Native of Chester Co, S.C., he stated he was in continual service during the Revolution from May 1780 until the end of the war, and that "I myself led one of the advance parties into Charleston when the Enemy evacuated the City." He removed to Mercer co, Ky in 1786 and was with Gens. St. Clair and Wilkinson in the Northwest expedition of 1791, holding rank of major. He was a member of U S Senate 1805-06; served with distinction in war of 1812;
