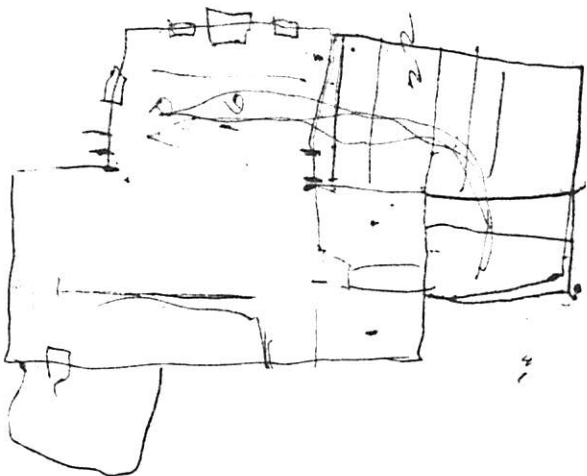

SURFACE SERVICE. Second Class (no weight limit) Newspapers, magazines, periodicals, containing notice of second class entry, 2c for first 2 ozs. and 1c for each additional oz. or fourth-class rate, whichever is lower.

Third class (limit - up to but not including 16 ozs.) Miscellaneous printed matter, merchandise, 3c for the first 2 ozs. and 1 1/2c for each additional oz. Books (including catalogs) of 24 pages or more (at least 22 of which are printed), seeds, and plants, 3c for the first 2 ozs. and 1 1/2c for each additional oz. or fraction.

Identical pieces of third-class matter may be mailed under permit in bulk lots of not less than either 20 pounds or 200 pieces, at the rate of 14 cents a pound, in case of miscellaneous printed matter, and merchandise, and 19 cents a pound, in the case of books or catalogs having 24 pages or more, seeds, plants, etc., with a minimum charge of 1 1/2c a piece in either case. Bulk mailing permit fee is \$20 per year. Minimum charge for pieces of odd size, 6 cents.

Fourth class or Parcel Post (16 ozs. or over) Limit of weight and size: Parcels mailed at a first class post office for delivery at another first class post office in Continental United States - 40 pounds, local, first and second zones; 20 pounds third through eighth zones. Not over 72 inches length and girth combined. Parcels mailed at, or addressed for delivery to any second, third or fourth-class post office or to or from any territory or possession of the United States - 70 pounds. Not over 100 inches length and girth combined.

Merchandise, books, printed matter, and all other mailable matter not in first or second class.

Fourth-class matter may be sealed provided it bears an endorsement "May be opened for postal inspection."

Certified Mail Provides for a receipt to the sender and a record of delivery at the office of address. No record is kept at the office where mailed. It is handled in the ordinary mails and no insurance coverage is provided.

Class of Mail to Which Applicable. Any mailable matter of no intrinsic value on which postage at the first-class rate has been paid will be accepted as certified mail. This does not exclude articles of a nonnegotiable character and other matter which would involve a cost of duplication if lost or destroyed. The mail may be sent by air on payment of the required postage. Return receipt service requested at the time of mailing only, and special delivery service are available on payment of the prescribed fees.
