any Public Sales of Confiscated Property, (except such as shall be ordered
by the Legislature for special Purposes;) and this INDENT shall be re-
ceived in Payment.

tioned; the PUBLIC TREASURY is made liable, and the FAITH of
the STATE pledged by the aforesaid ACT.
