

*Twenty five Pounds Fifteen Shillings and one Penny Sterling for Provision for Contingents and Militia for the Account Passed by the Commissioners on Accounts*

the said *Dew Chapman* his Executors, Administrators, or Assigns, will be entitled to receive from this Office the Sum of *One Pound Sixteen Shillings*

on ~~the~~ Demand one Year's Interest on the principal Sum of *Twenty five Pounds Fifteen Shillings and one Penny* and the like Interest annually

The said *Dew Chapman* his Executors, Administrators or Assigns, will be entitled also to receive and shall be paid, if demanded, the principal Sum of *Twenty five Pounds Fifteen Shillings and one Penny* on the *Nineteenth of August 1783*

And the said *Dew Chapman* his Executors, Administrators or Assigns, may make any Purchases at any Public Sales of Confiscated Property, (except such as shall be ordered by the Legislature for special Purposes;) and this INDENT shall be received in Payment.

For the true Performance of the several Payments in Manner above-mentioned, the PUBLIC TREASURY is made liable, and the FAITH of the STATE pledged by the aforesaid ACT.
