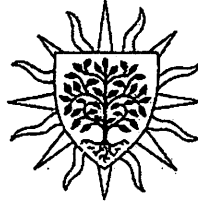

Pelham:

Thanks so much for your prompt answer.

I am "ccing" Dr. Phillip Plotz on this email. He practices medicine in Atlanta, Georgia, and is also a descendant of Michael Joseph Baughman and Emeline Chapman. Phil is one of my wife's cousins.

I would like to get Phil into the loop, as he is also doing family research.

To update Phil a little: Phil, a couple of years ago, I took my daughter-in-law's father on a genealogy trip backwards in time. His name is Larry Howard. Larry had cancer and surgery for it and I wanted to do him a favor. Fortunately he is doing OK now. Anyway, one of Larry's ancestry grandfathers was Colonel John Winn (Rev. War), whose brother was General Richard Winn (Rev. War and Congressman). They were founders of Winnsboro, South Carolina, country seat of Fairfield County, SC. Pelham met us at the Fairfield County Musuem and was extremely helpful with some research. Pelham is also from one of the old founding families of Fairfield County, South Carolina.

Pelham, I have read that the Bookman name was changed to Baughman in deed records in Fairfield County, and the surname, "Baughman," stuck. My thoughts were also that they were of German descent. Some say they were Jewish, and I think there are Jewish Baughman's but I do not think the Phil's and my wife's Baughman's were Jewish, as Michael Joseph Baughman and his wife, Emeline Chapman, were founders of Mineral Springs Baptist Church in Jackson Parish, Louisiana (the northern portion that latter became Lincoln Parish, and which is close to Farmerville in Union Parish.)

Like you, I have also seen Buchman as a variation of Baughman. Once Michael Joseph Baughman got to Louisiana the spelling, "Baughman" stuck there and has not changed. I think the changes in spelling of the surname occurred in South Carolina. Thanks for the information on the web sites of Newberry and Lexington Counties and the Dutch Fork Gen.Chapter. I will check those.

Emeline Chapman is on the 1850 Fairfield County, SC census in the Mobley household. It appears that some of her brothers and sisters are in the same household. I would assume by 1850, Emeline Chapman's parents had died, or at least her father had died, and the Mobley's were somehow related. Emeline Chapman is listed on Page 483, Line 2, of the 1850 Fairfield County, SC census, and she is listed as age 15 in 1850. On 29 January 1852, Emeline Chapman married Michael Joseph Baughman in Fairfield County, South Carolina.

We will look forward to any additional information you have. As I recall, there was a good deal of information in the Museum on various families that could not be found anywhere else.

Paul,
Passing this on to the genealogy researchers upstairs. We have recently had some inquiries on Chapman and can also perhaps connect you with the individuals who were seeking Chapman family information. Interesting that Baughman may have been Bookman as there is a Bookman Loop Road in the SW part of county. I know we have information on that family also. Have you also seen it as Buchman and other German variations? Just across the Broad River is an area called the Dutch (Deutsch) Fork where many German settlers came in the 1700s. The SW area of Fairfield had many families who came from those migrations settling and migrating into this county. If you are also following the earlier generations of Michael Joseph, you might want to contact the Newberry County Genealogy Chapter, Lexington County, and Dutch Fork Gen. Chapters. I believe they have active websites. Chapmans were also in Newberry early. In the meanwhile, Eddie Killian or one of the volunteers can start looking for the specific individuals. You might want to relay to them what sources you have already checked, such as Ancestry.com, census records, etc.

Michael Joseph Baughman (name could have been Bookman at one time)? Michael Joseph Baughman was born on 27 April 1826 in Fairfield County, South Carolina, and died on 18 November 1886 in Farmerville, Union Parish, Louisiana. He married Emeline Chapman in Fairfield County, South Carolina, on 29 January 1852.

Also, do you have anything there on the Chapmans? **Emeline Chapman** (born: 25 July 1835, Fairfield County, South Carolina died: 16 February 1886, Farmerville, Union Parish, Louisiana). Emeline Chapman's parents were: William Chapman (born: 6 January 1808 in Fairfield County, South Carolina and died about 1849 in Fairfield County, South Carolina) and Mary Hill (1817-1895).
