

To which payment well and truly to be made, we bind ourselves, and every of us, our and every of our heirs, executors and administrators, for the whole, and in the whole, jointly and severally, firmly by these presents. Sealed with our seals, and dated the *Seventh* day of *October* in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and *ninety*.

THE CONDITION OF THIS OBLIGATION IS SUCH, That if the within bounden administrator of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits of *Susannah Colman* deceased, do make, or cause to be made, a true and perfect inventory of all and singular the goods, chattels and credits of the said deceased, which have, or shall come to the hands, possession, or knowledge of *him* the said *Solomon R. Colman*, or into the hands or into the possession of any other person or persons for *him* do well and truly administer according to law. And further, do make, or cause to be made, a true and just account of *his* administration, at or before the *whom duly appointed day of next*. And all the rest and residue of the said goods, chattels and credits which shall be found remaining on the said administrator's account (the same being first examined and allowed by the ordinary of this district for the time being) shall deliver and pay unto such person or persons respectively as the said ordinary, by his decree or sentence, pursuant to the true intent and meaning of the statutes and acts of assembly, of force in this state, for the better settling of intestates' estates, shall limit and appoint. And if it shall hereafter appear, that any last Will and Testament was made by the said deceased, and the executors or executors therein named do exhibit the same to the said ordinary, making request to have it allowed and approved accordingly, if the said *Solomon R.
