ALICE GERTRUDE MOORE BROWN, the daughter of the late Reverend Samuel and Alice Douglas Moore, was born in Fairfield County, South Carolina in September 1913 and departed this fruitful life on Friday, December 18, 1987 after declining health.

Being reared in a Christian home, Alice ("Gert") joined St. Mary's Presbyterian Church at an early age and years later transferred her membership to Mt. Tabor Presbyterian Church where she was a member of the choir, active in Sunday School and other functions and served as an elder until a decline in health.

Alice ("Gert") Brown was educated in her early years at St. Mary's Presbyterian Missionary School and received an associate degree from Brainard Institute in Chester.
