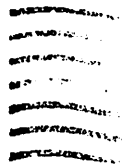

GREETINGS - We have been marching steadily (but slowly) toward recovery from the infirmities of Feb. and Mar. As we expected, the reduction of medication helped immensely. A vigorous exercise program has helped restore strength and a feeling of wellness. But it has also required a lot of time and energy, and we wonder if we will ever catch up with our correspondence and newsletter backlog. Thanks to our C* cousins for the many sincere letters of encouragement.

INTROSPECTION - In March we had to face the possibility of a required severe curtailment in activities. At that time it seemed probable that at least one of our two newsletters would have to be concluded (the other is *Armstrong Bulletin Board*). A great deal of thought was put into deciding which one it would be. The Coleman newsletter has by far the larger number of subscribers and it would seem the logical one to try to save. But in spite of recent growth in subscribership, the participation has been dismal compared to that experienced in our *Armstrong* newsletter. A prominent symptom of the problem is the "no prior query" statement following so many queries in this issue. What this means is that a majority of our long-time researchers are simply no longer participating. Our health crisis is moderating, and we hope to be able to continue *both* newsletters. But we must see more response and participation or this whole CW effort will begin to seem futile.

C*s IN THE NEWS - This valuable feature has appeared faithfully in the last 7 issues. But Cris Coleman reports that there are virtually no contributions of items and he has to dig out all the material himself on his few precious trips to the library. This problem seems to be of the same nature as discussed above. Please help continue the column. Glean those C* items out of the periodicals you read and send them to Cris.

LIBRARY BAD NEWS - We have been attempting to place a *free* CW subscription in at least one significant archival repository for each state that has substantial C* historical background. In accepting our offer, most libraries have sent statements expressing sincere gratitude. Yet, our 1989 offers of *free* subscriptions produced *no response at all* from the AL Dept. of Archives and the NC State Library. But such disappointment is mild compared with our experience with TN. In Dec. 1991 we received a letter from the Director of Technical Services for the TN State Library and Archives *declining* our offer! Our offering letter was returned together with all the enclosures (CW 91-4, the latest issue of our *Armstrong* newsletter, and a copy of our current library mailing label list). Any TN researcher wishing to pursue this matter further should write to the Editor for a copy of the correspondence.

LIBRARY GOOD NEWS - We are pleased to report that IN has been added to the list of states receiving complimentary subscriptions. All issues of CW can be seen at the Allen Co. Public Library at 900 Webster St., Fort Wayne, IN. Also, the Virginia State Library and Archives at 12th and Capitol Streets in Richmond, VA will be receiving a subscription and back issues.

ANOTHER CENSUS MAP - This issue presents a census map for 1840 AL. Prior census map offerings were: 1850 IL (91-4), 1850 IN (92-1), 1850 IA (89-3), 1850 KY (90-2), 1850 NC (89-4 with update 90-1), and 1850 SC (89-1). Michael and family later relocated to Mt. Pleasant,
Providence Co., RI. Michael d. in 1928 at age 60. Since
he came from Ireland as a young boy or man, the
immigration of this family probably took place in the
1870s or 80s.

Living nearby was Wilie (Wylie) C*, b. Mar. 9, 1783, son of Charles C* and Mary ROUNDTREE who had moved from Edgecombe Co., NC to Greene Co., AL c.1818. Wilie had mrd. Martha COBB, b. Sept. 14, 1793, dau. of James Cobb and Martha Penelope Ethridge Butts. Their children were: Theresa, b. 1809. d. 1850, mrd. 1824 to David N. BOYD; Roda, b. c.1810, mrd. 1826 to Louis CANMACK; Penelope, b. c.1810, mrd. George Hays CARNATHAN; Sarah, b. Apr. 10, 1812; John Bestor, b. 1814; Mary, b. 1816, mrd. Col. Jacob MAYBERRY; Robert E., b. 1818 in Edgecombe Co., NC, mrd. 1838 Rebecca E. ALFORD; Martha Ann, b. c.1820, mrd. MC GEE; and Wilie J., b. 1822; mrd. Caroline Virginia CHANEY. Wilie C* d. Among a group who migrated from CT to OH were William (II) and Ruth (Mason) HILDRETH, and Ebenezer and Lucy Hildreth C*. William and Lucy were brother and sister. Their mother, Joanna (Chalker) Hildreth, a widow, was also with the group and is buried in Miller Twp. Chapt. 7 deals with the C* family of Knox Co. and directly back to Thomas C* of Wethersfield, Hartford Co., CT, and Hadley, Hampshire Co., MA. I am trying to find information on my father, Richard C* who d. in MD in 1961. When he registered for social security in 1936 he listed his parents as David C* and Adelia COOPER and that he was b. Sept. 12, 1901, in Everett (possibly MA). Sometimes he used Everett as a middle name. He was buried at Forest Glen Cemetery of St. John the Evangelist Catholic Church, Silver

Spring, MD. Cemetery records state that his burial plot was paid for *after his death* by a Mrs. David Coleman, however, there are no further details about her. She was not a member of the church nor listed in any area directory of the period. Richard C* lived in NYC from at least 1936 to 1945, when he moved to the Washington, DC area, where he mrd. Helen ANGELO (she d. in 1983). He apparently had been in the Army, but his discharge certificate seems to be an altered copy of one issued to Andrew MC MANUS who had enlisted Aug. 26, 1918; further research shows Andrew was b. in Ireland, grew up in Jamaica Plains near Boston. Among the few items in Richard C*'s foot locker was a vintage army uniform in which he had been photographed. But a serial number on the uniform was traced in army records to that of James J. Mc Manus, enlisted NYC June 5, 1917; died in FL in 1978. Also in the foot locker was an envelope postmarked NYC Mar. 18, 1936 and addressed to Richard Coleman c/o Albert CALDERON, 217 N. Alabama St., Indianapolis, IN. Will appreciate any help and suggestions for further search.

VA 1831). They had 5 children, the first of which was John Hiram C*, b. Dec. 12, 1849 at Cumberland, Alleghany Co., MD.

There were 3 other boys and a girl but their identities are unknown. Jesse Hiram C* d. in 1857 - he went down with his ship. Margaret Kelly C* d. in 1859. He mrd. 2nd. Persis TUFTS. I have very vague information from two sources that John's father, also named John, arrived in MA from England in the late 17th century, with two or three children, but no wife. I do know that his father died while John was quite young. One source thought that the father drowned in Boston Harbor. Any help would be greatly appreciated. I have a great deal of information on allied lines, which I would be more than happy to share. (R# 312, no prior query)

MORE ON TUCKER/C* CONNECTION

Issue 91-4 included an article asking, *Was Coleman Tucker a C* Descendant?* I found many more clues in two books.

1) There are many C*/TUCKER entries to be found in *The Robert Coleman Family - From Virginia to Texas*, by J. P. Coleman (see obituary, p.1 in 91-4):

The will of Robert C*, Jr., "weak and helpless" in 1721, gave his estate to Robert Tucker, Sr.

The 1744 will of Robert Tucker of Amelia Co., VA, names his son, Robert Tucker as executor, wife Martha, sons Daniel, Joseph, and dau. Sarah CLAY.

Frances C*, dau. of William C* of Amelia Co. mrd. Robert Tucker. Their dau. Martha was b. Mar. 6, 1727 by church record in Prince George Co., VA.

On Dec. 24, 1753, R. (Robert) Tucker was one of the witnesses of the inventory of Godfrey C*, dec'd., brother of Frances along with Peter C*, another brother.

Will of Robert Tucker of Amelia Co. written Dec. 8, 1768, probated May 25, 1869, witness Jesse C*, executor son William Tucker; names wife Frances, son Godfrey, William, Robert, Daniel and daus. Martha

SMITH, Frances CROWDER, and Rachel OLD. No mention of a Coleman Tucker so far. Frances, Jr. was b. 1730 in Prince George Co. and mrd. Abraham Crowder, Jr. They named a son Godfrey Crowder.

2) In Dinwiddie Co., VA Data by Hughes, probable kinships from co. tax rolls, p.129: 1788-90 and 1792, Robert Tucker, Coleman and Stith Tucker. This must be Robert III, son of Robert and Frances, and Coleman and Stith must be sons (grandsons of Robert and Frances).

We are two sisters and a brother who have researched our C* line for over 10 years. We have visited cemeteries, courthouses, libraries, and have contacted hundreds of individuals throughout the South. Our goal is to clarify the early segment of our family and establish the relationship to other, more fully defined early C* lines.

Although much valuable data have been gathered, we now face the problem of determining the parentage of our 3rd great grandparents. This problem might not exist if: (1) The C* family Bible had not been destroyed in a home fire in 1924; (2) British soldiers had not burned the 1810 census records in Washington during the War of 1812; and (3) Sherman's soldiers had not been so careless with matches in GA in 1864. Despite these misfortunes, we could, with a little luck, break through and pull in our early line, including perhaps, the immigrant ancestor. Indications are that most C* lines descend from a few families that came to VA in the mid-to-late 1600s from southern England.

Our parents were Coby C. C* (1882-1944) and Fannie Mae GOODWIN (1891-1974). Our grandparents in this line were Thomas LIVINGSTON C* (1847-1920) and Amanda Jane CANTERBURY (1848-1911). Great grandparents were Abraham WOMACK C* (1803-1868) and Mary RINGGOLD (1805-1881). The Ringgolds were early settlers and landowners in the Chesapeake Bay area of MD.

Mary's maiden name of Ringgold has not been fully verified. Strong evidence exists that she was, indeed, a Ringgold. Thomas Livingston C* (the youngest son of Abraham and Mary) named one of his sons Guy Ringgold C*. And Coby C. C* named one of his sons likewise. In 1941 the latter's wife, Fannie Mae C* remembered the name Ringgold as the maiden name of the mother of Thomas Livingston C*. Mary is believed to be the dau. of Richard Ringgold who mrd. Isabel Frances Livingston. Both the names Livingston and Ringgold were introduced into the C* line as given names.

As we began to develop our C* line, information was received on at least three DAR records which stated that Abraham Womack C*'s parents were Benjamin Stephen C* (1775-1815) and Elizabeth WOMACK

(1785-1853). Benjamin Stephen C* was listed as the son of Benjamin Andrew C* (1746-1813) and Elizabeth GOODMAN (1742-1775) of Lenoir Co., NC. Believing in the sanctity of DAR records, we accepted these claims as fact, until another turn of events began to raise doubts. Family tradition held that Benjamin Stephen C* d. in Jasper Co., GA at age 40, leaving eight children. Jasper Co. records yielded no trace of Benjamin Stephen C*. Moreover, Benjamin Andrew C* and his wife Elizabeth Goodman were listed on DAR records as having children, besides Benjamin Stephen -- Francis, Isaiah, Abner, Elizabeth, Shelley and Sarah. None of these names can be verified in census records as belonging to the family of Benjamin Andrew C* and Elizabeth Goodman. In fact, the census never includes the middle name Andrew, nor do the NC Revolutionary War records. It shows up only in old family letters and DAR records.

Elizabeth Womack C* mrd. twice after the death of Benjamin Stephen C*: (1) Thomas H. LANGHAM; and (2) Enoch STRINGFELLOW. Elizabeth d. in 1853 and is buried in Hale Co., AL (Hale Co. was formed in 1867 from portions of Greene, Marengo, Perry and Tuscaloosa Cos.). Francis C* of Washington Co., AL (b. 1744) died in 1824, his son, Benjamin having predeceased him in 1815. Benjamin's children were awarded his portion of Francis C*'s estate. Could it be that the DAR records had mistakenly attached Benjamin as the son of Benjamin Andrew C* of NC when he actually was the son of Francis C* (1744-1824)?

Family traditions together with old papers and letters indicate that both Benjamin Andrew C* and Francis C* were b. in VA. Records show that Benjamin Andrew C* lived and died in NC. Records prove that Francis C* lived in SC and GA before crossing Indian territory to settle in an area that was later to become Washington Co., AL. Francis C* d. in Washington Co. in 1824. From the ages and similarity of the name patterns in the families of Benjamin and Francis, it is quite possible that they were brothers. They both took part in the Revolutionary War. Then there is William C* of NC who made his will in Anson Co., NC in 1750. An old paper states that two of William C*'s children married children of Benjamin Andrew C*, indicating that they were cousins.

If anyone has information or theories relating to this C* puzzle, please write Mrs. Mary Coleman Stewart, 5774 Calmar Dr., Montgomery, AL 36110. Editor's note - We are also caught up in this dilemma, and are very busy trying to prove descent from one of the other sons of the above-mentioned William C*.

The following research was inspired by query 072 (Issue 87-3, p.9a) which sought information on the Thomas C* who d. in Maury Co., TN in 1826. The following information was gleaned from two sources: *Roster of Members and Ancestors of the TN DAR*, p.474; and also from, *Source Records from the DAR Magazine, 1947-1950*, edited by Katie-Prince, W. Esker, Genealogical

Publishing Co., Baltimore, 1975:

The parents of Thomas C*, Jr. were Col. Thomas C*, Sr. (1738-1810) and his wife, Elizabeth CAMPBELL. They were both of Gloucester Co., VA. Their children were: 1) Lucy, mrd. William FALKNER, or FULKS. 2) Richard, mrd. Lucy SYDNOR. 3) Elizabeth "Betty," mrd. Benjamin ROUTH or ROUTT. 4) Thomas, see following. 5) Robert. 6) Sarah, mrd. Thomas WALKER. 7) James. 8) Mary, mrd. Oliver STOTT.

No. 1), Thomas C*, Jr. of Gloucester Co., VA was b. June 30, 1770, and d. 1826 and buried at Williamsport, Maury Co., TN. He mrd. Clarissa WHITE, b. Jan. 22, 1777. Their marriage probably took place at Salisbury, Rowan Co., NC in 1789. Clarissa was the dau. of William White who was the son of Moses and Mary (McConnell) White, Jr. of Rowan Co. The will of Moses White, Jr. was proven on Nov. 9, 1786. See Rowan Co. Wills, 1743-1868, Vol. 23, p.78.

The following is a deed which transfers to Oliver and Mary C* Stott, title of land once owned by Col. Thomas C*, Sr. It is from *An-Searching News*, Oct.-Nov. 1980, Vol. 17, p. 180:

Deed dated Jan. 1812 and recorded on Feb. 3, 1812 in Richmond Co., VA, Deed Book #19, pages 161-163 --

Thomas and Sarah (C*) Walker of Northumberland co., VA; Thomas C*, Jr. of TN; Robert C* of KY; James C* of KY; and the heirs of Lucy (C*) Fulks, deceased; to wit: Nancy Fulks, John Fulks, Charles Fulks and William Fulks by Charles Fulks, his guardian, of Northumberland Co., VA to Oliver Stott of Richmond Co., VA, whose wife, Mary (C*) Stott is one of the legatees of Col. Thomas C*, Sr., deceased. Consideration is \$523.50 current VA money.

Being the said land whereon the said Col. Thomas C*, (Sr.) dec. last resided and being in Farnham Parish, Richmond Co., VA. Containing 182 acres, more or less, and bounded by the lands of William ELMORE, George CONNALLY and William FORRESTER. The witnesses are: John BRYANT, William Bryant, Joseph ALEXANDER, John Alexander, Richard Routt, and Luke HANKS.

Now for some questions: Look back over the list of children of Col. Thomas C* and wife Elizabeth (Campbell) C*. Why is there no mention in the deed of Richard C* or his wife, Lucy (Sydnor) C*, or their child, Elizabeth Sydnor C*? Yes, they *could* have been all dead by 1812. But what about Betty C* and her husband, Benjamin Routh/Routt? Incidentally, note that one of the witnesses is Richard Routt.

Another possible cross connection: A John Routt mrd. in 1713 Winifred Sydnor, dau. of Anthony and Elizabeth (Dew) Sydnor. This is from *The Dameron-Dameron Genealogy*, Part I, page 176, by Helen Foster Snow, 1954.

BIOGRAPHIES FROM COUNTY HISTORIES

Warren Co. KY

This biography was written for History of Bowling Green, KY by Betty Tomlinson, R# 606, 416 Kane Ave., #1, Mt. Henry, IL 60050. The printed version contained several errors which Betty has corrected here.

Thomas C* (1754-1821) was b. in Spottsylvania Co., VA, the son of Edward C* (c.1720 - c.1794). Thomas mrd. Lucretia WAGGONER and had: Henry (1744-1808, mrd. Mary HUTCHERSON; Robert Edward (1748-1843), mrd. Catherine ROBINSON; James (1750-1834), mrd. Sarah TAYLOR; Thomas (1754-1821), mrd. 1st Nancy PEMBERTON, 2nd Nancy POLLY BALLARD in 1813 at Warren Co., KY, John, mrd. Hannah Hutcherson; William, mrd. Sarah Hutcherson; Phoebe, mrd. John Hutcherson; and Catherine, mrd. Ruben Waggoner.

Thomas C* mrd. 1st Nancy Pemberton (1768-1811), dau. of William and Elizabeth (Vaughn) Pemberton. Children were: William, mrd. Nancy WEBB; John, mrd. Mary RANDALL; Benjamin; Daniel, mrd. Harriet KIRBY; Larkin, mrd. Jane BREEDLOVE; Thomas; Betsy, mrd. Michael FRAKER, Sr.; Mary Ann "Polly," mrd. Enos ALLEN; Margaret "Peggy," mrd. 1st THALES, 2nd D.T. MORRISON; and Nancy mrd. James WEATHERSPOON.

Thomas and his family arrived in Warren Co., KY in 1808, settling on Bays Fork Creek, part of which became Allen Co., KY. Thomas mrd. 2nd Nancy BALLARD.

Larkin C* (1801-1861) mrd. Aug. 16, 1824 to Jane Breedlove, dau. William and Mary (Watts) Breedlove of Simpson Co., KY. They had 10 children: James Pemberton; Melcina mrd. DEMPSEY; Mary, mrd. Weatherspoon; Thomas; Elizabeth, mrd. 1st LIVELY, 2nd PENNER; Drusilla, mrd. Lively; Charles; Robert;

Lucy Ann; and Tula Frances WRAY.

James Pemberton C* (1826-1888) lived and d. in Bowling Green. He was postmaster, grocer, steamboatman, and judge. Family tradition says he was mayor of Bowling Green. He mrd. in 1855 Fanny Elizabeth REESE, dau. of Isaac and Angeline (Roberts) Reese. James and Fanny raised Reese children Mary and Isaac, Jr. along with their own children: Ida, mrd. Charles Munkle; Frank; Harry; Hallie, mrd. SLEMMONS; Florence, mrd. GARRISON; Mary, mrd. GREGORY; Willie; and Wilson. James probably worked for Fanny's uncle, Edwin T. Roberts as steamboat captain, and in 1861, during the Civil War, moved his family to Evansville where Hallie was born. One of the children of Charles and Ida Munkle was Corrine (1855-1953) who mrd. Edgar F. BROWN. They were the parents of Elizabeth Tomlinson. [more detail on latter generations is included in original]

Bradford Co., PA

This biography is from *Pioneer and Patriot Families of Bradford Co., PA 1700 - 1800* by Clement F. Heverly, pub. 1913. It was submitted by Mrs. Clark Coleman, R# 670, P.O. Box 4572, Charlottesville, VA 22905. She found it in the University of VA Library. She says, "I have only non-C* surname objectives in Bradford Co., PA, but will be happy to help any C* researcher interested in this locality."

The C*s were from Litchfield Co., CT. It is claimed that as early as 1791 a Mr. C*, who had served as sheriff of Litchfield Co., CT was living at or near Browntown. He had at least four children: 1) Darius was a noted hunter, settled in Susquehanna Co., PA. He had 3 sons and 9 daus. 2) Elijah was the pioneer chimney builder. He mrd. Millie SHIPPY and d. in Pike Twp. c.1812. 3) Sarah mrd. a Mr. BROWNING. 4) Reuben mrd. Jane SCOTT and settled in Pike Twp. It is said that Reuben built the second house on Rockwell creek, and that he and his sons cleared more land than any other family in Pike. They had 13 children.

Editor's note - See the extensive history of this C* line in *Ancestry of John Worden C** appearing in issues 89-1, 89-2 and 89-3. The line is traced from Thomas C*, the 1635 New England immigrant ancestor. The PA branches are included and much detail is given for the family of Reuben C*.

♦ Will Beneficiaries - p.122, Willis ALLEN, 1815-1871, son of James Allen and Jane C*. He mrd. 1st Mary Ann MEREDITH; 2nd Sara Rebecca Meredith. Heirs: John, mrd. Rosebud KING; Wyatt, mrd. Mary Louise King; Jane, mrd. G.O.A. DAUGHTRY; James, mrd. Lilla King; and Sara, mrd. 1st F. E. SHEPHERD, and 2nd John King.

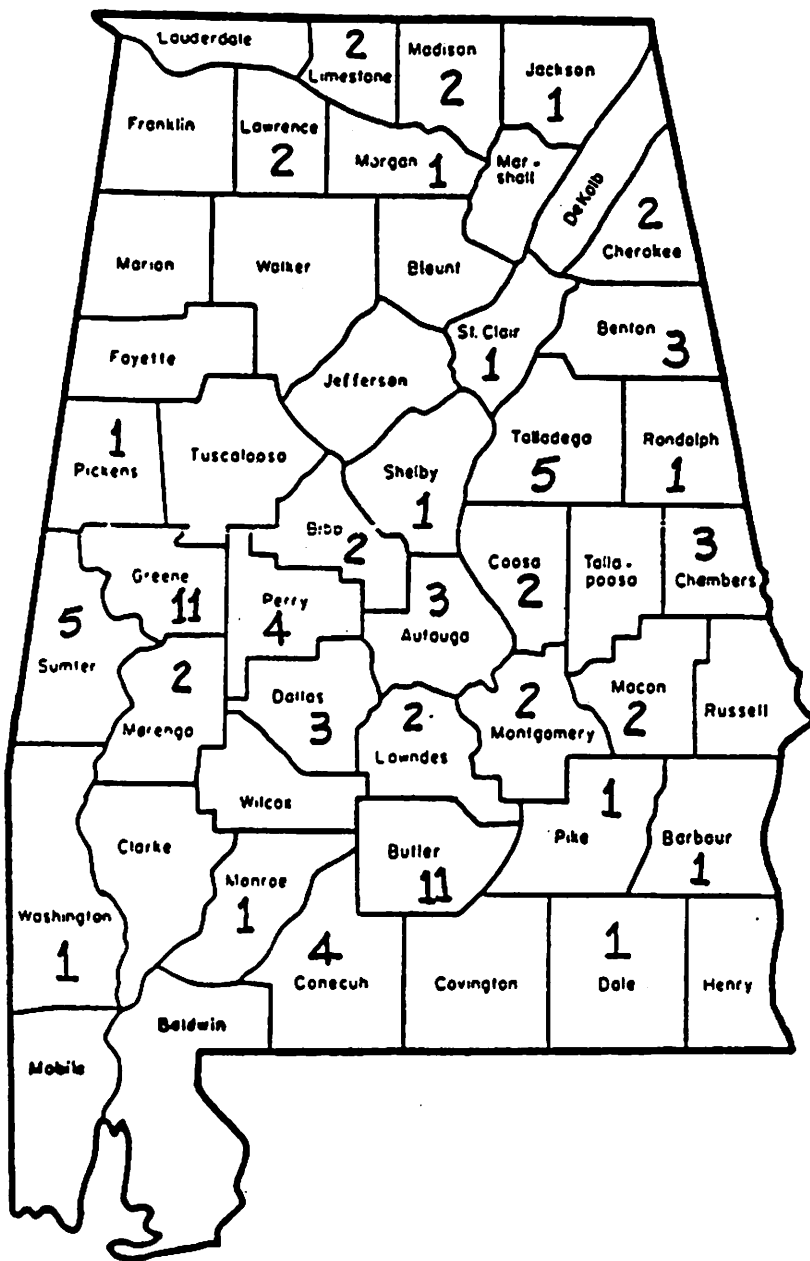
