THIS MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT made and entered into this 26th day of October, A. D. 1915, between M. C. Boulware, hereinafter styled the lessor, and W. T. Boulware, hereinafter styled the lessoe, WITNESSETH:

That, in consideration of the rent to be paid by the lesses, as hereinafter set forth, the lessor covenants and agrees to rent to the lessee all that certain piece, parcel or plantation of land lying, being and situate in the County of Fairfield, in the State aforesaid, known as the Chess Crosby Place, containing three hundred and twenty four (324) acres, more or less, being bounded on the North by lands of O. M. Wishart; on the East by lands of the estate of John Wishart; on the South by lands of J. D. Boulware and others, and on the West by lands of C. G. Boulware.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of land and premises to the lessee from the 1st day of January, A. D. 1916 until the 31st day of December, A. D. 1916.

And the lessee, on his part, hereby covenants and agrees to pay to the lessor as rent for the said tract or plantation of land twenty four hundred (2400) pounds of good, middling, lint cotton packed into merchantable bales, which shall become due, payable and deliverable on or before the E5th day or October, A. D. 1915, at Leeds, S. C.

and the said lessor and lessee hereby mutually covenant and agree with each other that should the lessee pay unto the said lessor on or before the 1st day of January, 1917, the sum of Five hundred Dollars, which sum shall include the proceeds of sale of the rent cotton above reserved, then, and in that event the lessor hereby covenants and agrees, in consideration of the additional sum of Twenty five hundred (\$2500) Dollars to be paid by the lessee, as hereinafter provided, to convey the said tract
