Cub Scout Den Mother, Vacation Bible School Arts and Crafts instructor (New York Avenue Presbyterian Church, Wash.,D.C.), and as a camp counselor at the Presbyterian Church camp, Happy Valley, near Harve de Grace, MD.

Shortly before moving to Manassas, VA, she went back to full time employeement. She worked briefly for the Department of Navy at the National Naval Medical Center in Bethesda, MD. She then changed jobs and worked with the data processing dept. of the National Institutes of Health in Bethesda, MD. until retirement.

She was always interested in Wildflowers and had "her jungle" (a quote from her) in the family's back yard in Manassas, VA. She was also an animal lover and nearly always owned at least one cat. There are many photos of her an her pet cats.

She and William Sr. were active travelers and traveled regularly by automobile to various locations, particularly Texas and Oklahoma. They also made several trips to southwest Virginia searching family history. Photos and records from these trips were valuable in the compiling of this history. They also toured to the far west including California and Washington. On one such trip they were able to visit with an old high school friend Harol Lee. He had been just about the only kid of Chinese extraction to attend her high school in Bartlesville and they had been life long friends.

She had played Clarinet in her high school band. She and her husband were a driving force in the early days of the Osbourn High School Band Boosters, in Manassas, Va. They actively participated in fund raising working hundreds of hours.

Shortly after retirement she contracted Breast Cancer and spent about five years in treatment. Eventually, the cancer spread to where it could not be eradicated.

Her love of animals brought about some minor disagreement between her and her research biologist husband. However, true to her beliefs she allowed her doctors to use a number of experimental treatments on her. She always said that, "Those who don't like animal testing should volunteer to be a human Guinea pig." Realizing she was near the end she was true to her word. A NOTE: Her husband always said that having to destroy contaminated test animals was an emotionally difficult part of HIS job.

Notes: From my aunt Amelia (dau) of W.W. Every summer, Uncle Luther and Aunt Sadie and Clark would come to our home and stay a week (which was next door to the Lathan's homeplace). Most often he would hold a revival at Hopewell ARP Church or another church in the area vicinity. Uncle Bob Lathan would come from Macon, Ga.; Uncle Toy from Columbia, SC--They both worked for the railroad and would catch a train up to Blackstock.

Every summer most of Walters brother's and sister's would come and stay a week. Aunt Sara and Aunt Carrie from Roanoke, Va. I can still hear my mother "Irene" saying --- we"ve got to clean up--so and so is coming-- mama and papa seemed to enjoy them in our home.

Chester Lathan could always entertain all the children making "kites".

Notes about his death. Walter was on his way home from selling cotton in Blackstock, SC. he went by

Roberta Rice's home to pay her and her cousin "Basie" for picking cotton. Roberta was not at home at the time Mr Walter came by. Will Hood was there and he commented to "Basie", a blind man, that he was going to kill Mr Walter. Mr Walter went on down the path to go home--Roberta came home and was told Mr Walter had been by to pay her. She ran down the path to catch-up with Mr Walter and Will Hood follows her. She caught up with Mr Walter and Will had his gun and came up to Roberta and hit her on the arm with the gun. She said, "Will that hurt". Mr Walter said, "Will you shouldn't do that". Well I'm going to kill you. Mr Walter raised both arm's and said "Lord have Mercy". Will shot him right in the chest. Will then ran to tell his mother "Hat Johnson", he hadf shot Mr Walter. She in turn ran to Blackstock to tell Mr Walters minister Rev. S.A. Ewart what had happened. The Whole community was shocked.

Was killed Friday evening (Sept 20, 1940) around six o'clock by a 28 year old Negro, Will Hood (alias Willie Dixon). Witness to the incident was Roberta Rice. Hood was captured Sunday morning near Rock Hill, SC and turned over to Sheriff E.K Rabb.

Hood was brought to trial, in Feb 1941 court...The State vs Will Hood, male, Negro, for murder. Defendant stated in open court that he had no counsel and the Court assigned H. E. Ketchin, Jr. an attorney of the local bar, to represent defendant. Defendant was then arraigned. (The News and Herald, Winnsboro, SC; 20 Feb, 1941).

Will Hood gets Electric Chair...was sentenced to be electrocuted at the state penitentiary on April 11, 1941 for the shogun slaying of W.W. Lathan. Judge H. E. Henderson pronounced the manatory sentence of death by electrocution. (The News and Herald; Winnsboro, SC; Feb. 27, 1941).

Will was asked before he was electrocuted did he have anything to say.---He said-had to kill someone and Mr Walter was the first to come along. Will, his mother and father, "Hat and Hence Johnson" and half-sister had lived and worked on the farm for MrWalter. Will had stolen things many times and Mr Walter had told him to stop.He had him put on the "road" and he said then I'll get even with you someday. At the time of the shooting he was not living on the farm.
