Juba, Violet, Cam, Gina, Jim and William, and the increase of them my son hereafter born: one grey mare, gelding named Buck, waggon and harnels, gig and harnefs ten head of cattle (she to have the choosing of them) one half of my Stock of hogs, ten head of sheep and twenty head of geese, and such farming utensils as she may choose: All of which said property with the increase thereof she is to have during her life or widowhood: and at her decease or marriage to be disposed of as hereinafter mentioned. 2nd I give and bequeath to my wife Anna my negro bo Dave, a bay filly or mare about five years old, or fifty dollars, as she ma choose, four father beds with steads and furniture, two cows such as she may choose, one chest and trunk, the crop and provisions which hay be on hand at the time of my decease, all of which is to be her absol te property. 3rd I give and bequeath to my daughter Sucky Thomas, my negro girl Sarah for her sole and se arate use suring her life, and at ner death, to the children of the said Sucky which may be then living.

4th I give and bequeath to my daughter Tempey Mobly, my negro be Henry, for her sole and Separate use, during her life; and at her eath to her children who may be then living.

5th I give and bequeath to my daughter Sally Chapman, my negro girl young Milly, to her Sole and Separate use during her life, and at her death, to her children who may be then living 6th I will that all my estate both real and personal not here in specifically disposed of bg sold by my executors, at my decease, on such terms as my executors may deem proper.

And I will that this sum with the interest aforesaid to my decease, be turned over to the heirs of ardy Chapman.

10th I will shat all the property which my saughters Tempsy obly, Sally Chapman, and Sucky Thomas, shall receive, of my estate under this will, shall be for their Sole and separate use for their lives and at their respective deaths to such of their children's may e then living.


