James Cameron b. 4-24-1764 d. 4-17-1840 in Troup Co., was a Revolutionary Soldier, came early to Troup Co. with his family from East Georgia. His wife was Sarah Brown b. 2-24-1768 and d. 12-16-1850. They are both buried at Long Cane Baptist Church, but were members of the Presbyterian Church.

Reid Guards of the Confederate service. Previously, this service was given to his uncle Benjamin H. Cameron, but in the LaGrange Reporter it is quite clear that Benjamin T. Cameron is the Captain of the Confederacy. Benjamin T. also was owner of a grist mill after the war, with S. G. Lane. He was thanked many times in the Reporter for allowing the black citizens to use one of his buildings for their school after the war, which was operated by J. S. Pitman, a freedman who became a teacher in Troup Co.

† 7. Benjamin Haseltine Cameron b. 1802 = Elizabeth Hooten, widow of Stephen H. Gilmore, Sr. b. 1799 Morgan Co., Ga. d. 7-6-1887. She and her first husband had married 1814 in Jones Co., Ga. and had six children, for whom Benjamin H. Cameron, their step-father, was guardian in Troup Co. in 1830. These were: Stephen H. Gilmore, Jr. = Martha Ann Hightower 1840; William W. Gilmore; Elizabeth F. Gilmore; Mary Ann Gilmore = John S. Johnson 1835; John H. Gilmore; and Eliza J. Gilmore. Their father's estate was valued at \$40,000 in 1830. Benjamin H. Cameron was among the early builders and architects of Troup Co. He was an original trustee of LaGrange High School in 1838 after the city bought it from the county. He and Horace King worked together on several building projects, including the Cameron Bridge over the Chattahoochee River, built before the War Between the States and operated as a business under the name Chattahoochee Bridge Co. It was a toll bridge that helped open up western Troup Co. and eastern Alabama to LaGrange. Benjamin H. Cameron was also a Justice of the Inferior Court of Troup Co. from 1836 to 1843 and 1857 to 1860. He was a Ga. State legislator 1842, 1847, and 1853-54. He and Elizabeth (Hooten) Gilmore had:

★ James Cameron, founder of the Troup Co. Clan, was the son of Thomas and Susannah Cameron. Thomas Cameron was the son of Scottish immigrants John Cameron and Mary Ann Frazier who had gone to Ireland to live about the time that Thomas was born. Thomas Cameron and his family moved to S.C. from Ireland. These Camerons were originally from around Inverness in Scotland and part of the powerful Clan Cameron. They were also associated with Abbottsford in Scotland and gave that name to the Troup Co. town, after the place in Scotland, which Sir Walter Scott bought and enlarged to a 1,200 acre farm.
