JAMES D. BROWN SUGGUMBS HERE

Retired Contractor, 73, Dies
After Being in Poor Health
For Many Years.

James D. Brown, 73, retired contractor of Charlotte and for 51 years a resident of Mecklenburg county, died at his home, 1219 East Seventh street at 11 o'clock last night after being in bad health for the last five or six years.

Funeral services will be conducted at Trinity Methodist church on the Beatty's Ford road this afternoon at 4 o'clock.

Mr. Brown is survived by his widow, the former Miss Ma M. King, and the following sons and daughters: Sam. Brown of Delta, and J. S. Brown, E. K. Brown, C. T. Brown, Mrs. W. T. Phillips, Mrs. S. S. Armstrong, Miss Ethel Brown and Miss Frances Brown of Charlotte.

Also seven grandchildren, Robert Brown of Big Springs, Texas, and one half brother, Thomas A. McCasley of Lenore survive.

Mr. Brown was one of the best known residents of Mecklenburg county. He was married twice, his first wife being the former Miss Molly Kimbrell.

During his active days as a contractor he supervised the erection of many of Charlotte's building structures. Included are the Charlotte Sanatorium, the Atherton mills, the Atlantic Waste company, the D. A. Tompkins Tower and 35 or 40 cotton mills in the central section of the state.
