VII SAMUEL BOYD (ca. 1769 - ca. 1831-1839), son of Samuel Boyd and wife Frances, was born in Cumberland Co., Pa., or Charlotte Co., Va., if we are correct as to his approximate birthdate. The family moved from Pa., to Va., during the 1769-1770 period. As we show later, Samuel married Mary (Polly) Collier, daughter of Joseph and Amy Collier of Edgelyield District, S.C. Samuel's sister, Martha Boyd Borum, widow of Willis Borum, married Polly Collier's brother, Abialbon Collier. Samuel and Polly's oldest child was Augustus Boyd, born in 1796, which indicates they married about 1795 or earlier. We learned from the administration papers of Robert Boyd, brother of Samuel, that Samuel and his family moved to the Mississippi Territory prior to 1804, the period in which this territory was being settled.

The Old Natchez District formed in 1801 included the oldest settlements. The counties in the district were - Adams (formed 1799), Claiborne (1802, Wilkinson (1802), Amite (1809), Franklin (1809), Warren (1809), Pike (1815), Hinds (1821), all located in the extreme southwestern corner of the State.

The 1810 Census for Franklin Co., lists Samuel Boyd and household - 2 males over 21, 5 males under 21, 1 female over 21, 3 females under 21, 5 slaves. The inhabitant list in 1816 of the Natchez District includes the following Boyds -

1830 Census (Formed 1823) Yazoo County

Samuel Boyd (born 1760-1770) was listed as 60-70 in 1830 Census of Yazoo County, Miss. This county, formed in 1823, was cut off from Hinds County, formed in the Choctaw Cession in 1820. Samuel was in the Mississippi Territory as early as 1804. Mississippi became a State on 12-10-1817. At the completion of the Louisiana Purchase in 1803 thousands of settlers rushed into Mississippi for the available new land. Many of the land seekers were former residents of New England communities and some of the Southern states along the Atlantic Coast (Ref. Handy Book for Genealogists - Lorton & Rasmuson). Our records prove Samuel Boyd of our "brother & sister" group was among the early settlers. He is not listed in the 1840 Census so it appears he died during the 1830's.

Samuel Boyd (Yazoo County, Miss.)

The 2nd Choctaw Cession of 1820, opened up territory north of the old Natchez District. It included Hinds Co., formed in 1821, from which Yazoo County was formed in 1823, and the southern part of Holmes County which was formed in 1833. (Note: Holmes Co., was in the Alabama Territory in 1817). As the 1830, 1840 and 1850 Census records indicate, Samuel Boyd and his son Augustus Boyd moved to Yazoo County in section of county which was Holmes County after 1833.

The above Census records covering a period of about 50 years give a fairly good picture of the area in Mississippi where Samuel and his family resided after moving to Mississippi. No doubt further research of the Mississippi records in the counties involved and the Dept. of Archives & History in Jackson, Miss., will reveal more information. Before moving to Mississippi it is assumed that Samuel resided in Columbia Co., Ga., or Edgefield Co., S.C. We learn to the latter since his wife Polly was from Edgefield and the above 1850 Census for their son Augustus lists his birthplace as S.C. In Burke County, Ga., Land Grants were made to Boyds as follows:

It is our conclusion, if these were members of our Boyd family, that this Samuel was the father.

1840 Census

Holmes County (Formed 1833 from Hinds & Yazoo Counties)

On 12-5-1794 Samuel Boyd was granted 95 acres in Columbia County, Ga. butting and bounding East by James Boyd's Land, NW by Jennings Land and Meriwethers Land, Southwest by Joseph Thomas Land and Southeast by Reed's Land. This is definitely our James Boyd and very likely Samuel his father. Earlier on 1-7-1793 a warrant from Thomas Moore, Merryman Thorn & Peter Crawford, Esqrs. was made to Samuel Boyd for 200 acres adjoining the same landowners, however, only 95 acres was granted.

The following book entries from Robert Boyd's Administration Papers (Edgefield Co., S.C.) are proof Samuel was in Mississippi prior to Oct. 27, 1802.
"To Hezekiah Boyd by receipt dated Oct. 27, 1802 to be carried to Samuel Boyd \$100.00 for self \$30.00"
"To William Boyd to be carried to Samuel Boyd in the Mississippi Territory, receipt dated 16th April 1804."
"Sent by John Callihan to Samuel Boyd, receipt dated 23rd May 1804."
Rev. Hezekiah Boyd and his brother Doctor Wm. Boyd were given passports on 11-26-1805 by the Governor of Georgia to pass through Indian Territory enroute to Mississippi Territory. Possibly they had made earlier trips out there to visit Samuel as evidenced by above receipts for money to be carried to Samuel. It is also significant that a Samuel Boyd on 10-27-1810 was given a passport by the Governor - "Passports 1785-1820, by Hays, page 253" - Samuel Boyd, wife and four children from Burke County, Georgia to travel through Greek Nation. If this is our Samuel, he apparently had returned from the Mississippi Territory to get his family. We don't think this is the case for the Census records above show another Samuel Boyd in Mississippi, a neighbor of our Samuel.
Joseph Collier, father of Mary (Polly) Collier, left will dated 12-26-1818. Polly was probably dead at the time for the will names the children of Polly and Samuel Boyd. A close check of the administration papers of Joseph Collier's Estate may give valuable information.

The Will of Joseph Collier which follows is self-explanatory. Of particular interest are the names of Samuel & Polly Boyd's children who were minors as stated in the will - "to be equally divided between the Survivor or Survivors of them as they become of age or marry."

I, Joseph Collier, of the District of Edgefield, and State of South Carolina, being weak in body, but of sound and perfect mind and memory; do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form following, that is to say:
First, I give to my granddaughter Mary Magdeline Chastain Garrett, one negro girl named Mary, to her and her heirs forever, that she be delivered when called for.
Item - I give to my grand son, Joseph Collier, when he arrives to the full age of twenty one years, one negro fellow named Lew. Buy my will and desire is that my Executrix and Executors hereinafter to be mentioned shall keep the said fellow and pay at the rate of seventy dollars a year hire for said fellow and the hire to be laid out at the discretion of my said Executrix & Executors toward schooling my said grand son, Joseph Collier, and his sister, Annah Collier. But if my said grandson should die before he arrives to the full age of twenty one or without lawful issue my will is that the negro fellow, Lew, be given to his sister, Annah Collier, and if she should die leaving no issue lawfully begotten of her own body then and in that case my will and desire is that the negro, Lew, return back to my Estate
Item - I lend to my beloved wife Amy Collier all my property both real and personal not heretofore bequeath during her natural life and my will and desire is that she should get her son, Hillary Collier, to attend and see to her business and at the death of my wife to my son-in-law, Samuel Boyd, I give one dollar, and to my two daughters-in-law, Patsy Collier & Catherine Collier, I give the sum of one dollar each to my daughter, Polly Boyd, six children, Augustus, Joseph, John, Amy, Sarah, & Cynthia Boyd I give the sum of
