THE CONDITION OF THIS OBLIGATION IS SUCH, That if the within bounden administrator of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits of Solomon Coleman deceased, do make, or cause to be made, a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits of the said deceased, which have, or shall come to the hands, possession, or knowledge of him the said Solomon Coleman or into the hands or possession of any other person or persons for time, and the same so made, do exhibit, or cause to be exhibited into the ordinary's office of this district, at or before the seventh day of December - next ensuing. And the same goods, chattels and credits, and all other the goods, chattels and credits of the said deceased, at the time of his death, which at any time hereafter shall come to the hands or possession

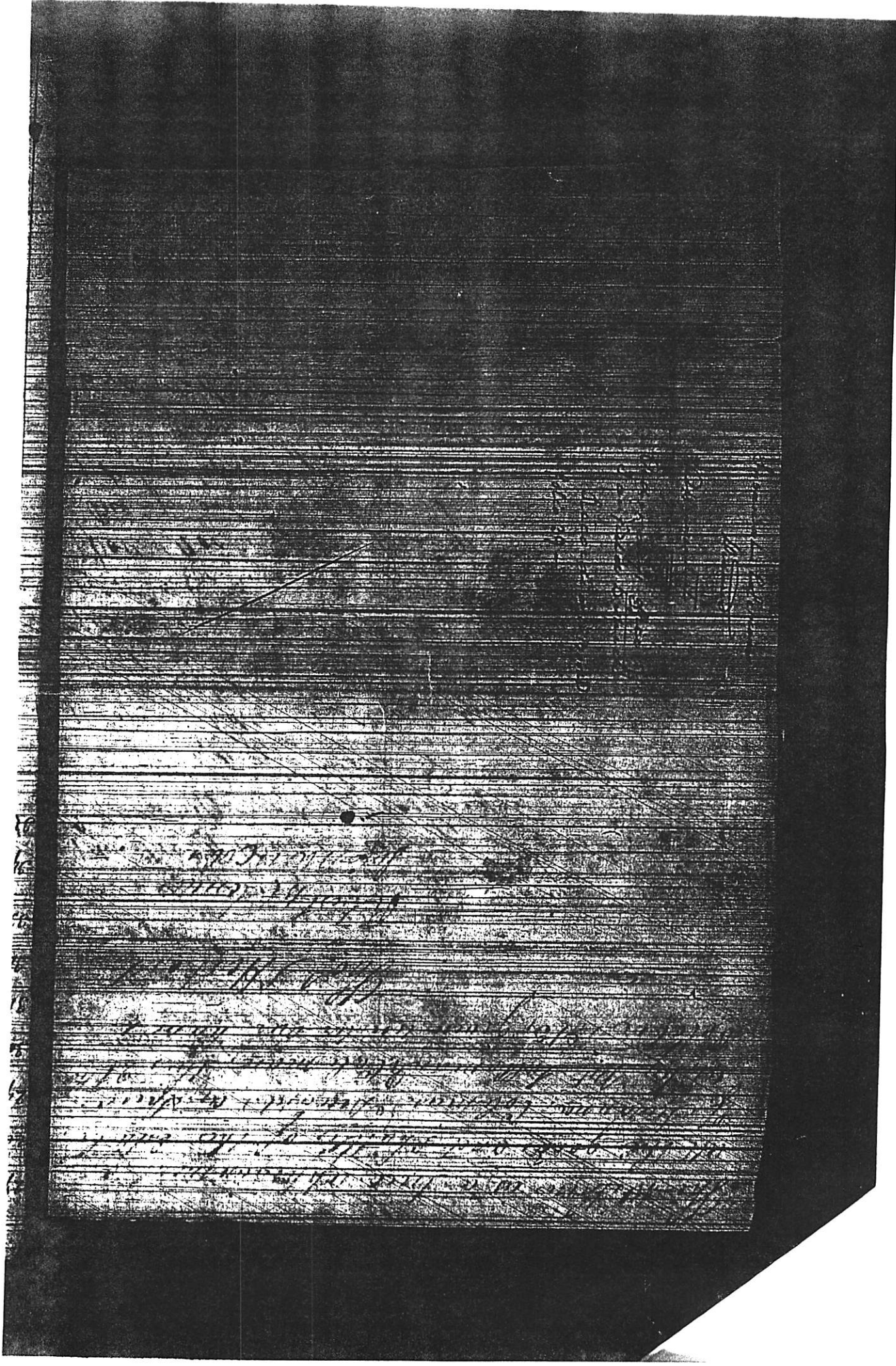
