## GOODING FUNERAL SET FOR SUNDAY

Investigation Convicts Officers That Death Was Due to Accident.

Pittsburgh, Pa., Dec. 24.—(AP)—Detectives said tonight they are convinced the death of Robert F. Gooding, engineer, whose charred body was found in his blazing automobile, was accidental.

Gooding was found burned to death last night in his parked car near Wilkensburg.

Investigators said they learned Gooding's car caught fire two weeks ago from an exhaust leak and they believe a similar mishap resulted in his death.

Gooding was subject to heart attacks, members of his family said, expressing the belief he was too ill to escape from the flames.
