To the Legislature of South Carolina

The petition of Joseph Caldwell shows that he is now ^{of ye good} twenty years a resident of the district of Anderson and having been a soldier of the Revolution and now aged & infirm he is desirous of being placed on the pension list.

He served three months under Captain Godfrey Tye in the Regiment commanded by Major Hart and Col William Thompson.

Under Captain Owen he was marched to the 4 Holes and was stationed for some time under Captain Friday in Guarding the Magazine at Lancaster and was frequently during the last years of the war actively engaged in Scouting parties but was too young in the first part of the War to take part in it.

This deponent has no other property than a horse worth fifty dollars - One cow for which I am yet ⁱⁿ debt - Some little household furniture and plantation implements worth about fifty dollars or thereabouts.
