Where They Lived Before Coming To America

John Philip Caspar Beyrle arrived in Charles Town, South Carolina on the ship Caldonia, October 1752. There were approximately 230 to 240 passengers on this ship. Most of these passengers were from the same general area which was Southwestern Germany. The early newspapers seem to want to classify all Germans who entered the states at that time as Palantinates which was a area along the Rhine River. However, I do not believe this to be the case. I believe them to be from the present day area of Wuttemberg, Germany. To be more specific, the area approximately 20 to 25 miles south of present day Stuggart. The area was known in past times as Swabia (Schwaben). The reason for believing this is. Quite a number on board this ship that we have been able to trace were all from a certain area. Everard Volmer and his wife and four children were all from a small town called Underhausen. John Schule with his wife and 6 children were from Underhausen. John Herman with his wife were from Underhausen. John Wideman with his wife and 2 children were from Underhausen. I have found others from towns near by such as Metzinger, Bempflingen, Holzelfinger and Pfullinger. These last towns are just off the Neckar River. Several Beyrle's, Beierle's, Baierle's and Baeurlin's have been found with either Caspar, Casper or Gaspar as part of their name living in towns either on or just off the Neckar River.

When John Philip Caspar Beyrle applied for his grant he did not say where he was from. He only stated that he was a protestant.

SWABIA / SCHWABER / SUEVIA

Swabia- pronounced "Sway'-Bee-Uh"

Its Capital was at Augsburg, a medieval duchy in the lands now forming Southwestern Germany. The area today covers parts of Baden-Wurttemberg (Black Forest) and parts of Western Bavaria to the Iller River as well as parts of Northern Switzerland.

It was a important area because it was between two of Europe's most important rivers. The Danube and the Rhine. This was where for over two hundred years there was constant war raged. The area was almost completely destroyed.

It was named for a tribe of German migrants called Suervi. This was a name given to several tribes (Marcomanni, Lombards and Alamanni) by the Romans.

Today the term Swabia refers to the area formally encompassed by the medieval duchy. The modern center of the area is now considered to be around Stuttgart. In this area can still be heard the Swabian dialect.

Language Lessons

Old German (Swabian) - John, Philip, Peter, Andrew, Mathew, James and any other disciple were usually used as a first name. This was mainly done for religious reasons. John, Johannes or Hans in front of another name means St. John. It was also used when naming women by using a female out of the Bible. This usually meant Mary or Maria or Anna used with another name. The Old German practice of including saints in the names of their children. Example- Anna Maria.

John Philip Caspar Beyrle has the name of two saints as well as Caspar or Gaspar which by tradition of the early church was one of the three wise men.

A list of Gaspar's children will show that he continued the old tradition.

- 1. Gaspar Philip named for two religious figures.
- 2. John Saybard the first John, he went by Saybard.
- 3. John Harmon the second John, he went by Harmon.
- 4. Martin -named for Martin Luther, this was only used in Protestant homes. Very popular with German Lutherans.
- 5. John first child by his second wife. He always went by John.
- 6. Elizabeth named after a saint.
- 7. Margaretta named after a saint.
- 8. Mary Magelena- named after a saint.
- 9. Frederick named after Frederick the Great. I don't know why he changed .

THE ORGIN OF THE BURLEY NAME AS IT USED TODAY

So you thought that you were from royalty. The way the Burley name is used today, Who knows? There is Burley tobacco, Burley bicycles, Sir Cecil Burley, king of England protector, and Sir Walter Burley, philosopher.

Burley. --- Our name is a name we invented in 1837. The English messed up our name by taking a perfectally good German name like Bauerle and changing it to Byerly. Our ancestors were not dumb. In Southwestern Germany, Bauer is pronounced "Bur" which we tried to point out on the census of 1820. The census takers had it as Boirley in Fairfield County. The census takers spelled it Bierly in Newberry County. It wasn't until 1837 that a land transaction with Harrison Byerley. It started off with Byerley; but Harrison spelled it Burly when he had to sign it. Only 3 in the late 1700's of the Burley's could write their name. Adam who was in Fairfield County in 1770. He fought for the Patroits during the Revolutionary War. He signed his pay youchers Bayerly. Martin Byerley learned to sign his name so he could sign land transactions. He couldn't read them but he could sign. Gasper Byerley, Jr. could read and write English. None of the early Byerley's were uneducated they had attended the German school until 1800; and they refused to speak English until the General Assembly made a law that they had to teach English in school and preach it from the pulpit. The original Caspar Beyrle could read and write German; and he refused to do any writing of his name. He couldn't tell what he was signing. At the time of his death he had several German sermon books as well as German Bibles.

Shortly after the War of 1812, John Burley signed his pay voucher John Burley although they had him as Byerley. This John Burley was the son of Adam Bayerley.

Adam's Burley family was very close to the present Burley's that live in Fairfield County today. Adam apparently was the brother of Gaspar senior. He witnessed all the documents and land transactions involving the children of Gaspar senior; but the closeness do not end there. Peter Byerly the father of all the Burley's in Fairfield County and all of the Burley's in Louisiana married Rachael Charles. John Burley who was in the War of 1812, also married a younger sister of Rachael Charles. He married Elizabeth Charles, and they lived next door to Peter's family until after the War Between the States. Michael Charles was the father of Rachael and Elizabeth. Michael Charles was an old Revolutionary War Soldier.

There was no food in Fairfield County; Sherman's army had destroyed it. So John's family moved to Oconee County where the Charles family had land . Elizabeth was the first to move; and the children followed her. The Burley family is still living in Seneca, S. C

The John Berley, you mentioned in Oct. 2002, is Gasper's son by Mary Oyester, his second wife. John Berley was born in 1788, and Peter was born about 1790. He was not the son of John Berley. I believe he was the son of Martin. Martin owned the same land that Peter eventually owned. There is no way to prove this. I have spoken to one of Martin's ancestors who have been doing research on Martin's line. She stated that she does not whom his children were other than he had more children than she had. Their records show six children. The census records show at least nine children while still living in Fairfield County.

Byerley's (Bierly's) Ferry What Became of it

In1752, John Phillip Beyrle arrived in South Carolina, on board ship with him was a Hans Conrad Shaurer. They became close friends. Gaspar bought land next to Conrad. He bought it from him. They were close neighbors and tradition has it that they were in laws. On Broad River there was a John Martin Shaurer who had the rights to operate a ferry across the river. It appears that John Martin died in 1770 and his wife was left with her support lost. She asked Hans Shior to help her; he intern asked Gaspar to run it for her as she had a Mr. Dawkins who filed suit to get it. Gaspar started running it about 1772. After a short time the Revolutionary War broke out. During the War it was a very important ferry. Cornwallis saw that it was important so he established a British post in order to control it. Gaspar had been letting Col. Richard Winn and his Partisan troops cross the river with the understanding that he would be reimbursed at a later date. His brother was a member of Winn's troops Adam Byerley and Gaspar, Jr. was a militiaman also as it turns out a number of future in -laws were also among the Patriots. Michael Charles had two daughters who married Peter Byerly and John Byerley. He operated the ferry at a loss until the end of the war at that time he gave the operation over to Mrs. Shior's son.

During the Revolution, Cornwallis placed a regiment to protect Ninety-Six he had a Major McArthur at post. He called it Dryerley's or Bryerley's the Patriot's called it Bierley's. In the 1780's, he sent Col. Banastre Tarleton to the catch some of General Sumter men. He tried to sneak up on Sumter's men; he crossed Broad River some three miles downstream of the ferry. Sumter had spies over the country and they warned him before Tarleton could catch any of his men they had disappeared. Tarleton was the most hated man in the British Army because of the Massacre in which the patriots tried to surrender under a flag of truce. After the Patriot's had won the state Gaspar went to Charles Town and tried to get reimbursement for ferrying the British troops they laughed at him and told him if he would come to Nova Scotia with them he could get his money. The British had him as a refugee but he wasn't he went back to Newberry District. And lived out his life. He was not a Tory. His neighbors accepted him back.

We have found pay vouchers on 2 Byerley's and a direct decendent of the Burley's in Fairfield County and Louisiana. Gaspar , Adam Byerley and Michael Charles .

Slavery, The War Between the States and the BURLEY'S

The Burley's never owned any slaves so why fight the war. It appears there was another motive for fighting the war. All Southerners hated the North or New England states. They hated them because of the protective tariffs. It was taking away from our state and giving it to the New England States. We were afraid that with election of Lincoln would cause more tariffs to be put on the South "IT WASN'T OVER SLAVERY" Even Lincoln said it was to preserve the Union. It appeared that he didn't care one way or the other. So we fought a war .

The following Burley's fought in the war:

- 1-A Burley, possibly Harrison Burley, tradition has it that he joined up was too old to fight so they made him a recruiter. 17th South Carolina Inf. Co. B, private
- 2- A B Burley, this is Andrew W. Burley, Harrison's brother. He had moved to Newberry County and joined up from there. 19th Regiment SC Inf. Co I., private
- 3- A. F. Burley-this was Harrison's son who went in at the age of 16. 3rd Battalion SC Inf. Reserves Co. B private.
- 4- Andrew Burley same as above but it shows he was in the Calvary partisan rangers, Harrison's brother. private.
- 5-B. F. Burley- this is probably Fredrick Byerley ancestors. They had moved to Louisiana approximately in 1830's they lived on the border of Arkansas and Louisiana. 28 the Louisiana Co. B. 2rd Lt.
- 6- Charles B. Burley-12th SC Inf. Co. F.private to corporal. Harrison's son .
- 7- George Burley- 1st SC Art. Co. I was from Ireland was not related to the Burley's of Fairfield County.
- 8- H. H. Burley- is Hartwell Burley , Harrison's brother was killed at the battle of Petersburg, Va. 6th SC inf. Co. H.
- 9- J. A. Burley- was from Fairfield County but no proof to kinship they were in -laws.17th SC Inf. he was about the same age as Harrison the family moved to Oconee County, SC after the war.
- 10- James Burley- I included him into the listed ones because he was from Mississippi, have found no kinship.12th Miss.
- 11-Sylvester Burley- included him because he is from Texas possibly might be some of Martin Byerley's ancestors 6th Texas Inf.
- 12-John Y. Burley- possibly was a ancestor of Fredrick Byerley they had changed names by this time13th Batt. La. Partisan rangers Co. B private.
- 13- N. A. Burley- 17th SC Inf. Co. B, G. went from private to captain. In -laws of Harrison no direct kinship proof.
- 14- Noah Burley same as N. A. Burley.
- 15- Calvin Burley- 17th SC inf. Co. B. Harrison's in- laws after the war moved to Oconee County, SC.
- 16- C. A. Burley- same as Calvin Burley.
- 17-W.W. Burley- also shown as W. J. Burley has the same relation as Noah, Calvin, and J. A. Burley. 17th SC Inf.
- 18- W. W. Burley- was from Louisiana possibly some ancestor of Fredrick Byerley.

I have included some Byerley 's in the list because we are related to them from the original ancestor John Philip Gaspar Beyrle(Byerley)

Martin Byerley had moved to Jasper, Texas before the Mexican War. Gaspar Byerley had moved to Tennessee. in the early 1800's Gasper Byerley was anti slavery even though his father Gasper had a number of slaves.

WAR COMES TO MONTICELLO

It was a cold winter day in 1865, it had rained before the day very hard it flooded the fields and then turned cold with a vengence. The wind started blowing very hard and the temperature dropped to stay out in it made your bones acke. Word had come from Columbia that Sherman was in town. The next day you could look to the southern skies and see a red glow showing what was happening to them. The people thought that Sherman would by-pass Monticello and go straight to Winnsboro. They didn't . Mr. Summer' servant came by way of Powell's shoals to try to get to the neighbors of his to warn them to put up any thing of value to hide any food because they were coming. They started hiding the cows and mules. Harrison had just sent Billy to a bottom with a cow and a calf and one pig. They got them hidden when Kilpatrick's Calvary came and started taking the other cows and pigs away what they couldn't take they killed. All the chickens were killed all the food they had kept for winter was thrown out and smashed . They found the sweet potatoes in a box under the house and mashed them. They threw Harrison's family out of his house and they could stay in the barn until they burned it. so they were out in the cold they were going to Elizabeth's house but it had been burned down. No place to stay they cuttled up in some bushes for the night. The Monticello Girls Academy was having a party. with Gen. Kilpatrick they hoped that this would save the school. General Kilpatrick thought he was a ladies man; but he wasn't so the school burned the next day. All the students were out of shelter.

Why were some homes spared while others were not? Harrison's home was spared once the troops left he and his family had a place to sleep they took in a lot of people who were shelter less. They only had enough food for the family. That one pig that they hid came in good. About a day or two after the troops left the worst was to come. Stragglers came looking for something of value. Mr. Summers over in Newberry County had been hung up and beaten. He lived a short time after the war. They tried to get money from him; he didn't have any but they tried anyway. Harrison stayed for a day or so and then tried to get some help from some friends in Pomaria. They took a boat across the Broad river; but couldn't make it the river was so high and swollen he was able to find a negro who knew the river to get them across. No one remembers his name. They stayed about a week until the water went down.

Miss Janie Hutchinson related a story about a Mean's servant who had some gold teeth. Mr. Means took care of his servants and had them at the dentist on a number of occasions. His servant was bragging That" He was free! he was free!". Until the Stragglers came and about a week later the servant had no teeth in his head. He never said any thing about in and spoke very little after his unsanctioned dental appointment.

Some of the able bodied people did catch three stragglers and killed them. I don't think any of people

was a Burley. This was at Feasterville. They caught a few more at Lebanon and killed about three they were buried and they only found when Highway 34 was being changed a bulldozer dug up about three bodies. This is still known as Yankee graveyard hill.

The South Carolina Gazette newspaper of Charles Town dated October 23, 1752 gives some interesting information about the Caldonia. It appears that the Caldonia was one of the first ships in port after the city of Charles Town had been wrecked by a hurricane. Imagine how it would be to be on a 85 foot ship with approximately 230 other people. "the vessel is just arrived from Rotterdam with German Servants in good health." October 30,1752

Very few of the applications for Royal Grants lists wives names.

If one looks at Newberry County names these names will appear very familiar.

The Trip Across The Atlantic

A rule of thumb for adult passenger was one ton of shipping space per adult passenger. On the Caldonia, there were at least 230 passengers. This did not include a crew of between 15 to 25. She was a overcrowded ship.

The average trip to America in 1752 took 10 to 13 weeks. However, to Charles Town you could add another two weeks.

The ship left Rotterdam, Netherlands but did not sail straight to Charles Town. It first stopped at Portsmouth, England a seacoast town in Southern England. After several days in this port they started the trip to Charles Town.

The cost of the trip from Rotterdam to Charles Town ran 60 to 80 Rheinische Gulde. Examples of income of the period are as follows. A maid made between 12 to 15 per year. A servant in the Palace of Prince-Bishop in Wurzburg made 20. A coachman made 24. A Night watchman in Winterhausen made 12.

This is the main reason most of the German passengers would exchange passage for 7 years of his labor. This was usually done at the time of arrival in Charles Town. It was a set up to the highest bidder. This was called the Redemptioner System. (See attached photo copy of newspaper from the date shortly after arrival. Advertisement for German Servants)

It does not appear that John Philip Caspar Beyrle had to work as a servant as some how he had prepaid his trip. We do not know whether he had any one with him; but at the time of his arrival he was alone.

The conditions on board ship were miserable. Henry Melchior Muhlenberg who came to South Carolina early described the trip as follows.

"There was always a severe lack of good drinking water and some of the passengers survived by drinking vinegar and olive oil. Rats were known to chew the corks off the vinegar bottles and lower their tails into the bottle and then lick their tails. At night the rats would lick the sweat off the face of the passengers."

The trip was miserable, stench, vomiting, sea sickness, dysentery, heat, constipation, boils, scurvy and very bad food that was not fit to eat. Lice ran rampart. It was stated that children rarely survived the voyage.

Gottlieb Mittelberger stated that on his voyage that..."I witnessed such misery in no less than 32 children on our ship died. These were thrown into the sea.

One of the sister ships to the Caldonia, the Elizabeth which also arrived with Germans from Swabia petitioned the Council Chamber for redress. This was filed on the third day of March, 1753.

They were signed on by Nicholas Purcell at Rotterdam. He was to provide the following: 1. Suitable cabins made ready for lodging. A cabin 6 feet long and 6 feet broad for every 4 grown persons whole freight. 2. That he promised to provide wholesome and fresh provisions consisting of meat, bread, flour, barley, peas, beans, cheese, butter, vinegar, molasses, beer and water. 3. A fire shall be allowed to burn from 6 o'clock in the morning to 6 o'clock in the evening. 4. The passengers baggage shall be landed on shore in Carolina free of expense charge. The list goes on. None of the conditions were met.

They were supposed to have 2 gallons of water a day. This was reduced to one pint. It futher stated that Mr. Purcell put more passengers on board than the ship could contain. The ship was leakey and the passengers were obliged through the while voyage to pump both day and night. They then had to lash the boat with rope to keep her together so she would not sink.

1. JOHN PHILLIP GASPAR¹ BEYRLE was born Abt. 1717 in Germany belivied at or near Felbach, Germany, and died Abt. 1804 in Pomaria, S.C.. He married (1) BARBARA?. He married (2) CATHERINE? Abt. 1753 in probably Charles Town, S. C.. She was born Abt. 1732 in believed in Germany, and died Abt. 1770 in Newberry County, S.C.. He married (3) MARY (EASTER) OYSTER Abt. 1777. She was born Abt. 1731 in Germany, and died Abt. 1810 in believed in Newberry County, S.C..

Notes for John Phillip Gaspar Beyrle:

On 11-7-1752, Gaspar Beyrle applied for a land grant from the King of England and he was granted 50 acres on the Reedy River. Shortly before this he had arrived in Charles Town, South Carolina on the ship Calendonia, captained by Alexander Harvey. He appears to have come from the area of Germany known as Baden-Wurttenburg. I personally believe he was from the town of Underhausen. This town is located approximately 30 miles south of Stuggart. I found a number of people that arrived on the same boat were from this town and several had stated that they tried to come as a group. He was a protestant. He left Germany because the catholics were in power and were persecuting the protestants. He is believed to be a Lutheran as he later had aGrandson who became a Lutheran minister.

He was born in 1727. Nothing is known of his parents. When he arrived in 1752 he was single and it appears he had to stay in Charles Town for 1 or 2 yrs. He was probably working offsome debts. A;so in Charles Town there was a Beyerle living in there. He was named Fredrich Beyerle who died in the late 1790's. We do know that in the late 1760's he was living in the Newberry County area between Pomaria and Peak area near Broad River. He owned land in both Fairfield and Newberry County. He gave his children land in both countys.

Before the Revolutionary War he bought land from Conrad Shirar who lived next to him. He was friend with Hans Martin Shiror who operated the ferry on Broad River. Because of a death in the Shior family the ferry had stopped operating or a while. In 1772, Elizabeth Shior was sued by a Dawkins who wanted the ferry. Gaspar started in 1772, as a friend trying to help out the family, he was operating this ferry at the time of the Rev. War. It became a very stagic river crossing and was used by Col. Richard Winn. The British realized this and send Major McArthur and Col. Tarelton to the ferry to keep it from being used by the patroits. Cornwallis papers shows many references to this ferry. He mispelled it calling it Dryerleys. The patroits called it Bierlys Ferry. We know this is the same place as he applied for compensation from the state of S.C. in 1779 and 1780 but he did not get any money for it. He is also shown in 1785 to be in Charles Town as a refugee he was trying to get compensated for the times the British used the ferry and didn't pay for the use. By this time his name was spelled as Gaspar Byerly.

He had One son who fought for the patroits at one time or the other. Gasper Byerly, Jr. had received several indents for service during the war. It appears that he also had a brother called Adam Byerly who served under Richard Winn and also Col. William Thompson. Adam Byerly actually lived in Fairfield County. He was a footman and in 1782 he served as a sgt.

Gaspar farmed most of his life. He did own several slaves but only one son(Martin) appears to have kept any after Gaspar died. His last wife was named Mary. He died March 12, 1804.

Harrison Burley had to sell 134 acres of Peter's to pay off the suit. The sheriff sold to Andrew McConnel who held it until Harrison Burley could buy it back. This land is located on Wilkersons Creek now known as Frees Creek.

Rachael Charles was the daughter of Michael Charles. He was a Rev. War soldier. He owned land in both Newberry and Lexington Counties. He lived in the same community as Gaspar Beyrle. He thought very highly of Peter Byerly and made him the administer of his estate. This was over his own sons Michael, Jr. and John.

Burley listed in Co. B, 17th South Carolina Infantry. Also there is a A. Burley listed in the same unit. Only one card on each could be found. This is possibly the same individual as they are listed together in the same file. We also find in

"History of Fairfield County, South Carolina" by Fitz Hugh McMaster on page 134 which pretains to the 17th S.C. Inf. "another man Adam Burley was 40 years old,".

Harrison was born in 1820 so the age does corresponds if his middle name was Adam.

At the end of the war Harrison had lost all of the livestock and crops to Sherman's army. They did hide the silverware in the well which they were able to use to buy food for a while. The older members of the family moved to Louisana while the younger members stayed in South Carolina.

The only item that I know that was from Harrison Burley is a old spinning wheel that my mother had. She said it was from his fathers but she did not know his name.

Harrison A. Burley is the one who changed the spelling of his name. Old deeds and estate records show his name as Harrison A. Byerly. In one document it shows "I am Harrison A. Byerly son of Peter Byerly." He signed the document Harrison A. Burly.

Charles B. Burley joined the 12th South Carolina Inf. on Sept. 5, 1861, at the Alston Depot, Fairfield Dist. The 12th was made up of men from York Dist., Fairfield Dist., Richland Dist., Lancaster Dist., and Pickens Dist. The regiment was commanded by Col. R.G.M. Donnovant. It was composed of 10 companys. Company C and Company F were made up of men from Fairfield County.

Charles Burley was assigned to Company F, captained by Hayne McMeekin who was from Monticello area.

The Regiment went through most of the major battles as well as the bloodist.(Gains Mills, Sharpsburg, Gettysburg, 2rd Manassas, 7 Days Fight, the Wilderness and Fredericksburg)

From Nov. & Dec. 1862, took part in several marches. Left Camp Lee, Va. near Winchester, Va. marched 12 consecutive days and 180 miles to take part in the Battle of Fredericksburg.

In July & Aug. 1863, engaged in several enemy contacts. Company records show . Engaged enemy at Gettysburg, Pa. July 1, 1863, came under heavy fire. On July 2 & 3, also under heavy fire. On July 4, 1863, fell back.

Took part in several other skirmishes until the end of 1863. Engaged in Battle of the Wilderness on May 5 & 6, 1864. On May 12, 1864, fought at Spottsylvania Court House.

He was wounded in the Right thigh at Jerico Ford, Va.(Chickahominy) on May 23, 1864. He was placed in Jackson Hospital, Richmond, Va. from May 25, 1864 until Nov. 23, 1864.

He served from Nov.23,1864 until April 9, 1865 when he surrendered at Appomattox Court House, Va.

During the War Between the States he met his cousin from Louisana. William Adkins Cross and Charles Burley returned to Louisana. He fell in love with Harriette Cross. She was the sister of William A. Cross. They were married in 1867.

From the Sentinel news paper in Louisana

So, after making a long journey from South Carolina to Louisana, he settled on the eastern bank of the Black River, cut down the cane that grew along the banks, and began to farm.

By 1879 he had become a part of the political life of the parish. The police Jury minutes of December 23, 1879 list him as a newlt-elected member. He is again listed as a member in the minutes of 1888 and 1892.

In 1884 he was named to a commission to spend \$300.00 for a display from Concordia Parish for the World's Exposition at New Orleans.

Trice Married

He married three times. His first wife was Harriett Cross. They had two sons, Cyrus B. Burley and Walter Burley.

His second wife was a Mrs Wilson, a widow with two children of her own. From this union came Dr. Charles Henry Burley and J. C. Burley.

His third wife was Helen Ann Scott, a relative of the man who fought in the Mexican War and gave Monterey its name.

Six children were born from this marriage—Willie (W. D.) Burley of New Orleans; Marion (F. M.) Burley of Youngsville, near Lafayette; Neva Burley (Mrs Merl Taylor), whose husband had been principal at Montrey; O. H. Burley of Sheveport; Lois Burley (Mrs Jack Campbell) of Monterey, and Ruth Burley (Mrs L. L. Shove) of Seabrook, Tex.

The 3rd Batt. S.C. Res. was made up of a number of companies made up of men of the "Dutch Fork" area. The area included Pomaria, Little Mountain, Peak, and Springhill, part of Newberry County. This is a area on Broad River on the western side where German or Broken English was still spoken. Captain Augustus Dickert of the 3rd Batt. tells that Lee's Army of Northern Virginia called his men "the Dutch". This was because of the way most of them talked. At the battle of Chancellorsville, Va. when Capt. Dickert brought up his troops; a cry broke out "Hurrah for the Dutch".

The 3rd was merged with the 15th South Carolina Inf. also part of Blanchards Reserves to form the new 7th South Carolina Infantry. He became connected with Co. E. He was serving under General Joseph E. Johnson at the close of the War Between The States.

In the latter part of the War Between the States, Fairfield County suffered more than other parts the state. This is the only county in which every unit of Sherman's army went through at the same time.

Sherman's troops took all of the livestock. Either destroyed or took all of the crops. Took all of the food in the house. Harrison Burley put all the silverware in the well so that they would have something to sell for food.

After the war Andrew Franklin Burley joined his brother in Louisana. He spent most of the rest of his life in this area.[BURLEY.FTW]



Fredericksburg and passed through the Chancellorsville battlefield. Like the other men in his Company. Private Cribb found the march disagreeable. The roads were dusty, water was scarce, and there was not much time to get it. Cribb complained that he could hardly keep up. "My knees and legs are so stiff I hope to get better in a few days if we continue to march."

Cribb would get no relief. The 15th South Carolina marched seventeen miles on June 5, and by the end the ambulances were full of sick and exhausted men. Private Jim Milling of the 3rd South Carolina Battalion was among those too ill to keep up with Kershaw's column. Acting assistant surgeon Lieutenant John C. Maxwell of the 2nd South Carolina could do nothing for Milling except to tell him to drop off alongside the road and take care of himself as best he could. Milling lay down and went to sleep; when he awoke almost

the entire army, including the wagon train, had passed. Fortunately for the private, Lieutenant William J. Dawkins, acting commissary officer, and Private John Evans, acting commissary sergeant, of the 15th South Carolina came along. These men, who were Fairfield District friends of Milling's, carried Milling's gun and baggage until they all reached camp about three miles from Raccoon Ford. The next day, the 15th South Carolina rested in camp.

By June 6, General Lee had become convinced that the small Union force that had crossed the Rappahannock near the mouth of Deep Run intended nothing serious. In the afternoon, the commander of the Army of Northern Virginia left Fredericksburg for Culpeper. That same day the 15th South Carolina left camp at seven in the morning and crossed the Rapidan River at Raccoon Ford. They arrived at Stevensburg and bivouacked for the





Historic home for sale

William Berly House offered for \$189,900

Dee and Ben Swanson are ready to sell a labor of love.

Lexington's 160-year-old William Berly House was in danger of falling into irreversible disrepair when the Swansons bought it in 1975.

Thirteen years and more than \$60,000 in renovations later, the house is a showplace.

Swanson, an executive with the State Museum in Columbia, said he and his wife wanted to sell it for \$189,900 at ply because the unkeep had be one more than they could handle.

The Berly House, situated ap-

propriately on Berly Street across from the Lexington County Museum, is a two-story clapboard structure. Its front facade is characterized by a one-story porch with four columns.

The house originally featured a central open breezeway known as a "dogtrot" which has since been enclosed.

The Swansons have maintained the home's original wide-board ceilings and walls and the original flooring in many rooms. Alterations, primarily at the rear of the house, include bathrooms and a modern kitchen and breakfast room with its own brick fireplace.

originally an icehouse stands on the home's 1.4 acres.

Directly across from the Berly House is the Fox House, a part of the county museum, which was listed on the National Register in 1970, and the Ernest Hazelius House, listed in 1973.

The Berly House has been long associated with the state's Evangelical Lutheran Synod. It is on part of the 102 acres the synod bought in 1833 to establish a seminary and classical academy.

The house was later used as the residence of the Rev. William Berly (1810-1873), principal of the Literary and Classical Institute and of the Lexington Female Academy.

The exact age of the house is unclear. But it is believed to have been in existence when the synod acquired the land in 1833.


The house contains 2,800 square feet, a downstairs master





A Crawford History or Crawford Legends


The Crawford Family is not Scotch-Irish it is Scottish in origin. The Legends about the family are as follows. (1-) Name-Crawford comes from crows-ford. It was a crossing place in a river on Sir Reginald's land, the Sheriff of Ayrin in the 12th century. It was a fording place that was favored by crows. The crows fed on insects on the rocks. Sir Reginald ancestors became known by the place known as Crows Ford or Crawford. (2) Why so many Crawford's are named William? Sir Reginald lived on the land and a female ancestor of his married Sir Malcolm Wallace the child that was from this union was William Wallace (Brave Heart); who led the fight for freedom from the English rule. Many of the Crawford's followed a tradition of naming one of their children after him using William as his first name.

- (3)-What about Mary, Queen of Scots? It is tradition that a young male Crawford was her jailer and fell in love with her and tried to help her escape she was caught and she was beheaded in 1587. The fate of the young Crawford is unknown.
- (4)--(How did the Crawford's get to Ireland? The home of the clan Crawford is in the Scottish Lowlands on the waters of the River Clyde eastward of the town of Ayr. The oldest sons of each family inherited the family lands and the younger offspring's received nothing. Therefore, they became tenant farmers, and moved to the land of opportunity Northern Ireland. The narrow channel was easily passed over. It made coming and going easy. The Irish did not mind the Scots near as much as they hated the English. In the same way the Scots had a hatred for the English. So it was a mutual toleration for each other. Some of the Crawford's were living in Ireland before The English conquered it and; established The Act of Plantation. This was a form of 15th century social experimenting. The Crawford's were established in County Antrim. They were tenant farmers but; in 1609, a mass resettlement was forced on Ireland. The king of England was Scottish and he wanted to make Ireland a protestant country. He began a mass resettlement of Northern Ireland. County Antrim was picked since it had the most Scottish in it. He picked the Ulster section of County Antrim, which included Raloo section in it. The Crawford's were living in this area. The Irish rebelled. They killed off a number of the Scottish settlers. A servant girl, who told them to "fly for your lives", saved one Crawford family. This was on Sunday morning 23, Oct. 1641, when Mrs. Crawford came home and the servant girl named Bridgett McMurdaghwho belonged to Gleno near Raloo. She was crying and holding the baby and her mistress asked her what was rhe matter. She told her to go to Raloo your home will be burned a 12 o'clock. The Crawford's made it past Raloo their home was in flames and much of the countryside. Most of the burners were caught and hanged and order was restored. The motto of the Scottish Crawford's in "God feeds the Crows". This is placed on many of the Crawford graves in Scotland and Ireland.


David Porter Crawford was the start of the connection with the Burley family. He came over to South Carolina because his brother Samuel kept asking him to come over and join him in South Carolina. David Porter Crawford came over in 1852 because they were having a famine in Ireland he brought over with him his daughter with him. His daughter was a very beautiful girl who took the heart of William John Burley. It must

have been those blue eyes. It was said that her eyes sparkled even she was and older woman she carried them all of her life. One son was born on board the ship and he was named after the Captain of the ship. It is unusual that David Porter Crawford joined the Confederate army since he had only come over to South Carolina about 11 years ago. He had no slaves and he was a poor farmer but he joined anyway. All of David Porter Crawford's family joined The Confederate army during the War Between the States. His brother Samuel joined Captain Rion's company in 1861; it became the 7th Battalion South Carolina it was known as the Enfield Rifles. They never had enough Enfield rifles to supply the battalion.



were left on the Sultan's farm in the care of an agent. Their shipment was delayed due to the fact that the Cashmere goats had to be brought across the desert in baskets on the backs of camels. When they arrived in England they attracted the attention of the Earl of Derby who tried to purchase a pair of the goats. Doctor Davis stated that they were not for sale but that he would trade a pair of them for some Brahman cattle that had been in the Zoological Garden of London. These animals were known as the Sacred Cows of India and had been brought to the Gardens for exhibition by the British

Several days later the Earl arranged for the trade, "a magnificant white East India Company. bull, and a beautiful fawn-colored heifer, and for this pair he received in exchange one pair of Persian Goats, leaving the nine that were brought to the United States with the Brahman Cattle, and a pair of black water buffalo, which Doctor Davis had purchased in Turkey . . ." These were the first Brahman Cattle to be brought into this country.

In August 1849, Doctor Davis and some of his animals arrived in Charleston. The Steamship HUNTINGTON had arrived earlier, in June of the same year, with the first of the stock. For a short while the Davises lived in Charleston in a house on the corner of East Bay Street and Longitude Lane. They later moved to a home that he purchased near Columbia on the Garner's Ferry Road. After his father's death he returned to the family estate at Monticello where he died in 1861 at the age of fifty-one.

Upon his return to Fairfield Doctor Davis was given the nickname of "Turkey Jim" by his neighbors. He is buried with other members of his family on his plantation in the old Davis Cemetery not a far distance from the house.

His treasured herd was not destroyed during the War Between the States. After those perilous days members of the family sold some of the stock in Kentucky, Texas, Florida, and Georgia.

The Davis family continued to own this grand old house until it was purchased by the father of the present owner, Mr. Ross Robinson. The Robinsons keep the place in the true Southern tradition. The spacious halls and elegant rooms are furnished with family heirlooms and the grounds are wellkept surrounded by green pastures whose white fences enclose herds of fine cattle and beautiful saddle-horses.

MONTICELLO METHODIST CHURCH

The MONTICELLO METHODIST CHURCH was one of the first Methodist

congregations in Fairfield County. The original building was erected some time before 1820. As the membership grew this little house of worship was enlarged on several occasions. The present building was erected in 1861.

This building, although it has but recently passed its century mark, is a fine example of the rural churches of the ante-bellum period. On the exterior it is plain but classic, a rectangular structure covered with a gabled roof supported by four large columns on the front, a spacious tall porch is fronted and flanked by five easy-rising steps.

The neighbor from Hell

Shadrack Jacobs was the neighbor of the original Gasper Byerley. He was a next door neighbor of his. Gasper's son who we'll call Gasper, Jr. had moved to Fairfield Dist. about 1795. He had bought some land on Rocky Creek close to the quarry now. Then maps show it is called Blairs today. By 1800, Old Shadrack he was shown as a neighbor of Gasper, Jr. Old Shadrack had moved next door to Gasper, Jr. by the census of 1800. It was known that Gasper, Jr. did not care for him. He was known as a petty thief in Newberry Dist. and a hoodlum. It was well known that Gasper, Jr. had moved away from him. They lived next door for at least four years. In 1804, Gasper Byerley died and Jr. was on his own. He had a will to settle a estate then he was free. So he sold his land in Fairfield Dist. He sold it too Shadrack Jacobs. He told Shadrack he was moving to Tennessee near the Georgia line. He moved away with out giving him any more information.

It appears that old Shadrack got in trouble again this time with a State of South Carolina warrant for his arrest. He figured that one of his neighbors Ezekiel Wooley who was a constable would probably be the one who would arrest him. He decided to waylay him.

Andrew Feaster who was also a neighbor of his, was riding home with Mr. Wooley. Mr. Feaster and Mr. Wooley were riding together when Mr. Wooley's horse began limping so they decided to exchange horses since Mr. Wooley's home was a bit farther than Mr. Feaster's was. All of a sudden, Shadrack fired a shot and killed Mr. Feaster.

Shadrack Jacobs fled that night. He fled to Georgia just over the South Carolina line. No one saw him shoot Mr. Feaster; but his actions made him a prime suspect. He hid out for about 20 years using a alias while in Georgia but he tried to get in touch with Gasper, Jr;. and word got back to the Sheriff Moore of Fairfield County. Who asked the Governor of Georgia to arrest him. He was arrested in 1829 and tried for murder. Shadrack admitted that he trying to kill Mr. Wooley. HOW THE BURLEYS MADE ?

KRAUT:

Shred the cabbage. Put a layer a cabbage, and a layer of salt packing it each time until the barrel is full. Cover this well with cabbage leaves. This is put under the house. Test it after a week to see if it is fermented. Now, if you get hungry, just go under the house and get a handful to eat or to cook.

SALT WATER PICKLE:

Choose firm, fresh cucumbers. Pack the cucumbers as tight as you can in the jar putting the stem end up. Use a 1/4 teaspoonful(or as much as you want) of red pepper and 2 tablespoonfuls of salt(be sure that the salt is dissolved well) to a half gallon of water to a gallon of cucumbers. Keep this in a warm room. This should be ready in three or four days.

MUSCADINE WINE:

Put muscadines in a crock jar until they ferment. Stir them every day for a week until the juices come out. Strain them well keeping the juice and discarding the rest. Add sugar. This cures an upset stomach in one dose.

HOME BREW:

Pick ripe persimmons and gather locusts(the plant). Layer them in a vat. Let this ferment. Strain after this ferments and pour juice in a container. Add sugar to taste. Mama says you can only have 1/2 of a glassful.

MACARONI PIE:

Grate about 1/2 lb. of sharp cheese. Cook 2 cups of macaroni in a quart of water until done, but not mushy. To this add a stick of margarine and salt to taste. Set aside. Beat 2 or 3 eggs and mix with 1 qt. of milk. Put a layer of macaroni and a layer of cheese. Pour in 1/2 of the milk and eggs mixture. Repeat ending with a layer of cheese. Sprinkle a little black pepper over the mixture and cover the top with a thin pie crust. Make little slits in crust, and bake in oven at 350 degrees about 1/2 hr. or until brown.

GRANDADDY'S PORK SAUSAGE:

A hog was fattened, then killed on a very cold day. It was cleaned and cut up. Get good cuts of lean pork and just enough fat meat to make sausage fry well. Grind the meat well twice to make the sausage tender. Spread ground meat out on table top and add some salt, pepper, and sage. (Grandaddy had a colored man named Dave help him. Dave's job was to knead the sausage like you would dough. Grandaddy added the seasoning, and Dave kneaded. Then Grandaddy would fry some and give it the taste test. If it was not seasoned like he liked it, the process would continue with more spices being kneaded in until he got the taste he wanted.
