I William Hill of the State of South Carolina and
 Fairfield County being very sick and weak in body but of
 perfect mind and memory Thanks be given unto God, calling
 unto mind the mortality of my Body and knowing that it is
 appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this
 my last will and Testament, that is to say. principally
 and First of all, I give and recommend my soul into the
 hands of almighty God, that gave it and my Body I
 recommend to the Earth to be Buried in decent Christian
 Burial, at the discretion of my Executors, nothing doubting
 but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same
 by the mighty power of God and as touching such worldly
 Estate as wherewith it has pleased God to blefs me in this
 life I Give demise and dispose of the same in the following
 manner First I Give unto William Hill Junr. whom I likewise
 Constitute make & ordain sole Executor of this my last will
 and Testament All and Singular my hands and all other Estate
 by him freely to be pofsefsed and Enjoyed, and I do hereby
 utterly disallow revoke and disannul / ^{all} and every other
 former Testaments Will Legacies Requests and Executors by
 me in any ways before named willed and Bequeathed Ratifying
 and Confirming this and no other- to be my last will and
 Testament IN WITNES whereof I-- have hereunto set my hand
 and Seal this the First day of June in the year of our Lord
 one thousand Seven Hmdred and Ninety

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RICHARD HILLRICHARD HILL DECEASEDLAST WILL & TESTAMENT

IN THE NAME OF GOD AMEN, Know ye that I Richard Hill of the State of South - Carolina and fairfield District being weak of Body but of perfect Mind and Memory, Knowing that it is Appointed for all men to die; And as touching such worldly Property as it hath pleased god to Bless me with, it is my will that my property be Judiciously Appraised, and remain as it is, to the use of My family for my wife and Children; Secondly it is My will that my wife Mary Hill do possess, and Occupy the Plantation whereon I now live, with all the appurtenances thereunto belonging during her lifetime, or widowhood, Then to be equally divided, at her decease or Marriage--among my five Sons (VIZ) William Simeon Richard, Scheel, & Jehu. Thirdly. It is My will that unto Each of My Daughters, Namely Darkus, Susannah and Sarah, unto each of them be given to the Amount of forty Dollars of My goods and Chattels after they have been Appraised, and the remainder if any to be equally Divided among My Children.

January 22^d 1810

In the Court of Ordinary for the District of Fairfield personally appeared John McCullugh, George S. Smith, and Daniel A. Mbley who being duly sworn Deposith, that they were present when the -- within named Richard Hill Deceased directed the Above John McCully to write his Last will and testament and told him what to write, which was the same in Substance which is contained in the ^{above} instrument of writing called his will, but the Said Deceased, became so weak and insensible before the will was perfected, but was truly sensible when he spake the testamentary words, The Said Deponants farther say, that they being present were Called upon to witness the Above transaction and that they did in the presence of each Other did Subscribe their Names there to Sworn to the 5th Feby. 1811

I Will am Chapman Sen^r planter of the District aforesaid .
in the State aforesaid, being of sound mind and memory, but
frail of body, and being mindful of death, do make the follow-
ing Disposition of my estate both real and personal; to wit:

1st I give to my wif Anne Chapman, the plantation whereon
I now live containing two hundred and twenty acres more or
less: also the following property, Viz. Juba, Violet, Sam,
Gina, Jim and William, and the increase of them my son here-
after born: one grey mare, ^{one} gelding named Buck, waggon and har-
nests, gig and harnests ten head of cattle (she to have the choos-
ing of them) one half of my Stock of hogs, ten head of sheep
and twenty head of geese, and such farming utensils as she may
choose: All of which said property with the increase thereof
she is to have during her life or widowhood: and at her dec-
ease or marriage to be disposed of as hereinafter mentioned.

2nd I give and bequeath to my wife Anna my negro bo. Dave, a
bay filly or mare about five years old, or fifty dollars, as
she ma. choose, four father beds with steads and furniture,
two cows such as she may choose, one chest and trunk, the
crop and provisions which may be on hand at the time of my
decease, all of which is to be her absol te property.

3rd I give and bequeath to my daughter Sucky Thomas, my
negro girl Sarah for her sole and separate use during her life,
and at her death, to the children of the said Sucky which may
be then living.

4th I give and bequeath to my daughter Tempey Nobly, my negro
bo. Henry, for her sole and Separate use, during her life; and
at her eath to her children who may be then living.

5th I give and bequeath to my daughter Sally Chapman, my negro
girl young Billy, to her Sole and Separate use during her life,
and at her death, to her children who may be then living

6th I will that all my estate both real and personal not here-
in specifically disposed of be sold by my executors, at my
decease, on such terms as my executors may deem proper.

WILLIAM CHAPMAN

8th I will that my negroes Dave and old Milly be sold together, and that the purchaser do enter into bond not to separate them and that after the sale of said two slaves two men be chosen who shall determine how much of the purchase money Dave was worth in proportion to what he and Milly sold for jointly; and the value of Dave so ascertained, I will to the heirs of my son Berryman Chapman The said appraisers are to be chosen by my executors, and the others by the heirs of my said son Berryman.

8th I will that at the death of my wife or marriage, my executors do sell ^{all} the property hereby given to her for life or widowhood on such terms as they may deem proper.

9th I will that the proceeds of the sales of my property above directed shall be equally divided among my heirs, except as follows: From the part of Tempy Mobly, is to be deducted, the sum of two hundred and twelve dollars twelve cents with interest thereon from the eight enth day of Febury A.D. 1825. And I will that this sum with the interest aforesaid to my decease, be turned over to the heirs of Hardy Chapman.

10th I will that all the property which my daughters Tempy Mobly, Sally Chapman, and Sucky Thomas, shall receive, of my estate under this will, shall be for their Sole and separate use for their lives and at their respective deaths to such of their children as may be then living.

11th I will that should any of my heirs commence proceeding in in any court of law or Equity to invalidate this will or the provisions thereof, said heir or heirs shall thereby be excluded from receiveing any part of what is hereby bequeathed to them, and the Same shall go over to the other heirs.

12th I do nominate Gilbert M. Chapman and Anderson Mayo Ex-
ecutors of this my last will and testament.

13th Revoking all wills by me heretofore made I do declare
this my last will and testament.

I make this codicil as an amendment and explanation of my
within will and testament.

1st I give and bequeath to the heirs of my son Brettan Chap-
man my negro boy Alek; and to my son Robert Chapman my negro
boy Moses; and to my wife Anna my negro girl gina absolutel,
which I have already given to her for life, and I also give
her my kitchen furniture for her life; and the household fur-
niture except two feather beds and furniture for life, but
this not to affect what is given her *absolutely* by my will.

2nd I will that the slaves Big Dave, Alek, Moses, Milly,
Sarah & Henry, which by my will and codicil are given to my
children and the heirs of my deceased children, shall be ap-
praised by three disinterested persons, and the difference in
their respective values so ascertained is to be equallized by
my executors so that all may receive alike.

3rd Where heirs of my deceased children are mentioned in my
will I intend that the heirs of any deceased child shall re-
present his or her parent respectively.

4th I will that Juba and Vilet be sold together and the pur-
chaser enter into bond not to separate them.

I do declare this a codicil to my last will & Testament

day of Sept Anno Domini 1841.

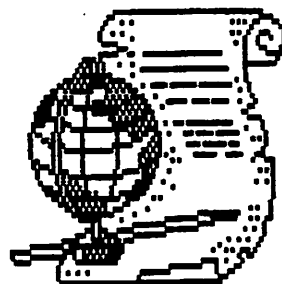

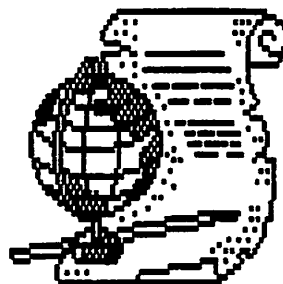
