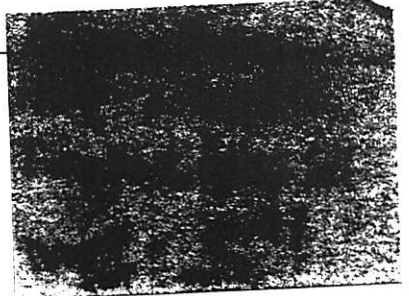
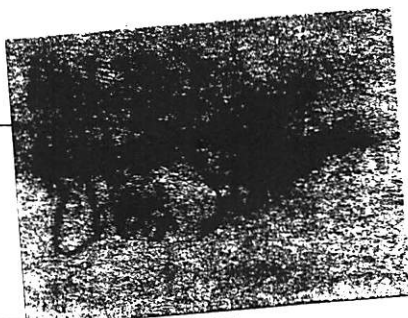

[Chapter] 4 CENSUS OF 1790

1790 Census
Coleman

On 1 March 1790, President George Washington signed into law the first Census Act of the United States of America. The responsibility for determining the manner in which the first complete listing of the inhabitants of the country was to be compiled was placed upon the president himself. Although historians are still not certain exactly what method the president used, it is commonly assumed that he delegated the major responsibility for its enactment to the marshals of the several existing judicial districts.

The instructions in the law were to ascertain the number of inhabitants of each county or district in the thirteen states that existed at the time; to indicate the sex and color of these persons; and to enumerate the free males sixteen years of age and over. Indians, not being taxed, were not included, and a careful distinction was made between free inhabitants and slaves (including indentured servants bound to service for only a short period of time). Although the Constitution called only for a simple enumeration of the inhabitants of the land, the census of 1790 was undoubtedly used to obtain knowledge of the military strength and industrial potential of the country.

The actual compiling of the census was a very difficult and often dangerous task. Enormous areas of the eastern portion of the country were still wilderness and even in the most heavily populated areas, transportation was primitive and unreliable. As a result, the schedules obtained in this first census were not altogether consistent in their content and

form. They are, however, considered accurate and complete. Unfortunately, the Capitol was burned by the British forces during the War of 1812, and the schedules for the areas that constituted the present states of Delaware, Georgia, Kentucky, New Jersey, Tennessee, and Virginia were destroyed.

The records which escaped destruction have proven inestimably valuable, for they show a complete listing of the heads of all families living in the United States at the time of the adoption of the Constitution. These schedules contain over 400,000 names, and since each family averages six persons, historians have estimated the population of the country in 1790 to have been approximately 3,231,533.

Below are listed the names of all the heads of families bearing the name Coleman in twelve of the thirteen original states (the schedules of Delaware having been destroyed in 1812 and those of Virginia having been reconstructed from state enumerations taken in the years 1782, 1783, and 1785). The list numbers over 350 family heads in the states of Connecticut, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New York, North Carolina, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, South Carolina, Vermont, and Virginia. Following the name is the county or district (in the case of North and South Carolina) of domicile of the particular individual. Additional names from a reconstructed 1800 census schedule (compiled from lists of taxpayers) for the state of Kentucky are also included.

Robert made a will dated 5 Oct 1790, probated in 1795 in Edgecombe County, North Carolina. His will mentions sister Grace and son. Executors of Robert's will are Jacob Battle, Noah Woodard. Witnesses of Robert's will are Aaron Coleman and Sela Coleman, the brother and sister of the deceased.

There is nothing more known about Sarah Story but there are references to Colemans and Storys in the archives of the rootsweb mail lists for the STORY surname, such as "Abstracts of Edgecombe Co. NC deeds" and "Scotch Irish Colemans from PA mentioned".

I'm guessing Susannah was born c1740. Cadar died between 1800 & 1820 in Fairfield County, South Carolina. Cadar was recorded in Edgecombe County, NC court records from Jan 1763 when he bought land from Arthur Philips, married 15 months later and appears in road building groups and juries until he sold the 447 acre plot he purchased from Philips to Richard Bradley in Jan 1772.

Cader and his wife sold two plots in Fairfield County, SC in 1785, and I presume they had relocated there in or shortly after Jan 1772 upon the sale of their home acreage in North Carolina. On May 28, 1789, Cader records 493 acres in Camden District of South Carolina. In the 1790s, Cader shows on juries in Fairfield County through 1799, but is absent in the local 1829 census.

Below are listed some early deeds of Edgecombe County, NC bearing the name of Cader Coleman. Refer to the Edgecombe County map above for locations referenced in these early deeds. Bodies of water have the same names as they did when these deeds were recorded.

Cadar's death and will records are not known to this author and may be found someday in Fairfield County, SC, or in Alabama, or in some other place I can not yet imagine.

known to this author. The best documented child of Cadar and Susannah Coleman is Charles Coleman, Sr., whose offspring are documented here in this chapter and the chapter on Fairfield, SC Colemans. Little is known about (1137) Robert Coleman other than he owned land on the Wateree River in Fairfield County, SC which he sold to his brother, Charles Coleman Sr., and then Robert moved back to Virginia. [Coleman, J. P., 1965, pages 374 & 375.] Where (1137) Robert Coleman, son of (16) Cadar Coleman and Susannah Stephenson, settled, whether he married or had any heirs, and what became of him is unknown to this author.

This location is mentioned in Colonel Winn's notes as he recorded the activity of the South Carolina militia as it fought the Torries while the Continental

Army was away and bought time for the revolutionary army.
Jacob Gibson, Sr. died in May 1735 in Prince Williams, VA. His wife's name was recorded as Jane. The 1820 Census of Fairfield County, SC records:

Charles' first wife, Ruth Gibson, died 1825 and he remarried (date unknown) to Elizabeth (Eliza) Unknown, b. 1785. Charles Coleman, Sr. died 6 April 1842, in Alabama.

The relationships between Cadar Coleman, son Charles and Charles' first wife, Ruth Gibson are documented by a letter written by Cadar's grandson, James Buchanan Coleman. James was applying for a widow's pension for Elizabeth when he recorded that his father, Charles Coleman, Sr. below, had fought in the Revolution. Acting as executor of his father's estate, James was applying to claim any pension moneys due his widow, Elizabeth. The fact that Charles fought was known to James from family discussions which James recalled hearing of his father Charles and his grandfathers on both sides, Cadar Coleman and Abraham Gibson, telling of their actions in the war.

He married the sister of Robert Coleman, on whose land Culpeper was established in 1759, and called Fairfax, which was its legal title before the Civil war. The first trustees of the town were Nat. Pendleton, Wm. Green, Wm. Williams, Thomas Slaughter and Philip Clayton. Ben Davis had leased the land from Coleman and hence the names Davis and Coleman streets. One of the daughters of P. Clayton married Nat. Pendleton, whose son Nat. was a Minute Man of Culpeper, afterwards aid to Gen. Greene, and was the second of Alexander Hamilton in his duel with Aaron Burr. He was the ancestor of Gen. H. Pendleton, who was minister to Berlin. His brother Henry was an eminent jurist in South Carolina, after whom the Pendleton District was called. Another daughter of Clayton married Wm. Williams, the father of Gen. James, Maj. John, Philip and Wm. Clayton Williams, from whom a numerous progeny has descended. Another daughter married Col. James Slaughter, the father of Captain P. Slaughter, who was born at Catalpa, Dec. 1758. He was living with his grandfather and going to school here to Adam Goodlet, master of the first classical school ever in Culpeper to that date, when the Minute Men met in Clayton's old field (Catalpa) in 1775. Hence he had the best opportunity of knowing the facts recorded in his journal. The Minute Man, Gen. Stevens, who cast the electoral vote of this district for Washington, also married the daughter of Robert Coleman.

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Robert Coleman Sr. (b. Abt. 1650, d. Abt. 1710)

Robert Coleman Sr. was born Abt. 1650 in Wales?, and died Abt. 1710.


Notes for Robert Coleman Sr.:

Prior to our family Coleman's arrival in America, there were at least two Colemans who perished before, or soon after, reaching American shores. There were four different Robert Colemans who had arrived in various portions of the Virginia Colony by 1700. These Robert Colemans are commonly distinguished by the Virginia county in which each settled. For example, we refer to Robert of Gloucester County (also known as Mobjack Bay Coleman line), Robert of Charles City County, Robert of Isle of Wight, and lastly, Robert of Nansemond County. Nansemond County is now called Suffolk City County.

Our family line descends from the line of Robert Coleman of Nansemond County.

Robert Coleman, Senior. was probably born around 1650 based on the notion he was about 16 when he came to America and was listed as a headright of Robert Coleman of Isle of Wight County in 1666. If Robert served any indenture, it would commonly have been 5 years and he would have been free by 1671.

Robert's death date is pure speculation.

In 1676 he would be roughly 26 and have been working for himself for five years. By this point a man would typically be married. This would be compatible with his son Robert's birth date of 1676. He reportedly had a second son,  William. Both sons are reported to have died in Edgecombe County North Carolina. How long he lived after that is unknown and his place of death is unknown.

"On 29 September 1667, Robert (of Isle of Wight) was granted 634 acres in Isle of Wight Co. - 300 purchased from Ambrose Bennet and 334 for transporting seven persons, INCLUDING A ROBERT COLEMAN." Source: "The Coleman Family of Mobjack Bay Virginia," Sherrienne Coleman Nicol, p. 42 (emphasis added). This is interpreted as human labor being transported to help settle this newly acquired land in Virginia.

A Jennie I. Coleman, writing in the early 1800s from her house in Fairfield South Carolina, said that Robert Coleman was likely from Wales. Colemans from Cork County Ireland emigrated to Wales to work in the Glamorgan and Monmouth mining areas. This is the most probable explanation for the presence of Colemans in Wales who originate from Ireland/Scotland.

Other sources record the fact that the Coleman name was never associated with gentry, no Coleman lords and ladies were recorded in English history, yet Colemans distinguished themselves frequently in the founding of the Virginia

Colony.

Possibly, after obtaining freeman status, Robert moved to adjacent Nansmond County. Robert made his first land purchase in 1684 (450 acres), and another 530 acres in 1687. By 1704, Robert owned a reported 1400 acres and had moved to Edgecombe County.

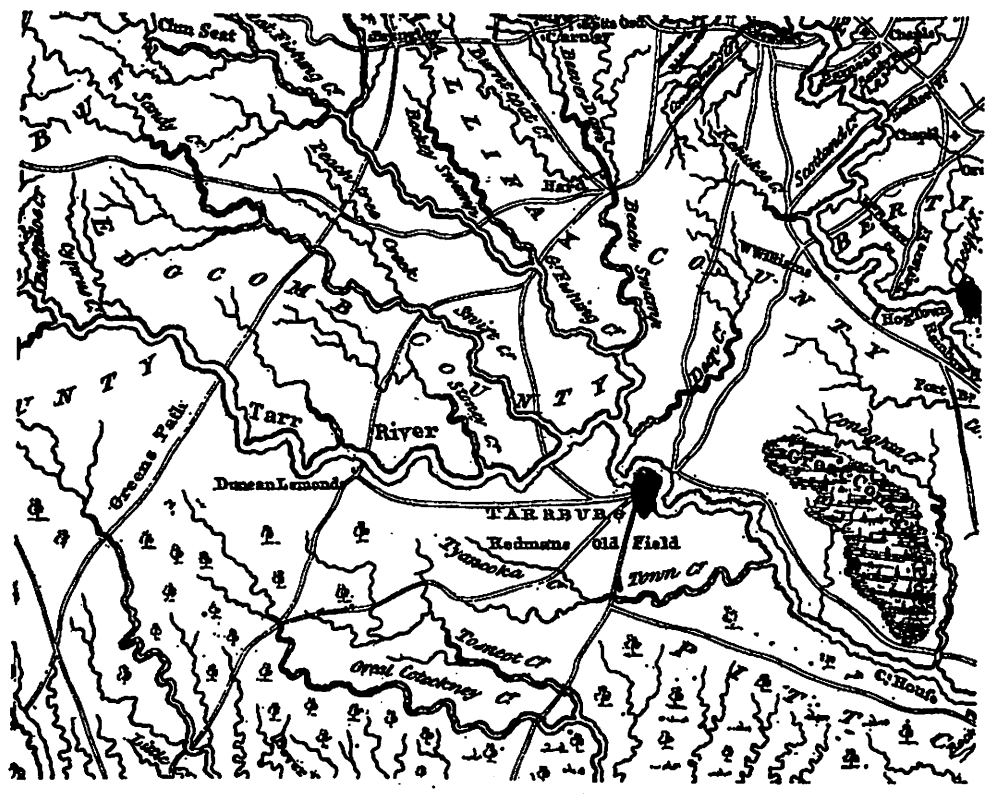

New Kent Co. land grant (Pat. Bk. 7, p. 634), it is known that John Coleman was an owner of property adjacent Joseph Goodrich and Stephen Benbridge. The land lies on a branch of Ashawaymankecacke Swamp. There are a few New Kent Co. Colemans mentioned in later records. Josiah Coleman had a son John Coleman b. 12 Dec 1724. Many years later, a Josiah Coleman had a son Shephard Coleman b. ca. 1808. Shephard had a daughter Harriett Coleman b. 27 Jan 1837 in Meade Co. KY. On 26 Sep 1772, Anna Dudley Coleman was born to Thomas and Anna Coleman.

16. JOHN COLEMAN (2 men) possibly of Old Rappahannock/Essex. On 16 Jun 1649, Capt. Ralph Wormeley received a patent for 3200 acrs of land on the south side of Rappahannock River at Nimcock Indian Town, etc. This was in Old Rappahannock Co.nty, the part that became Essex in 1692. Today this is Jones Point just below Tappahannock (*History of Old Rappahannock Co. VA 1656-1692* by Thomas Hoskins Warner, p. 158). Two of the headrights used by Wormeley to obtain this patent were named John Coleman. (Wormeley patent from Nell Nugent's patent & grant abstracts, Pat. Bk. 2, p. 170)

17. ROBERT COLEMAN of Mobjack Bay., the subject of this website

18. ROBERT COLEMAN of Nansemond Co. The date of his arrival in Virginia is unknown. On 20 Apr 1684, he was granted 530 acres on the west side of a reedy marsh on a branch of the Chuckatuck (Land Pat. Bk. 7, p. 378). On 28 Oct 1697, he was granted 450 acres near Wickham Swamp in Upper Parish adjacent to John & Thomas Milner (Land Pat. Bk. 9, p. 110). Robert Coleman had two sons, both of whom died in Edgecombe Co. NC, William in 1752 and Robert in 1761. → *This Robert was Kador's father.*

19. ROBERT COLEMAN of Isle of Wight Co. The date of his arrival in Virginia is unknown. He had a brother, #12 Stephen Coleman, but Robert left no male descendants. His will was probated in 1715, with a death date given of 8 Mar 1715. Legatees were Elinor Giles, "brother Stephen's sons", Benjamin Beal, Martha Murray, George Martin, John Watts, Christopher Reynolds and Ann, his wife (Ann Reynolds). On 29 Sep 1667, Robert was granted 634 acres in Isle of Wight Co. - 300 purchased from Ambrose Bennett and 334 for transporting seven persons, including a Robert Coleman (Pat. Bk. 6, p181). The headright Robert Coleman may be the Nansemond Co. #18 Robert in the previous paragraph. Nansemond and Isle of Wight bordered each other. On 4 May 1670, he was granted 938 acres with William Ruffin on the western branch for
