**Stokes, E.A.**, 70, a well-known Confederate veteran, died at his home in Carlisle (Oct. 25) and was buried the following day at Kelly's Chapel. Stokes married Miss Nannie Comer, and is survived by his wife and five children, Mrs. J. E. Pearson, Mrs. T. Johns, Mrs. Monroe Jones, Miss Eva Stokes and Mr. Tom Stokes.
