I have read through our copy of the minutes of Sandy Level Baptist Church 1817-1908.

This is what I was able to obtain for Asa Bell:

1817

from here on out is called brother

1817

is a delegate to association

1818

is a moderator

1/3/1824

appointed moderator for church

1/30/1832

in minutes called pastor

6/14/1834

accused of slander, Powell case, admits & is basically forgiven

10/6/1838

in minutes called pastor again

1839

church does not meet some, Asa very sick

6/6/1840

accused of different beliefs, Broom case,

church splits, Asa in smaller group,

starts meeting different Sundays in the month

7/18/1840 8/15/1840 Primitive Baptist Covenant is read, two groups asked to agree remaining smaller group dismissed from church, including Asa

after this no more mention of Asa in church minutes

This only mention of a Craig:

Sunday, Jan 6, 1833 Frances Craig wife of James D. Craig came forward Sunday, Feb 3, 1833 Frances Craig wife of James D. Craig baptized

This only mention of a name close to Delphia:

Delila Turket

member for many years, even after Asa had left

There was no mention of any of these names:

Ann Arledge Bell

Tyrus Bell and his wife Delphia (last name unknown)

Asa Bell Jr.

Vincent Bell

Alpheus Bell

Woodard Bell

Lydia Bell or Lydia Stone or William Stone

The letter is on loan to the University of South Carolina's South Caroliniana Library for digitization. Here is the typescript:

2014.030: Letter from, John L. Simpson to the Brethren of Crooked Run Baptist Church, Fairfield district, South Carolina, August 7, 1841

August the 7th 1841 to the Crooked Run Church

Dear Brethren

It grieves me very much to think that I have to bring charges against one of your members, but as I feel it a duty impressed on me I shall endeavor to do it in the spirit of meekness. I was appointed by our Association in 1840 to prepare her minutes for the press, and I got leave of her and called on Bro Jonathan Mickle to aid me, - and the 1st charge I bring against him is for adding the words (by Col. P. Davis) into a note at the bottom of a page in the circular letter of our Association in 1840 and not letting me know it, 2d the next is concerning a letter which he wrote and brought to our Church and used his endeavors to influence the Church to sign it and have it published in the Primitive Baptist paper which we refused to do, he now says the Church was not asked or expected to sign said letter 3d he then signed said letter in behalf of our Church and had it published; without the church knowing any thing about the way it was signed 4th he now says that a majority of the Church was in favour of his signing said letter in that way and now may our Heavenly Father enable you to act in accordance with his will as it respects these charges and I hope you will bring about a speedy reconciliation

Hi, John.

Reading over your correspondence with our genealogy researchers, I think I may have recently come across some clues. As a Bell was associated with the churches that split over becoming Primitive---something to do with certain observances or bible interpretations. We have a letter that we recently found about this split sometime around 1840. I am not absolutely certain of the details as I am writing from home but Asa was associated with Crooked Run Baptist church, along with the Arledges. I have been involved in the past year trying to save the circa 1830 frame church building from being demolished by its congregation. I attach an article I wrote for your information.

I am also copying this correspondence to my friend Frances Jolly, who is, I think, a descendant of Asa Bell and may have some information to share with you. Please keep us all in the loop of information as you find out more. We try to record as much as we can from those who contact us seeking Fairfield County ancestors.



Thanks for the information. My ancestor that lived in Richland and Fairfield counties is Asa and Ann Arledge Bell. He was born in 1772, and lived in the area until the mid 1840's. He was a Primitive Baptist minister. He died in Natchitoches Parish, LA in 1848. His son (my ancestor) was Tyrus and his wife Delphia(last name unknown), this in one of the things I would like to find. Asa, also had children Asa Jr., Vincent, Alpheus, Woodard, and a dau named Lydia that married William Stone. There are other daus, unsure of names, possibly one married a Craig and another married an Armstrong. I have more information and have had some research other than my own conducted. Waiting to hear. Also Asa's father is Francis need some more of his probate or land deeds in Kershaw.
