Life I do therefore make and ordaine this my present Last will and Testament in  
Manner and form Following, that is to say first and Principally I commend my soul  
into the hands of Almighty God, hoping through the Merits death and Passion of my  
Saviour Jesus Christ to full Pardon and forgiveness of all my Sins and to inherit Ever-  
lasting Life, and my body I Commit to the Earth to be decently buried at the dis-  
cretion of my Executor - Named or Otherwise as Providence shall order it, and as  
touching the disposal of all such Temporal Estate as hath Pleas'd God to bestow upon  
me I give and dispose of, as Followeth first I will that all my debts be paid and  
Funeral Charges be discharged IEM I lend unto Amelia Gwin one hundred acres of  
Land lying in the County aforesaid on a branch of Seven Creek granted by his Excellency  
Benjamin Guerard the fifth day of Oct. 1734 During her natural life and after her  
Decease I Give unto her son Jesse Gwin of his heirs & Them I Give and Bequeath  
unto Amelia Gwin one Feather Bed, bed Head & Furniture one Cotton wheale and Cards  
one Linen Wheale, one Large Chest, one Iron pot & Skillet one half dozen Pewter Plates  
one half of my Cotton and all my flax one Large Black Sive & Seven (7) Seven  
hundred lb of hellebore Pot, ten Barrels of Corn, her Choice of two of my Cows and  
one haifer she called own I also Give unto her my little Sorel Mare I also will that  
My Manna plantation be tilled or leased out for four years after my Decease and  
the money that may arise thereof to be Appropriated to the Support of Amelia Gwin  
And her Children at the Discretion of my Executor, IEM I Give & Bequeath unto  
my Son Isaac Mobley of the County aforesaid two hundred acres of Land known by the  
Name of Welches fork of Sandy River to him and his heirs butyke should die without  
issue that it is my will and Desire that his Legacy to be Equally Divided Between  
his three Sisters Sarah Coleman, Nancy Coleman, and Vastee Coleman or any them that  
may be Surviving I also Give unto Isaac Mobley one Sorel Colt known by the Name of

 Feather bed, Bed Head & furniture, one Linnen Wheale and one Cotton Wheale and  
 Covered trunk and my Loom, Lastly it is my Will and desire that after  
 Decease that all the Rest of my Stock of horses Cattle and hogs not before mentioned  
 be collected; Together with my Smiths Tools one Shot Gun two Puffle, Guns one Tea  
 Chest, bed Head and furniture and the Rest of my house hold Goods and Chattels to  
 named with all my Plantation Tools and (Whitcomb) thereunto belonging of every  
 Whatsoever also Ninety two Acres of Land adjoining my manner plantation and Dan  
 may be sold to the best Advantage as my Executor may think proper, and the  
 my Estate may be collected as soon as possible and added to the money that may  
 from my sale and my Executor to make use of the money to the best Advantage for  
 of my four Children Isaac, Nancy, Sarah & Charles Coleman as  
 be an equal Division made among them of the money in the hands of my Executor,  
 either of the aforesaid four Children should die before the time to the age of Maturity  
 it is my Desire that their Legacy or Legacies be Decided by their surviving  
 I do hereby constitute and appoint Charles Coleman my full & Sole Executor of this
