I Thomas Brown of Fairfield District, do make and declare this my last will and Testament- First. To my niece Parthenia Rugeley wife of John Rugeley I devise one half of my Lands on the Wateree River, where I now plant; the part hereby devised is to be ~~paid~~ off on the upper part of the said plantation or Tract of Land, by a line to begin on the river at the fence which divides the land planted by the said John Rugeley from the land planted by myself and to follow the said fence untill it comes to the main Road then to go up the main Road untill it comes to a crows fence on the left side of said Road (which fence runs below John Rugeley's negro Houses) and to follow the said Fence from the said Road untill its termination and then from the termination of the said fence by a straight line to the back line of the said Tract of Land: To have and to hold the said Lands to the said Parthenia during the Term of her natural life only (hereby intending to give her a life Estate merely) and from and immediately after her death, to the Issue of her Body who may be then living share and share alike absolutely and in fee simple; and in case she should die without leaving issue of her Body then living, I give and devise the said Lands one half to my nephew John Irvin and his Heirs and assigns for ever, and the other half of the said land to my niece Mary McCall wife of Hugh McCall; to have and to hold the same to the said Mary McCall during the Term of her natural life only, and from and immediately after her death to the issue of her Body who may be living at the time of her death share and share alike, absolutely and in fee simple. **SECONDLY.
