to the said *Samuel Caldwell* his Executors, Administrators, or Assigns will be entitled to receive from this Office the Sum of *Twelve Shillings and eleven pence Sterling* due the first day of April 1784 last on the *Demand* for one Year's Interest on the Principal Sum of *Nine pounds five Shillings and four pence* *making Sterling* and the like Interest Annually of Resol^o of the Gen^l Assembly 1783

The said *Samuel Caldwell* his Executors, Administrators or Assigns, will be entitled also to receive, and shall be paid, if demanded, the principal Sum of *Nine pounds five Shillings and four pence* *making Sterling* on the *Seventh day of September 1786*

And the said *Samuel Caldwell* his Executors, Administrators, or Assigns, may make any Purchases at any Public Sales of Confiscated Property, (except such as shall be ordered by the Legislature for special Purposes;) and this INDENT shall be received in Payment.

For the true performance of the several payments in manner abovementioned; the PUBLIC TREASURY is made liable, and the FAITH of the STATE pledged by the aforesaid ACT.
