

John F. Cameron - private in Co H. 24th
S.C. Infantry War Between the States

In 1850 John L. Cameron owned land in
F.F. valued at \$19,000,

Robert G. Cameron owned land valued at
\$21,050

Also listed is a J. F. Cameron, ^{Private} in Little River
Guard -

Edrington History of F.F. mentions R. Gregg Cameron
who married a Feaster. They had seven sons
and four daughters. James the eldest moved to
Florida - John married Mrs. Hoffman, nee
Robinson. J. Feaster Cameron was a man of
education and refinement, a nobleman of the day.
He was Colonel of an Arkansas Regiment, was
twice shot and left for dead. He was one of the
best lawyers, a hero of many battles, that fell
victim to our nation's curse, strong drink.
The second son Dr. Andrew S. Cameron,
married Susan I. Arnette. Robert Cameron died
during the early part of the war. Alex married
daughter of James W. Young.
The eldest daughter married Henry Young.
The second " " Dr. Christopher Simonton
Sarah married John Simonton.
The youngest daughter married Col. Le Macfie.

We have copy of Will of John Cameron
dated Nov 16, 1816 - This might be the
father of John M.

The will mentions sons Joseph, Robert, Susan
Daughters Nancy, Mary, Catherine, Jane
Rebecca.

He mentions brothers Joseph and Andrew
and Andrew's daughter Jane

We also have copy of will of Andrew W.
Cameron ^{dated 1898}. He mentions wife Jennet. Daughter
Jew - who receives land granted to John
Cameron, daughter Sarah + Delia
son Alexander who receives land granted to
Joseph Cameron Sr.

We also have copy of will of Joseph
dated March 7, 1798 - He also mentions
a John and a Joseph.
