McKain with his mother, Mrs. Elizabeth McKain, citizens of our town, also Mrs. Vaughan and her daughter Miss Virginia, former residents of this place, all perished by the destruction of the steamer Orline St. John, which was consumed by fire on the Alabama River on Tuesday evening last, between Mobile and Montgomery.
