According to the 1900 census Joseph was 21 years old, black male, married to Annie, black female, who was 22 years old. The couple lived with Joseph's father Thomas (Tom) Caldwell, black male age 63, and wife Hester age 70, black female.

According to the 1900 census Calvin Brice, Black male, born September 1880, age 19, married to Annie, black female, born September 1882, age 17, John son, age 1, black male, born April 1899.

Land information

According to Court records:

November 24, 1897, J.A. Homer Brice sold 32 acres of land to Alice Brice for the amount of one hundred sixty dollars. Bounded by lands of Mobley, McKeon, Mrs. Emma Mobley and said A.H. Brice.

February 20, 1944, Calvin Brice, purchased 26 acres of land from a T.J. Cunningham.

August 15, 1944 Joseph Caldwell who at this time lived in Portsmouth, Virginia sold his brother my grandfather Calvin Brice 32 acres of land for one dollar. This land is bounded on the northwest and west by land of A.H. Brice, east and northeast by land formerly owned by Mrs. Nannie Mobley, now of E.M. Kennedy, south by lands formerly of McKeon now of H.N. Kennedy and being the tract of land of which Alice Brice died, seized and

possessed, leaving to her sons the grantee and grantor. I was told that both sons were left some land.

December 19. 1944 Calvin Brice purchased 29.1 acres of land from Edward M. Kennedy, Jr. for the amount of four hundred dollars. The Land is bounded on the north by lands of Brice, on the East by public road, on the South by lands of Edward M. Kennedy Jr., and on the west by lands of Calvin Brice.

The following land records are questionable. There was two other Alice Brice both white.

Alice Jane Brice, born 1861 died 1926, her father was Gardner Brice. Alice Brice, no date of birth or death, her father was John Alexander Brice born November 8, 1822, died November 1890. Alice married John M. Todd.

February 20, 1898, G. Brice to Alice C. Brice 550 acres of land.

September 26, 1899 Samuel G. Brice sold 259 acres of land to an Alice C. Brice for the amount of one dollar. The tract of land known as the Mobley place bounded on the South and east by lands of T.S. Brice and on the west my lands formerly belonging to Dr. Walter Brice.
