

**Eliphalet "Liffy" Chappell**, 1763 grantee; b. prob. New London, Conn. ca. 1745, son Jabez and Zippora (Bill) Chappell; m. Cumberland 21 Mch. 1768<sup>16</sup> **Katharine "Catron" Somers**, (b. prob. Pa. ca. 1750, dau. Mathais Somers/Sohmers). Eliphalet was a mariner on 19 Apr. 1781 deed,<sup>40</sup> with Jabez Chapple [his father], witness. Children (order uncertain):<sup>41</sup>

**Jabez Chappell**, 1763 grantee; b. Lebanon, Conn. 13 Dec. 1714, son Caleb and Ruth (Royce) Chappell; d. after 19 Apr. 1781, when witness to deed; m. Lebanon, Conn. 5 July 1735 **Zippora Bill**, [b. Lebanon, Conn. 16 Feb. 1715/16, dau. Philip(s) and Jane Bill]. Children:

**Parker Clarke**, surgeon at Ft. Cumberland; b. Ipswich Mass. 3 Apr. 1748, son Parker and Lydia (Phillips) Clarke; d. Machias, Me. 25 Mch. 1823; m. Newbury, Mass. (intention) 8 July 1769 **Judith Lunt**.<sup>44</sup> Taken prisoner 28 Nov. 1776 during Eddy Rebellion and taken to Halifax for trial.<sup>45</sup> Dr. Parker Clark is listed from Machias in 1785;<sup>11</sup> received land grant in Eddington, Me. in 1785;<sup>12</sup> 1790 Machias, Me. resident. Received land grant in Ohio Refugee Tract.<sup>21</sup> Children:<sup>44</sup>

- i. Phillips Clarke, b. Newbury, Mass. 1 Dec. 1769; bp. Newbury, 17 June 1770; d. Machias, Me. 22 Mch. 1835; m. 20 July 1798 Sophia Fellowes (b. 26 Sept. 1781; d. 14 Mch. 1868; dau. Gustavus Fellowes). She procured a divorce between 1815 and 1817 and m. (2) Eastport, Me. 14 Aug. 1817 Lewis Frederick Delesdernier, also in Eddy Rebellion.<sup>46</sup>
- ii. John Phillips Clarke, b. East Machias, Me. 20 Jan. 1772; bp. Newbury, Mass. 7 May 1780; d. Newburyport, Mass. 14 Mch. 1837; m. Newburyport, Mass. 6 Dec. 1795 Lydia Clarkson (dau. James and Elizabeth [Noyes] Clarkson).
- iii. Samuel Phillips Clarke, b. 30 June 1773; bp. Newburyport, Mass. 16 Oct. 1774; m. 8 Apr. 1800 Lydia Smith (dau. Stephen and Deborah [Ellis] Smith).

**Jesse Converse**, b. prob. Mass. ca. 1740; d. 22 Aug. 1822 *ae.* 82; tombstone in Jolicure Cemetery reads: "Jesse Converse, a native of Mass., and one of the first settlers of this
