

Dr. Buchanan Is Appointed to University Board of Trustees



Dr. John Creighton Buchanan of Winnsboro was named by Governor Byrnes on December 3 to the University of South Carolina Board of Trustees. He replaces the late R. B. Hilderbrand of York, who died a short time ago from injuries sustained in an automobile accident. Dr. Buchanan will represent the 6th district in a term running until the General Assembly fills the post by election. At that time, he will be a candidate to succeed himself.

Dr. Buchanan is the first Fairfield man to serve as a University trustee in more than 40 years. The late James Q. Davis filled the post circa 1912 or later and an ancestor, another John Buchanan, was on the University board from 1845 until his death in 1862.

Dr. Buchanan, a member of the University Class of 1922, was an active student leader, holding many posts of honor. Among them: president of the Freshman class, secretary of the Student Body, editor of *The Gamecock* newspaper, business manager of

the *Garnet and Black* (annual), manager of the basketball team, student instructor in Chemistry. He was graduated from Washington University School of Medicine, St. Louis, Missouri, interned in Barnes Hospital at St. Louis, Johns Hopkins, Baltimore, Md., and the Columbia Hospital Columbia, S. C. He has practiced medicine in Winnsboro continuously since 1929 except for the five-year period he was in the army. He served in this country and abroad (both in Iceland and in the European theatre), became a lieutenant colonel and was chief of medicine in the army's 196th General Hospital.

He is listed in "Who's Who in the South and Southwest" and in "Who's Important in Medicine." Both his grandfather and father were doctors before him, the former beginning his practice here in 1845, the later in 1887.

Dr. Buchanan is a member of Winnsboro Board of Public Works (water and lights) and a member
