The following is from the application of John Blako for a pension as a soldier of the Revolutionary War. It was dated October 17, 1832 and made from Monroe County, Indiana, the home of his brother-in-law, Henry Sanders, although his home at that time was in Martin County, Indiana:

Born 1761 or 1762, on Watseo (Watoreo) River, Fairfield Co., S. C.; Wife's name was Sarah _____. After the War he moved to the Broad River and there married, he moved back to Fairfield County for about 2 years. He then moved to North Carolina ("thinks Anson County") for 3 years; then to Cheshire (?) for 1 year; then to Granger Co., Tenn. for about 4 years. He then moved to the Cumberland River in Kentucky for 3 or 4 years and to Hardin Co., Ky. where he lived 20 years. He moved to Martin County, Indiana about 1827.

The complete file from the National Archives does not disclose his children's names. The primary source for the names listed herewith is an affidavit filed to effect the transfer of real estate in Martin County, Indiana after the death of John Blake and his widow.
