JUSTICES OF THE PEACE

The *Journal of His Majesty's Council for South Carolina*, May 29, 1721–June 10, 1721, records the Justices of the Peace commissioned, June 1, 1721.

The *South-Carolina Gazette* of June 15, 1734, published the names of Justices of the Peace commissioned by the Governor, with the advice of the Council, June 7, 1734.

The *South-Carolina Gazette* of April 2, 1737, published the names of Justices of the Peace commissioned by the Governor, with the advice of the Council, March 26, 1737.

The *South-Carolina Gazette* of November 4, 1756, published the names of Justices of the Peace commissioned by the Governor, with the advice of the Council, October 25, 1756.

The *Journal of the General Assembly of South Carolina*, March 26, 1776–April 11, 1776, records (pp. 15–20) the Justices of the Peace elected by that body, March 30, 1776.
