Your phone request is now number #2 of the 22 remaining request.

Thanks for your patience with us.

Apparently good news, the word must be out about us (see FYI below). However, we are still supplied by a volunteer staff.

As FYI: we use to get on average about 3 request per month, this past year our average was 20 request per month;

our walk-in visitors is up from January 2014, 110, to an average of 139 walk-ins per month in 2014, 226 last month;

out of state visitors is up from January 2014, 2, to an average of 14 out of state visitors per month, 16 last month, 12 today.

We would love to provide our services at no cost and hope to one day be able to provide this service.

However, at this time we are totally supported by volunteers and donations.

After speaking with you, Eddie, I wish to renew my request for help on my Coleman Line. I do realize how busy you all are! Please help me as you can, and I will also be working on the line at home.

Eddie and I agreed that we have some information to go on, but I really do want to get to the first Colemans of my line.

Beginning with James Buchanan Coleman's father, Charles Coleman b.1762 VA, occupation blacksmith, married before 1787 to Ruth Gibson, daughter of Abraham Gibson (had brother Rev. Jacob Gibson-Gibson's Meeting House, mentioned in Col. Winn's notes. Charles's first wife Elizabeth died 1825 (She was our ancestor), and he remarried 2nd time to Elizabeth (Eliza). There are conflictin places of our Charles Coleman's place of death... Fairfield Co or perhaps Alabama on 6 Apr.1842.

Charles Coleman's father, Kadar Coleman b.1736 Virginia m.5 Apr.1764 to Susannah Stephenson in Edgecombe Co. NC (I have a list of Kadar's sibblings. One was Robert IV who came to Fairfield/Camden Dist. with Kadar. Land records show that bro Robt. decided to go back to NC or VA and sold his property to Kadar. Those land records Robert Coleman III 's will , 1761, shows land he gave to his son Kadar (NC Archives SS 875/345 Will Book D p.276 , A p. 29) Kadar and Robt.IV must have sold land to come to Fairfield Co, since Robt II's land was divided among his wife and 12 children.
