

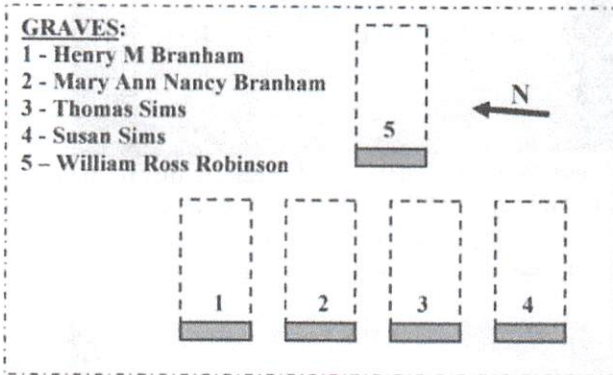
Branham–Robinson–Sims Cemetery

5 graves only

1985 Smallwood Road (S-20-46), Ridgeway, Fairfield County, SC



GPS coordinates: N34° 16' 21" & W80° 55' 7" (or: 34.2726, -80.918611). Located on private property.

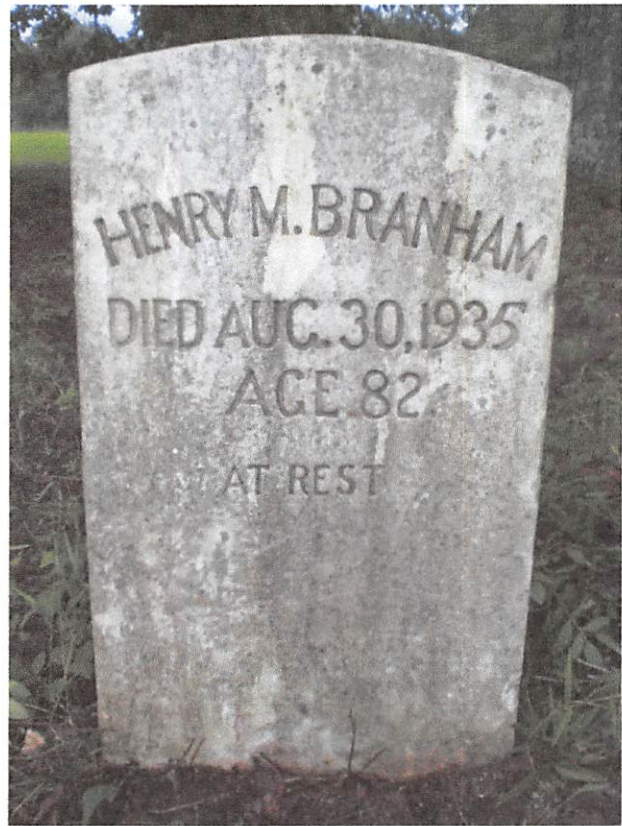


Research on the five interments here was gathered from available death certificates, as noted, and from 3 Federal censuses: 1880, 1900, and 1910. There are differences between the census reports, such as ages and name variations, and no one of them should be accepted as completely factual, but as excellent guides.

In those three reports there was only one “Henry (or H, or HB) Branham” enumerated in the Ridgeway district each time.

The census reports show that these individuals all lived adjacent to each other. For example, the 1900 Census enumerated these three consecutive Ridgeway households:

- (1) Thomas Sims (head); with W (R or A) *Robertson* [error?] son-in-law + wife (name illegible).
- (2) Henry Branham (head) and wife Amanda.
- (3) Adolphus Branham (head) age 22; wife Amelia age 24 + two daughters.



1880 Census: Henry Branham, age 25, occupation – wagoner (?); wife Amanda age 26; son Adolphus age 3.

1900 Census: Henry Branham age 48 farmer; **wife Amanda** age 50; living in the next household to Adolphus and Amelia Branham.

1910 Census: Enumerates “**H B** Branham” age 60 farmer; **wife Mary Ann** age 57; living in the next household to Adolphus and Amelia Branham.

The last two censuses above highlight the inconsistency between the reports. We know from death certificates that Adolphus Branham was the son of Henry and Amanda. It is clear that they lived in adjacent households in 1900 and 1910. (We conclude that H B and Henry Branham must be the same person.)

Death certificate for **Henry Branham, Sr** :

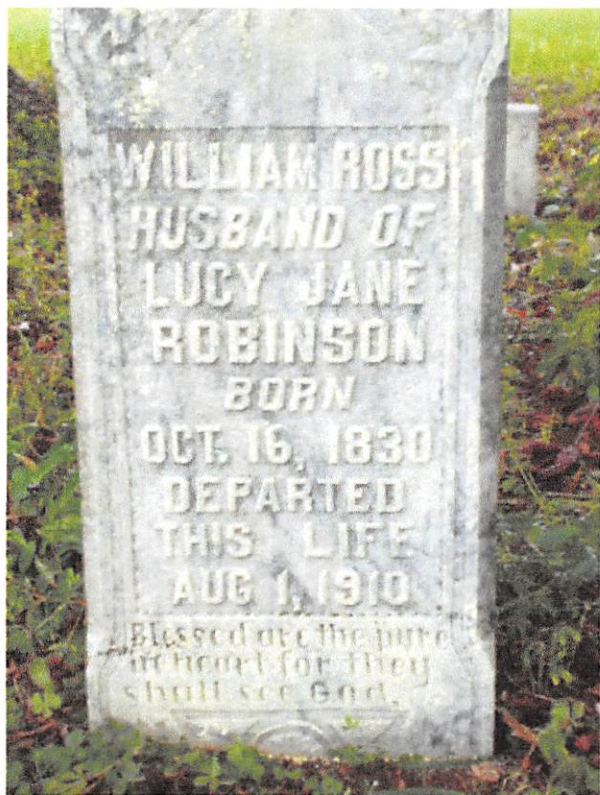
Born in Fairfield County, SC. Died in Winnsboro Mills, Fairfield County, the same date as on above tombstone. Age 83 yrs, 7 mos, 29 days – this puts his birth date about Feb 1852. Buried Fairfield County, Aug 31st. Widowed husband of Amanda S Branham whose birth date is stated as 24 Jan 1858 (year should be 1851).

His parents: Father unknown; mother - Nancy Gladney. Informant: Amelia Branham (daughter-in-law).

William Ross Robinson. Husband of Lucy Jane Robinson. Her grave not here; she was 22 years younger than WRR.

June 1910 Census: Lists the household of Wm(?) R Robinson (head) age 82, L J Robinson (wife) age 60, and Thomas Simms (father-in-law) age 82.

Obituary: Lucy Jane died in Monetta, SC, 29 Nov 1924 at nephew J.E. Simms's home ("The State" newspaper, 19 Dec 1924). Buried Ridge Spring.

Other Historical Notes –

Amelia Branham, noted on page 1 above as informant on Henry Branham's death certificate, was the widowed wife of Adolphus Branham, son of Henry. She died 26 Nov 1953; buried in Winnsboro Mills Cemetery (now called Royal Pines Cemetery) beside her husband.

Death certificate for Adolphus Branham – States that he was the son of Henry and Amanda Branham; wife was Amelia. He died 1935; buried Winnsboro Mills Cmty. Adolphus and Amelia were parents of six daughters per the 1910 census.

Obituary for Mrs. Amelia Branham – Eight children, including 7 daughters and one son, Henry ("Buck"). Last two born after 1910.

South Carolina death records (free to the public) currently available only for the approx. years 1915 – 1955, plus misc records before.

Obituaries - None found for any of these interments (except for Mrs Amelia Branham)

Funeral records – Do not exist from early funeral directors or Bruce Funeral Co, Winnsboro.

NOTE: The 1890 Census was destroyed by fire in Washington, DC.

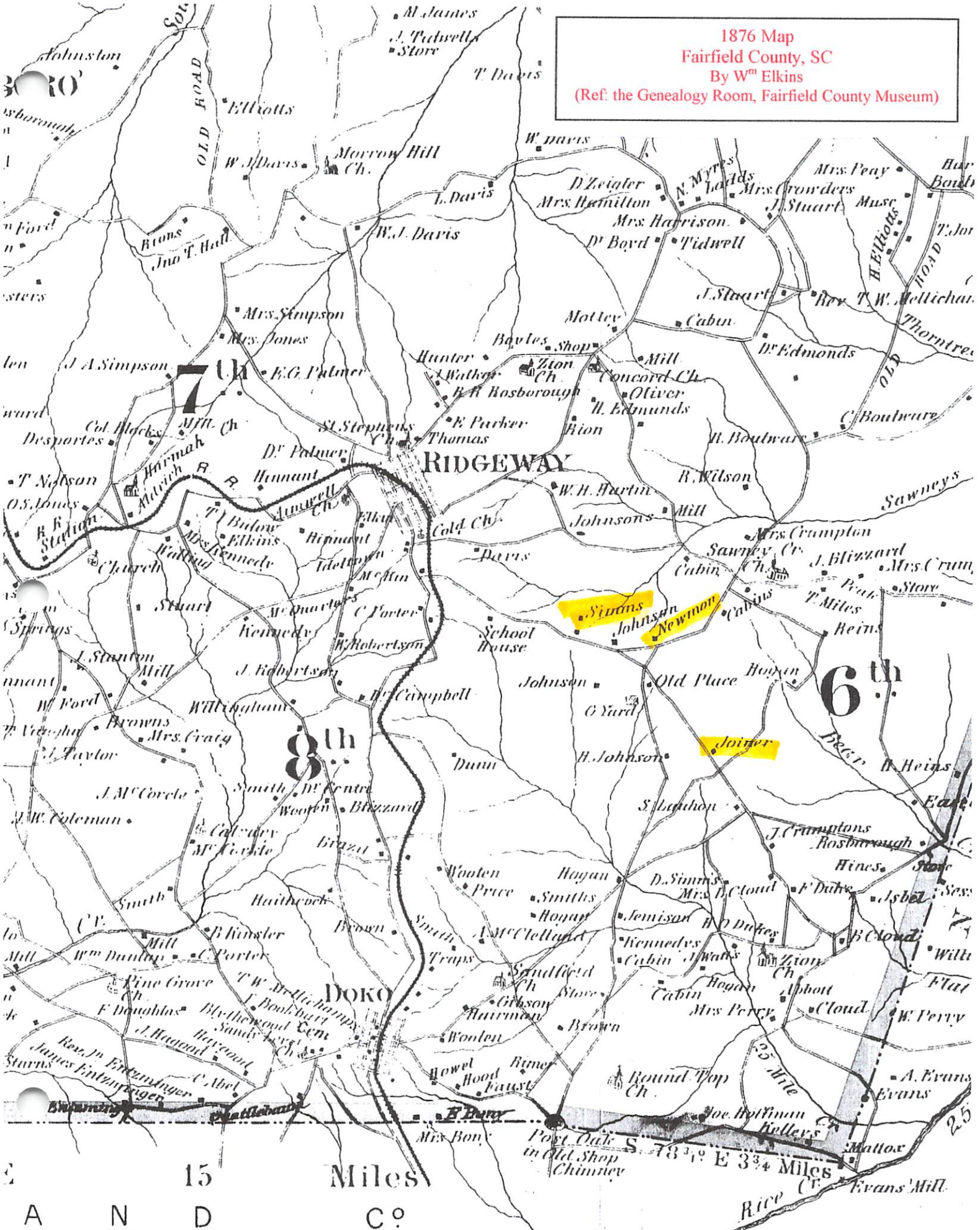

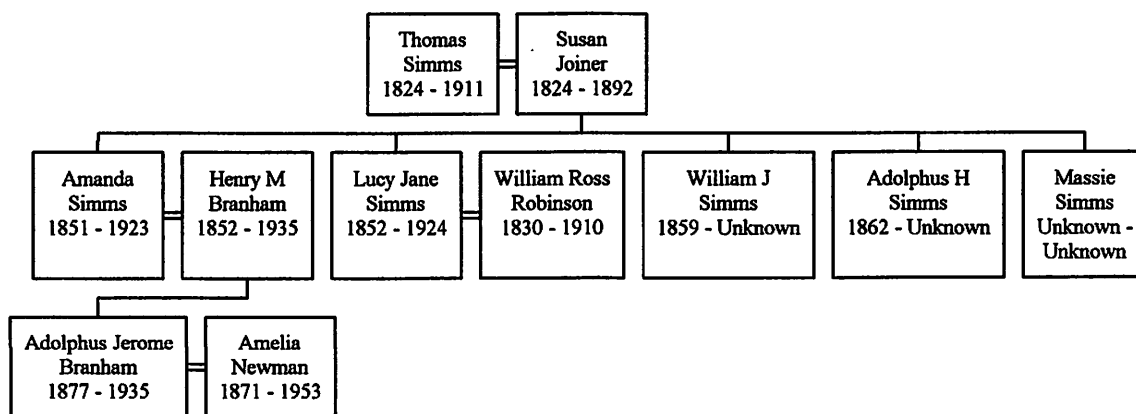

Notes for AMANDA SIMMS:

May have been known also as "Mary Ann Nancy." The tombstone for Mary Ann Nancy beside Henry Branham's grave says: WIFE OF HENRY BRANHAM."

BIRTH DATES AND DEATH DATES FOR BOTH PERSONS ARE THE SAME DATES.

Amanda's death certificate says, "wife of Henry Branham." Also that her parents were Thomas Simms and Susan Joiner.
