1817 in Alleghany Co., Md., 1 yr.; affid. certified by Ebenezer S. Davis, J.P. (son of Ebenezer?). Service: enl. 1777-1778 in Md. under Capt. Thomas Bell of Fort Cumberland; pvt. in Md. Troops, Col. Rawling's Regt. REF: Pens. S.32210 Md.; Susp. Pens. List, p.412--for proof of identity with the war's man of the Md. Line.

DAVISON, SAMUEL

Franklin

b. ca. 1765, 4 mi. from Tawney River, Pa. After War liv. near Lynchburg, Bedford Co., Va.; East Tenn.; West Tenn.; Franklin Co., Ind. Pens. appl. 10-11-1836, ae. 70, Ray Twp., Franklin Co., Ind. Service: enl. 1781 near Lynchburg, Va., ca. 2 mo. ante Batt. of Guilford, as subst. for father, James Davison; served with bro-in-law, Michael Gilbert; served under Capt. Moon (Moor?), who was killed at Batt. of Guilford. REF: Pens. R.2694 Va.; Rej. Pens. List, p.4-6--did not serve 6 mos.

DEMOSSE, REUBEN

Martin

(Uncertain, but probable because of advanced age). His affid. on 8-11-1834, Martin Co., Ind., ae. ca. 84, in pens. file of John Blake (see this Suppl.) that he & Blake were in War together & that they had liv. in same neighborhood for many years. See "Roster" p.119, Andrew Demoss, b. 1753 (who could be younger bro. of Reuben; b. ca. 1750) for possible clue as to Reuben's service. Reuben never appl. for pens. REF: Pens. R.913 S.C. (John Blake).

DENBO, -----

Harrison

(Uncertain). Mr. Schrum has Rachel Denbow. She is possibly the widow of a Denbo soldier who may or may not have died in Ind. Or, Denbo may be her surname by a second marriage. A Joseph Denbo was appt. Lieut. of the Light Infantry, 5th Regt. (Harrison Co.), Ind. Terr. Mil., 7-26-1811. A Robert Denbo was appt. Lieut. in Ind. Terr. Mil., Clark Co. (from part of which Harrison Co., was formed Dec. 1808) 7-6-1808. REF: Mr. Schrum; "Exec. Journ. of Ind. Terr., 1800-1816" pp.175, 147.

Washington

b. ca. 1744; d. 12-30-1831; m. Mary Ann --- (ae. 68, 10-9-1820). Pens. appl. 8-23-1819, ae. 75, Washington Co., Ind.; 10-9-1820, ae. 76. In 1835 Pens. List, ae. 87; pvt. in Va. Line. Service: enl. Jan. 1777, Fort Pitt, Pa., Capt. Andrew (?) Waggoner, Col. James Wood, 12th Va. Regt. in Cont. Estab., or Col. John Neville. (Note: a John Deremiah (son?) was commn. Capt. in 19th Regt., Ind. Mil., Washington Co., Ind., 5-16-1818. REF: Pens. S.36504 Va.; 1835 Pens. List, v.3, p.36; "Exec. Proc. of Ind., 1816-1836" page 70.

6TH DIVISION REPULSES THREE STRONG COUNTERATTACKS

Along the north and east of Manila troops of the XIV Corps Sunday continued pressure against strong enemy defensive positions. Troops of the 6th Infantry division drove off three strong enemy counterattacks along the Wawa-Antipolo line. The 11th Airborne division captured Ternate, 18 miles southwest of Cavite. In the XI Corps sector along the Zambales mountains the 38th division seized town and an air field on the coast 27 miles north of San Marcelino.

Two enemy planes made an ineffective attack on Tacloban air field on Leyte while two other Jap bombers raided the Lingayen gulf area on Luzon. One plane was shot down by anti-aircraft fire.

Troops of the Americal division have occupied two more strategic islands on the main shipping lane from the U. S. to Manila, landing on Burias and Ticao off the southeast coast of Bicol peninsula on southern Luzon. Gen. Douglas MacArthur says that occupation of these two islands will result either in evacuation or easy destruction of the Japanese positions on the peninsula.

General MacArthur reported Sunday the massacre of 150 American prisoners of war by the Japanese constabulary at Puerto Princesa on Palawan island. He said that evidence had been uncovered by American forces on the island that the Japanese guard threw gasoline on the bulk of the American prisoners, ignited it and then machine-gunned or bayoneted any who tried to flee. Five Americans escaped.
