DAVID ANDREW COLEMAN

David Andrew Coleman, the first child of Henry Alexander and Chanie Feaster Coleman, was born September 16, 1823, and died December 15, 1863. He died of pneumonia and is buried in the Yongue cemetery.

On August 29, 1848, he was married to Sarah Ann Yongue. There were born to them seven children, two of which died young.

Altho David lived only forty years he accomplished many things and lived a most busy and useful life. He was truly a remarkable person, living life to its fullest.

Grandfather David and grandmother Sarah Ann lived at "Panks Old Field," the present home of his grandchildren Betty, Annie, and James Coleman.

He was a farmer and school teacher. It might be fitting to add here that his daughter, Chanie, was also a teacher, and that it was probably through her inspiration that twelve of his thirteen granddaughters became teachers. He was a student of Latin and Greek. His Greek books are still in his old home. "Daddy Dave," his grandfather, tells in his diary that his grandson, David, had been over teaching him Greek. Among David's collection of books there is a leather bound copy of the Autobiography of Benjamin Franklin inscribed "To my grandson David on his fifth birthday." Grandfather was really inspiring little David at an early age!

Even tho much of David's time was taken up with farming he always found time to visit his relatives and friends and to enjoy the parties, "infairs," and other socials typical of his day.

He was a staunch believer in temperance and was an active member of the "Sons of Temperance Division." He was a regular church attendant and visited all the churches in the surrounding communities.

When the Civil War came on he was enlisted in Company H Sixth South Carolina Infantry. On account of a physical handicap, one leg being a little shorter than the other, he was retained as a Home Guard. During the winter of 1863 while helping to nurse his brother, John A. F. Coleman, who was home from the Army on sick leave, David developed pneumonia which caused his death. The trundle bed (pulled up in front of the fire) on which he died is now being used by two of his little great great granddaughters, Janet and Mary Coleman. HL"N 311

A CERTAIN CURE FOR SCROFULA

Put on 2 oz of acafortis on a plate on which you have two copper cents. Let it remain from 18 to 24 hrs. Then add 4 oz. of clear strong vinegar. Fut cents and all in a large mouthed bottle and keep it corked. Begin by putting 11 drops in a teaspoon full of rainwater and apply it to the sore. Make the application three times a day with a soft hair pencil or made of soft rags. If very painful put more water. As the sore heals apply it weaker.
