The Trip Across The Atlantic

Ship Passage on the Caldonia

A rule of thumb for adult passenger was one ton of shipping space per adult passenger. On the Caldonia, there were at least 230 passengers. This did not include a crew of between 15 to 25. She was a overcrowded ship.

The average trip to America in 1752 took 10 to 13 weeks. However, to Charles Town you could add another two weeks.

The ship left Rotterdam, Netherlands but did not sail straight to Charles Town. It first stopped at Portsmouth, England a seacoast town in Southern England. After several days in this port they started the trip to Charles Town.

The cost of the trip from Rotterdam to Charles Town ran 60 to 80 Rheinische Gulde. Examples of income of the period are as follows. A maid made between 12 to 15 per year. A servant in the Palace of Prince-Bishop in Wurzburg made 20. A coachman made 24. A Night watchman in Winterhausen made 12

This is the main reason most of the German passengers would exchange passage for 7 years of his labor. This was usually done at the time of arrival in Charles Town. It was a set up to the highest bidder. This was called the Redemptioner System. (See attached photo copy of newspaper from the date shortly after arrival. Advertisement for German Servants)

It does not appear that John Philip Caspar Beyrle had to work as a servant as some how he had prepaid his trip. We do not know whether he had any one with him; but at the time of his arrival he was alone.

The conditions on board ship were miserable. Henry Melchior Muhlenberg who came to South Carolina early described the trip as follows.

"There was always a severe lack of good drinking water and some of the passengers survived by drinking vinegar and olive oil. Rats were known to chew the corks off the vinegar bottles and lower their tails into the bottle and then lick their tails. At night the rats would lick the sweat off the face of the passengers."

The trip was miserable, stench, vomiting, sea sickness, dysentery, heat, constipation, boils, scurvy and very bad food that was not fit to eat. Lice ran rampart. It was stated that children rarely survived the voyage

Gottlieb Mittelberger stated that on his voyage that..."I witnessed such misery in no less than 32 children on our ship died. These were thrown into the sea.

One of the sister ships to the Caldonia, the Elizabeth which also arrived with Germans from Swabia petitioned the Council Chamber for redress. This was filed on the third day of March, 1753.

They were signed on by Nicholas Purcell at Rotterdam. He was to provide the following: 1. Suitable cabins made ready for lodging. A cabin 6 feet long and 6 feet broad for every 4 grown persons whole freight. 2. That he promised to provide wholesome and fresh provisions consisting of meat, bread, flour, barley, peas, beans, cheese, butter, vinegar, molasses, beer and water. 3. A fire shall be allowed to burn from 6 o'clock in the morning to 6 o'clock in the evening. 4. The passengers baggage shall be landed on shore in Carolina free of expense charge. The list goes on. None of the conditions were met.

They were supposed to have 2 gallons of water a day. This was reduced to one pint. It futher stated that Mr. Purcell put more passengers on board than the ship could contain. The ship was leakey and the passengers were obliged through the while voyage to pump both day and night. They then had to lash the boat with rope to keep her together so she would not sink.

The South Carolina Gazette newspaper of Charles Town dated October 23, 1752 gives some interesting information about the Caldonia. It appears that the Caldonia was one of the first ships in port after the city of Charles Town had been wrecked by a hurricane. Imagine how it would be to be on a 85 foot ship with approximately 230 other people. "the vessel is just arrived from Rotterdam with German Servants in good health." October 30,1752



Where Have Gaspar's Children Gone?

When Gaspar came to South Carolina he came to the Newberry Dist. Before he died he had 4 sons by his first wife and two by his second wife. The first wife's children were, Gaspar Phillip Jr., Harmon (his real name was John Harmond), Saybard (his real name was John Saybard), and Martin I can't find any proof but his was probably John Martin. Gaspar ,Jr. after his fathers death moved to Severeville , Tenn. The family still writes his last name Byerley and Barley. Most of the family live in Bount County , Tenn.

John Harmond left the Newberry area shortly after his fathers death. They moved to Kentucky. The family then moved into Ohio, Indiana, and to the mid west Such as Kansas. They spell the name Barley and Byarley.

John Saybard only had two daughters both of these married Dunkin brothers. He moved with his fanily to Alabama. The Dunkin's are still in Ala. Across the state line of Georgia near Columbus, Ga. There are no Byerley's there.

Martin Byerley left Fairfield Dist. early in 1830.s. Some stayed in Amite County, Miss. But most moved with Martin to Jasper County, Tx. They are still spelling the name Byerley. This is just across the La. State line on the Eastern side of Texas.

Now to the second wife's children. Two boys and four daughters. The two sons were John and John Fredrich, he went by Fredrick.

John Berley or Byerley married a local girl and stayed around Pomaria, S.C. and still own some of the old land that was Gaspar's They now spell their last name Berley.

Fredrich got in financial trouble and sold his land and moved to Columbia County, Arkansas. While in Newberry County he married Namcy Yarbarough. Who was a neighbor of Peter Byerley. They lived in Arkansas very near the Louisana line and changed their name to Burley. The family still lives in the same; but are now in the western states.

Elizabeth married a Watts and the family is still in the Newberry County area.

The reason for putting this in the information is The Newberry County History had that only one child or kin was in the state of South Carolina. This was to clear up some problems with the history of the Burley's or Berley's or Byarley's or Byerley's

Byerley Ferry In 1752, John Philip Beyrle arrived with him was Hans Conrad friends. In the 1760's



What Became of It? in South Carolina, on board ship Scharrer, they became very good

He bought land from his friend Conrad. There was a family on Broad River about 3 miles away who operated a ferry across Broad River, known as John Martin Shaurer. He obtained rights to operate the ferry at the beginning of 1770. He died shortly after 1770 and his wife Elizabeth asked Gaspar Byerley to operate the ferry for her. As she was being pressured by a Mr. Dawkins was trying to get it from her, it was her only way of supporting herself after her husband died. Gaspar took over operation of the ferry and about that time the Revolutionary War broke out. He continued to operate the ferry during the war. He was not charging the Patroits for using it. In the 1780s, after the capture of Charles Town, SC, it appeared that the war was lost. And then a skirmish was fought at Bierly's in which the Patriots defeated the Tories. There was also a fight a Gibson's Meeting House. Both of the skirmishes were in Fairfield District. This caught the attention of the British Colonel Cornwallis who was the conquer of the state of South Carolina. At first he tried to go on North to try to defeat General Washington. But the Patriots were raising so much cane that Cornwallis had to make his headquarters in Winnsborough to protect his post at Ninety-Six so he established a post at Bierly's Ferry to protect one part of the state. He called it Bryerleys or Dryerleys while the patriots called it Bierly's. It was well known during the Revolution but lost its name after the war. Gaspar became between a rock and a hard place he was a member of the patriots militia; all his friends were Michael Charles, John Charles and (believed) a brother Adam Byerley. Colonel Cornwallis stationed Major McArthur at the post and then followed him with Major Tarlteton(the most hated man in the British army. After the war Gaspar tried to get retribution from the British he lived in Charles Town for several months after the surrender of the British at Yorktown. As far as known he never did get any refund for the ferry. The British had him as a refugee. He gave up running it shortly after this time. It was turned back over to Mrs. Shirer. She eventually sold the right as well as the land in both counties Fairfield and Newberry to a Mr. Strother and it eventually became Ruff's Ferry and Hughley's Ferry.

BYERLEY'S IN THE REVOLUTION---ADAM BYERLEY-(Bayerly) Adam Byerly is believed to be a brother to John Phillip Caspar Byerly. Even though he lived in Fairfield County and Caspar lived in Newberry County they were very close Adam was used as a witness on several documents by Caspar(Gaspar). He lived on Rock Creek in the Northwestern part of Fairfield County. He served with several militias during the war. Most of the time was during the 1781-1782. He served under Captain Hughes for 70 days this was in Colonel Richard Winn's regiment. He served for 30 days under Captain Godfry Dreyer; he was at Dryer's Station on 12 Mile Creek in Lexington County. He was at Orangeburg under Captain Hughes. He lived approximately one mile from Mobley's Meetinghouse.

Gaspar Byerly-No records are available to distinguish as to which one of the Gaspar's this was but I can make a calculated guess it was Gaspar, Jr. after he moved to Tennessee he was considered to be a Revolutionary War Soldier. In Blount County, Tenn His name is on the Revolutionary War Memorial. The only evidence that shows his name on it are pay vouchers of Captain Houseal in which it shows he was in Captain Waters Regiment.

ALLIED LINES- MICHAEL CHARLES-His daughter (Rachael) married Peter Byerly and his other daughter (Elizabeth) married John Byerly, son of Adam. Michael Charles served 127 days as a footman under Captain Houseal in Colonel Waters regiment.

The Burley's in The Revolutionary War

The History Channel stated that a family in the United States could hardly find one ancestor who fought in the Revolutionary War. It is difficult today who can show anyone related who participated in the war. I hate to tell the History Channel but; we have Three. Two of those are directly related. We are direct descendants of them. They are 1. Gaspar Byerly, Jr.., Gaspar Byerly, Sr., and Michael Charles. 1- Gaspar, Jr. was in Capt. Philmon Waters militia unit he fought for Gen. Thomas Sumter. He didn't join up early during the war. Most of the German settlers did not join up mostly because of religious reasons as stated in the Bible.. That one should not fight against the law of the land and its rulers. The time came when the British took every thing they had to eat. They took horses that was used for planting, took guns used for protection. They took their homes for the troops to stay. In 1780, they had enough so they joined any kind of militia or a bunch of men banding together for protection. . This was what he had to do. Also he had an uncle in Fairfield Dist. who was in the militia Adam Byerly? Adam had all ready done some things against the British. He was among the ones who ran off a Baptist minister who was preaching at Rock Creek Baptist Church, Rev. Phillip Mulkey was preaching there and was giving pro British sermons at the church. A number of members came together and told him he had to leave this church the community and the dist. Rev Mulkey escaped the church and the area and went to the Fairforest community to start a Baptist church. This is in Spartanburg County today. Adam was at the Battle of Mobley's Meeting House he was with Gen. Richard Winn's militia. He also lived a short distance from Mobley's settlement. I can only prove that he is and in-law of Peter's. Adam's son John Burley married Peter's wifes sister Elizabeth. 3-Speaking of Michael Charles! He served in Thomas Sumter's command under Capt. Philmon Waters and also under Capt. Houseal it was a total of 127 days that he served. He was probably in the skirmish that British Major Tarleton had with some of Sumter's Calvary.

The skirmish occurred November 13, 1779, when General Sumter sent 150 mounted men to spy on Byerly's Ferry to see what the British post was doing. He sent along with these men people who were familiar with the ferry and surrounding area so this could mean that if he had Gaspar Jr, or some one familiar with the area such as Adam Byerly or Michael Charles. As Major Tarelton arrived at the ferry some of Sumter's men took shots at. It appears that having just arrived they went to the waters edge to give water to the horses and wipe the dirt off. Sumter's men were watching from a high bank on the other side. They shot a horse and one man of the 62rd. Tarelton was concealing the Green that they usually wore with red coats. Sumter's men shot and moved away quickly.

Gaspar Byerly, Sr.--He is Andrew Franklin Burley's 2rd Great Grandfather, William John's 2rd Great Grandfather Was he a Tory? The British records show it but his neighbors did not believe the British. The British had him as a refugee for 127 days in Sept. 1782. Records of British show him in Charlestown,,SC shows Rank #2-Refugee----Name Casper Byerly, Broad River. He was not a Refugee he was wanting his money for the British taking over his Ferry. If any thing is known about Gaspar it was Money. He was probably a patriot his son was his friends were. So I vote him a Patriot 1st class.

Michael Charles-He is the Great Grandfather of Andrew Franklin Burley, and William John Burley's Great Grandfather. As well as John Burley's Father-in -law (John Burley is Adam Byerly's only son,) Michael Charles was in Capt. Houseal's militia. Attached to Thomas Sumter's army. He was also a footman of Capt. Philmon Waters militia. He had a son who fought in the Cherokee War; Fredrick Charles was attached to Capt. Heart's inf. this was in 1760. Michael Charles was a footman for 127 days thats what he was paid for.





Slavery, The War Between the States and the BURLEY'S

The Burley's never owned any slaves so why fight the war. It appears there was another motive for fighting the war. All Southerners hated the North or New England states. They hated them because of the protective tariffs. It was taking away from our state and giving it to the New England States. We were afraid that with election of Lincoln would cause more tariffs to be put on the South "IT WASN'T OVER SLAVERY" Even Lincoln said it was to preserve the Union. It appeared that he didn't care one way or the other. So we fought a war.

didn't have any money or chattels that he could be sued for. The only thing he had was a little piece of land to raise food on. I do not think that Harrison Burley served In The War Between The States. It is a family tradition that Harrison was made a recruiter and they made him a postal worker at Austin Depot.

He was 40 years old at the beginning of the war; but the war effected his family. He lost a brother Hart at Petersburg, Va. His other brother moved to Newberry County after he had served. He had two sons that went off during the war Andrew Franklin and Charles Butler Burley. The war was very hard on him and his grand children said that it caused him to have bad health he died in his 50's. Andrew Franklin Burley was too young to join the Confederate Army at the beginning of the war, but as the war went on he finally sneaked off and joined the army at the age of 16. Charles Burley joined up as soon as the war started. He went through most of the major battles of the war unscratched. He was made to pay back some ammunition he had lost because he was wounded in the right thigh. This was at Jerico ford. During the war he meet one of his cousins and after the war he went to Louisanna with William Atkins Cross

The following Burley's fought in the war:

- 1-A Burley, possibly Harrison Burley, tradition has it that he joined up was too old to fight so they made him a recruiter. 17th South Carolina Inf. Co. B, private
- 2- A B Burley, this is Andrew W. Burley, Harrison's brother. He had moved to Newberry County and joined up from there. 19th Regiment SC Inf. Co I., private
- 3- A. F. Burley-this was Harrison's son who went in at the age of 16. 3rd Battalion SC Inf. Reserves Co. B private.
- 4- Andrew Burley same as above but it shows he was in the Calvary partisan rangers, Harrison's brother. private.
- 5-B. F. Burley- this is probably Fredrick Byerley ancestors. They had moved to Louisiana approximately in 1830's they lived on the border of Arkansas and Louisiana. 28 the Louisiana Co. B. 2rd Lt.
- 6- Charles B. Burley-12th SC Inf. Co. F.private to corporal. Harrison's son.
- 7- George Burley- 1st SC Art. Co. I was from Ireland was not related to the Burley's of Fairfield County. 8- H. H. Burley- is Hartwell Burley, Harrison's brother was killed at the battle of Petersburg, Va. 6th SC
- 9- J. A. Burley- was from Fairfield County but no proof to kinship they were in -laws.17th SC Inf. he was about the same age as Harrison the family moved to Oconee County, SC after the war.

WAR COMES TO MONTICELLO

It was a cold winter day in 1865, it had rained before the day very hard it flooded the fields and then turned cold with a vengence. The wind started blowing very hard and the temperature dropped to stay out in it made your bones acke. Word had come from Columbia that Sherman was in town. The next day you could look to the southern skies and see a red glow showing what was happening to them. The people thought that Sherman would by-pass Monticello and go straight to Winnsboro. They didn't. Mr. Summer' servant came by way of Powell's shoals to try to get to the neighbors of his to warn them to put up any thing of value to hide any food because they were coming. They started hiding the cows and mules. Harrison had just sent Billy to a bottom with a cow and a calf and one pig. They got them hidden when Kilpatrick's Calvary came and started taking the other cows and pigs away what they couldn't take they killed. All the chickens were killed all the food they had kept for winter was thrown out and smashed. They found the sweet potatoes in a box under the house and mashed them. They threw Harrison's family out of his house and they could stay in the barn until they burned it. so they were out in the cold they were going to Elizabeth's house but it had been burned down. No place to stay they cuddled up in some bushes for the night. The Monticello Girls Academy was having a party. with Gen. Kilpatrick they hoped that this would save the school. General Kilpatrick thought he was a ladies man; but he wasn't so the school burned the next day. All the students were out of shelter.

Why were some homes spared while others were not? Harrison's home was spared once the troops left he and his family had a place to sleep they took in a lot of people who were shelter less. They only had enough food for the family. That one pig that they hid came in good. About a day or two after the troops left the worst was to come. Stragglers came looking for something of value. Mr. Summers over in Newberry County had been hung up and beaten. He lived a short time after the war. They tried to get money from him; he didn't have any but they tried anyway. Harrison stayed for a day or so and then tried to get some help from some friends in Pomaria. They took a boat across the Broad river; but couldn't make it the river was so high and swollen he was able to find a negro who knew the river to get them across. No one remembers his name. They stayed about a week until the water went down.


Miss Janie Hutchinson related a story about a Mean's servant who had some gold teeth. Mr. Means took care of his servants and had them at the dentist on a number of occasions. His servant was bragging That" He was free! he was free!". Until the Stragglers came and about a week later the servant had no teeth in his head. He never said any thing about in and spoke very little after his unsanctioned dental appointment.

Some of the able bodied people did catch three stragglers and killed them. I don't think any of people was a Burley. This was at Feasterville. They caught a few more at Lebanon and killed about three they were buried and they only found when Highway 34 was being changed a bulldozer dug up about three bodies. This is still known as Yankee graveyard hill.

. It should be mentioned that Gaspar Beyrle did own 4 or 5 slaves. The children did not believe that they should own someone so at Gaspar's death in 1804, They fought over who should own them. Some were inherited by Gaspar, Jr.but he refused them so Martin was made to take charge of taking care of them. Martin educated them and gave them their freedom. The census of 1830 shows that he owned six. In the next census it showed 6 free people of color, It appears that he had given them freedom by the time he entered Texas. Gaspar Jr. was against owning slaves. He had a son who became a radical republican and anti-war during the War Between States the family lived in Tenn.



Harrison A. Burley is the son of Peter Byerly. He was born in Fairfield Dist. Lived part of life near Rocky Creek area then moved to the Monticello area and lived on Wilkerson Creek now known as Frees Creek.

Family tradition has said that he served in the War Between the States as a recruiter and also carried the mail. No Harrison A. Burley is found in Confederate records. We do find a H. Burley listed in Co. B, 17th South Carolina Infantry. Also there is a A. Burley listed in the same unit. Only one card on each could be found. This is possibly the same individual as they are listed together in the same file. We also find in "History of Fairfield County, South Carolina" by Fitz Hugh McMaster on page 134 which pretains to the 17th S.C. Inf. "another man Adam Burley was 40 years old,".

Harrison was born in 1820 so the age does corresponds if his middle name was Adam.

At the end of the war Harrison had lost all of the livestock and crops to Sherman's army. They did hide the silverware in the well which they were able to use to buy food for a while. The older members of the family moved to Louisana while the younger members stayed in South Carolina.

The only item that I know that was from Harrison Burley is a old spinning wheel that my mother had. She said it was from his fathers but she did not know his name.

Harrison A. Burley is the one who changed the spelling of his name. Old deeds and estate records show his name as Harrison A. Byerly. In one document it shows "I am Harrison A. Byerly son of Peter Byerly." He signed the document Harrison A. Burly.

The Regiment went through most of the major battles as well as the bloodist (Gains Mills, Sharpsburg, Gettysburg, 2rd Manassas, 7 Days Fight, the Wilderness and Fredericksburg)

From Nov. & Dec. 1862, took part in several marches. Left Camp Lee, Va. near Winchester, Va. marched 12 consecutive days and 180 miles to take part in the Battle of Fredericksburg.

In July & Aug. 1863, engaged in several enemy contacts. Company records show. Engaged enemy at Gettysburg, Pa. July 1, 1863, came under heavy fire. On July 2 & 3, also under heavy fire. On July 4, 1863, fell back.

Took part in several other skirmishes until the end of 1863. Engaged in Battle of the Wilderness on May 5 & 6, 1864. On May 12, 1864, fought at Spottsylvania Court House.

He was wounded in the Right thigh at Jerico Ford, Va. (Chickahominy) on May 23, 1864. He was placed in Jackson Hospital, Richmond, Va. from May 25, 1864 until Nov. 23, 1864.

He served from Nov.23,1864 until April 9, 1865 when he surrendered at Appomattox Court House, Va. During the War Between the States he met his cousin from Louisana. William Adkins Cross and Charles Burley returned to Louisana. He fell in love with Harriette Cross. She was the sister of William A. Cross. They were married in 1867.

From the Sentinel news paper in Louisana

So, after making a long journey from South Carolina to Louisana, he settled on the eastern bank of the Black River, cut down the cane that grew along the banks, and began to farm.

By 1879 he had become a part of the political life of the parish. The police Jury minutes of December 23, 1879 list him as a newlt-elected member. He is again listed as a member in the minutes of 1888 and 1892.

In 1884 he was named to a commission to spend \$300.00 for a display from Concordia Parish for the World's Exposition at New Orleans.

Trice Married

He married three times. His first wife was Harriett Cross. They had two sons, Cyrus B. Burley and Walter Burley.

His second wife was a Mrs Wilson, a widow with two children of her own. From this union came Dr.

Charles Henry Burley and J. C. Burley.

His third wife was Helen Ann Scott, a relative of the man who fought in the Mexican War and gave Monterey its name.

Six children were born from this marriage--Willie (W. D.) Burley of New Orleans; Marion (F. M.) At the age of 16, he joined the Confederate Army. He served in Company B, 3rd Batt. South Carolina Reserves. He was a private.

The 3rd Batt. S.C. Res. was made up of a number of companies made up of men of the "Dutch Fork" area. The area included Pomaria, Little Mountain, Peak, and Springhill, part of Newberry County. This is a area on Broad River on the western side where German or Broken English was still spoken. Captain Augustus Dickert of the 3rd Batt. tells that Lee's Army of Northern Virginia called his men "the Dutch". This was because of the way most of them talked. At the battle of Chancellorsville, Va. when Capt. Dickert brought up his troops; a cry broke out "Hurrah for the Dutch".

The 3rd was merged with the 15th South Carolina Inf. also part of Blanchards Reserves to form the new 7th South Carolina Infantry. He became connected with Co. E. He was serving under General Joseph E. Johnson at the close of the War Between The States.

In the latter part of the War Between the States, Fairfield County suffered more than other parts the state. This is the only county in which every unit of Sherman's army went through at the same time.

Sherman's troops took all of the livestock. Either destroyed or took all of the crops. Took all of the food in the house. Harrison Burley put all the silverware in the well so that they would have something to sell for food.

After the war Andrew Franklin Burley joined his brother in Louisana. He spent most of the rest of his life in this area. [BURLEY.FTW]

Harrison A. Burley was the first direct descendent to spell his name Burly. On a legal document concerning his father's land. He started the document with a statement; "I am Harrison A. Byerly son of Peter Byerly-----" signed Harrison A. Burly

The English messed up the name from the beginning. The original ancestor when he came over on the Caldonia in 1752; the ship had it as Caspar Phillip Beyrle. The English changed it to Byerley but the German way of spelling it was Bauerle which is pronounced (Bauer-Bur) (le-ly) or Bur-ly. The Bauer means farmer, the le means younger or small. Therefore small farmer.

Beyrle means Bavarian. The le means" little Bavarian" or son of a Bavarian.

So Harrison and his cousin John Burley changed it to Burley and the people or cousin in Newberry County changed it to "Berley". John Burley changed it to Burley shortly after the War of 1812. Harrison spelled it in the document in 1836. Eventually it was changed in the census records to Burley. In the 1790 they had it Barley, 1800-Bierly, 1810-Byerley, 1820-Boirley. From 1850 to present it has been Burley.

Gaspar Beyrle is the ancestor that we have traced back to. There were 2 other Beyrle's in South Carolina in the 1700's. One in Charles Town, S. C. Fredrick Beyrle. There was one in Fairfield Dist. who went by the name of Adam Byerley. I can find no direct connection with our family. He is an in-law by marriage his only son John Burley married Elizabeth Charles, daughter of Michael Charles. Harrison's father Peter had married Rachael Charles who is the oldest sister of Elizabeth. He was close to Gaspar and his family. Adam Byerley witnessed a number of land transactions concerning Gaspar, Gaspar, Jr., Martin, and several future relatives Michael Charles and theOeyster's (Easter's).


There were 3 Burley's (Beyrle's) in the state of South Carolina in the 1700's. There was Fredrich Beyerle located in Charles Town, SC. There was Adam Bayerly living in Fairfield Dist., SC. There was John Philip" Caspar" Beyrle who came over in 1752. He landed in Charles Town in 1752. He spent some time in the city of Charles Town. The Newberry County history says that it was about 5 years before the Revolution; but by land transactions he was buying property on Crims Creek in 1760, he bought it from a passenger on his boat that he came over with. The Shior(Scherer) family was always close to his family. It is possible that they were neighbors in Germany. I can't prove this. All on his ship the Caledonia were from the area known as Swabia off of the Neckar River. Most of the people were from the town of Underhausen, which is about 25 miles South West of Stukkart.


Peter Byerly is the futherest back that we can prove. He turns up in the 1810 census living next to George Dawkins. At first I was sure he was one of Adam Bayerly's sons; but I proved this wrong when I found a deed after Adams death. The deed is to Elizabeth Byerly from John Burley it shows that he is the only and oldest son of Adam Byerly. John was giving the land that he inherited from his father to his mother. John was giving it to his mother because under the law the oldest son got the land instead of the wife. So that elimited one of the Beyrle's from the list. Fredrich was the next to be elimated. He died in 1790's and he had no children.

Gaspar is the likely choice but had named all of his children from the first wife and the second wife. In the census records it shows that Peter was born in Newberry Dist. His wife Rachael was born in Newberry Dist. So were any of Gaspars children old enough to have a son born between 1782 and 1795. Gaspar, Jr. and Martin were old enough to have fathered Peter. I checked the Blount County Probate court, Tennessee; and they do not show a Peter Byerly as an heir. I checked all the census records for South Carolina and have counted the children of Gaspar, Jr. and the children all check out. Martin Byerly who went to Texas prior to the Mexican War. I have spoken to a direct ancestor of Martin Byerly and they can only account for six children but they are sure that Martin left some in South Carolina. I know that he left Adam Byerly in Fairfield County. Adam moved approximately in 1840 to Texas in the same area that Martin moved. In the 1830 census, Martin is shown with 9 children and Peter was all ready married. The piece of property that Peter lost in a suit against a Dawkins was originally owned by Martin Byerly. So it appears that Martin was the father of Peter Byerly. So it is my guessthat Peters Father is Martin son of the Gaspar, Sr.

Where Did we Come From?

It would appear that we came from Germany to be more specific Southwest Germany. Gaspar came over with people from the boat that was almost fully from Underhausen but; I looked at the Lutheran Church records from Underhausen and I could not find a Beyrle or a Baeurle in their church. So I started over and found a number of Bauerle's in Fellbach and also Esslingen. In the Evangalish church there is 107 references to Baeirle from 1678 to 1768. Caspar was a very popular name in this church; but his name when





he came over was John Philip"Caspar" Beyrle. I found in Fellbach a Johnnn Philip Baerle who was born in March 5 1744 which would make him 8 in 1752. This was when the ship Caldonia arrived in Charles Town, S.C. Another was found Johann Caspar Baeurle was born in May 12, 1711. This would make him 41 at the time of arrival. Another Johann Caspar Baeurlin was born in 1724. Caspar's ran from 1668 to 1707 these would be to old to have died in 1804 which is when Gaspar or Caspar Byerly died. In the town of Esslingen there were 37 between 1678 and 1768. These names were spelled Baeurlin also in the town of Esslingen we had 87 spelled Bauerle.

In Fellbach I did find a Christing in 1744 of a Johann Caspar Baerle with his father shown as Philip Baerle and his mother shown as Barbara. It did not show her maiden name. This is close as I could find for his son John Phillip "Caspar" Byerly. This is the only match for a date that is known Gaspar, Jr. always stated he was born in Germany and the approximately in 1744 or 54. This was stated in Tennessee when he was very old.

How about spelling of the name Burley? It changed to Burley from Byerely. It was spelled Byerly from 1777 to 1837. When Harrison A. Burley changed the name from Byerly to Burly. This is documented by a Probate record from Fairfield County. The Burley's had trouble with the English as to how it was spelled. The census records had shown in 1810, it was spelled Bierly. The 1800 census had it as Barley and 1790 census had as Borley. The 1830 had it spelled Boirly. The reason for the problems with the name was the hard headed English and the hard headedest of Gaspar Bauerle. He could read and write German but the English would put it the way it sounded to them. For this reason Gaspar would not sign his name to any documents that required a signature he would only put his mark "B"

. Althrough the name was spelled at time of his arrival in 1752, it wass spelled Beyrle on the royal grant. This was incorrect This name means Little man from Bavaria. An it is pronounced Byerly. He knew this was incorrect. Baeurle is pronounced Bur-ly. It means Little Farmer. Therein lies the truth the way it was spelled in German. And the pronouncing of the name as Burley.
