The Kirpatrick's came from Carrickeegers County Autrim, Ireland where Jane was 14 years old. They came in a sail boat and were delayed three weeks in landing on account of winds. The Kirpatrick's were going futher west but when they reached Fairfield they found others from their home county so they settled in Fairfield in the Jackson Creek neighborhood.
