5-2. Andrew Jackson Caldwell, b. 6-7-1834, d. 9-4-1904 (70). The following account is from "A. J. Caldwell's Travels Through Life": 16

In October 1856 [22] goes to Mississippi, Panola County, and returns home in late spring of 1857 sick. Lives with Mrs. Rosy Smith in 1858, lives with Mrs. Eliza Dodd in 1859 until the fall, and then goes to Missippi, Panola County for the second time. Lived with William Todd 1859 and 1860 until fall; came home and volunteered [1-29-1862 (28), at Columbia, as Sergeantl in A. H. Dean's Company, it being Co. E 2nd S.C. Calvary, in that service until about the 25th of April 1865. I was furloughed about that time near a church some eight miles this side of Chester, S.C. and returned home and made a crop on John Steeven's place, in 1866 [32] owned the Jack Willis place and made a crop on it, it being three miles from Spartanburg on the Mills Gapp road.

In 1867 [33] goes to Mississippi the 3rd time, and returns same fall or next spring; builds part of Capt. T. B. Martin's house, ceils J. G. Landrum's 1868, and frames and encloses J. W. Wingo's house; in 1869 goes to Mississippi for the 4th time; works in shop for Boils and Harris two years and 6 months or about that. Goes to California in 1872 and works at Anahine and Los Angeles about six months. Returns to San Francisco and finds employment in Redwood City. Stays there about two years and six months. Leaves there for home the 14th of February, 1875 [41].

Gins cotton at Gaffney the winter of 1875. Ceils Dr. J. B. O. Landrum's house in the spring of 1876, and makes a cotton crop at Father's in 1876; also works on Randolph Turner's house same year. Buys J. William's saw mill 1877, saw near John Laws that year and gins in the fall. Saws sprng of 1878 at same place, and moves to R/A. Walden's John Wofford about planting time, remains there until fall and moves back to old stand and gins that fall. Saws spring of 1879 at old-stand, and gins in fall.

Marries I. W. Simmons December 18th same year [1879 (45)], and moves to Doegg place near Inman. Builds and clears land, it all being woodland. Remains there until 1892. In the time I remained there I served on Board of County
