

OBITUARY

MR. RAYMOND COLEMAN

WHITE, a son of the late Mr. Mack and Mrs. Mary White, was born in Albany, New York. After the demise of parents, he was raised by his late aunt, Mrs. Phyllis Robinson of Mt. Pleasant, South Carolina. Mr. White died November 2, 1994 at Richland Memorial Hospital after an extended illness.

He was an honor graduate of Laing High School in Mt. Pleasant, South Carolina. He received his B. S.

Degree in Biochemistry from Allen University, Columbia, South Carolina, Masters Degree in Supervision and Administration from Atlanta University, Atlanta, Georgia and attended School of Law (2 years) at S. C. State University, Orangeburg, South Carolina.

He was a member of Emanuel A. M. E. Church. He is the author of two publications entitled "Twice in Jeopardy, But Not Guilty" and "The Purpose of Life." He served in the United States Army and retired after twenty-one years of service as a Medical Technician at Ft. Jackson, South Carolina. Additionally, he worked in the field of security in a number of places including Benedict College.

He was the youngest at the time to receive 33rd Degree Mason. He was a founding member of the Columbia Alumni Chapter of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity. He was also very active with Palmetto Elks Lodge #342. Locally he served as assistant secretary and past president of Purple Cross Nurses. Statewide, he organized Purple Cross Unit of S. C. Nationally he was Grand Statistician of Health Department of LB.P O.E. of W. He was State Director of Workshops for S. C. - Elks, Lecturer and Public Speaker. Licensed Paramedic by the State Board of S. C. and member of Columbia Committee appointed by Mayor Bob Coble.

Survivors include his wife, Mrs. Sara C. White; a daughter, Mrs. Raynette Cromartie; a son-in-law, Atty. and City Councilman E. W. Cromartie II; two grandchildren, Ernest W.
