N. B. - The record of Robert Coleman above so far as I know is that he was of Welch descent. He moved from Virginia to North Carolina, was one of a large family, had a brother William, the father of E Solomon Coleman; and Charles, another brother, was the father of Nancy and Sallie Coleman. The former married Robert (her cousin), son of the Robert above; and Sallie, his son Allen.

NOTE: Bible containing above record was property of David Roe Coleman, oldest son above. Is now in possession of family of Mrs. Mary Feaster Coleman Faucette, RFD, Blairs, S. C.

1. David Roe Coleman married Edith Beam Sept. 13, 1787. Lived and died in community where parents settled.
2. John Roe Coleman went to Greene County, Alabama. Know nothing of his descendants.
3. Robert Roe Coleman married Nancy Coleman, his first cousin. (Dtr of Charles Coleman and Polly Mobley). Lived near his brother, David Roe Coleman above.
4. Wiley Roe Coleman married Sarah Ragsdale. Lived and died near his brothers, Robert Roe and David Roe Coleman.
5. Allen Roe Coleman married Sarah (Sallie) Coleman, sister of Nancy Coleman. Died in Fairfield County.
6. Griffin Roe Coleman, perhaps born soon after parents came to South Carolina. Know nothing about him except that he went West, too. All these went to Alabama, then descendants on to Mississippi and Texas. So many descendants through there who know nothing of us here.
7. William Roe Coleman, married (don't know who). Went West with others.
8. Sarah Coleman married, Reuben Mobley. Went to Alabama. Know nothing further of her history.
9. Elizabeth went West with her brothers and sisters. Never heard from her history, except that she married.
10. Solomon Roe Coleman married daughter of Steven Coleman. Descendants went West. Know nothing of Steven's history.
11. Francis Roe Coleman married Margaret Mobley. He was the handsomest of all the Colemans of that time. Went to Greene County, Ala., I heard of him while there. All descendants gone from there.

His burial spot known, but no marker.

12. Zerebale, died young. Buried at foot of his parents.
13. Henry Jonathan, married Mary Feaster, daughter of John Feaster and
Brucilla Moberley.
14. Ancil Roe Coleman, died young.

Robert Coleman and Elisabeth Roe Coleman came to Fairfield County, South Carolina, in 1774 or 1775, from Halifax County, North Carolina.

The Colemans were from Wales, England, came first to Virginia, thence to Halifax County, N. C., and later to Fairfield County, South Carolina. The tradition is that they came from near Roanoke, or Roanoke River, Virginia.

Robert Coleman was a major in the British Army several years prior to the Revolutionary War.

Elisabeth Roe is said to have had to blood of the Indian princess, Pocahontas, in her veins. That consequently, the Roes were very dark of skin and hair; the Colemans, blondes.

Both are buried in the Coleman family cemetery, at Feasterville, Fairfield County, S. C., within a mile of where they settled, lived and died. The marker to their graves was placed through the efforts of Mrs. Jennie I. Coleman, who solicited and received contributions from descendants over a number of states. At the time, the date of his death was not known, and, therefore, was estimated as 1825. Later, his will was found, dated in 1809, and recorded in 1811, proving 1811 as the date of his death.

Robert Coleman was a hatter by trade, and in his will he requests that his youngest living son, Henry Jonathan Coleman, follow the same trade, with one of his brothers. He did this, and a field on his place is still known as "Hatter's Field."

Robert Coleman's lands lay north of the Moberleys and Wagners, on north side of Beaver Creek.

Book 1.

Descendants of DAVID ROE COLEMAN and Edith Beam.

David Roe Coleman was born May 19, 1765, in Halifax County, N. C., and died March 25, 1855, in Fairfield District, S. C. He married September 13, 1787, in Fairfield County, S. C., Edith Beam, daughter of Albert Beam and Sallie Halsell. Edith Beam died April 28, 1825, aged 60 years. Both are buried at the Coleman family cemetery, Feasterville, Fairfield County, S. C.

David Roe Coleman was affectionately known to his children, grandchildren, and all the younger generation, as "Daddy Dave." His house stood about the middle of what is called the "Daddy Field", not far west of the Long Leaf Pine that he planted, bringing it from somewhere between Columbia and Charleston, the first one ever known in this part of the country, and considered a great curiosity in his day. (NOTE: This tree was deliberately killed by negro tenants on the place about 1946, they having cut chips entirely around the body of the tree, causing it to die at the age of more than 100 years of age.)

He divided his possessions among his children as they married and settled, trying to make it equal in every way, and said he did so to prevent any trouble after his death, as he was never in court, and he never wanted any of them to resort to it. They never did, neither sons, grandsons, nor great-grandsons, so far as we know.

His house was moved in 1867 and rebuilt for a home for Henry J. Coleman, Jr. (his nephew), and was still standing in 1900. The main body was of hewn logs. All the houses then were made that way, and all much alike. His brothers, Robert Roe and Allen Roe, settled near and had houses made the same way. That of Robert is still in a good state of preservation (1900), somewhat changed in style. Has a splendid chimney and fire place! Meals for the family and numerous slaves were cooked there.

It was a curiosity for the children of later days.

Wells were unknown then, and the old settlements were all near a good spring. The "Daddy Spring" is fine, giving freely of its good water for over one hundred years. A good corn and wheat mill was built near it in 1867, using the spring water to run the engine. 'Twas a great success for years, owned and carried on by Colemans. After changing hands, it gradually went down and now there is no sign of it (the mill).

"David Roe Coleman was a remarkable man in the early history of Fairfield. He was a surveyor, a humane slave owner, an affectionate husband and father — a useful citizen. To quote Dryden, he was "One of God Almighty's gentlemen." It was his son, Robert Fitz Coleman, who first allied his family with the Mobleys and Feasters." — THE MOBLEYS AND THEIR CONNECTIONS, by W. W. Dixon.

The Probate Court records in Winnsboro, S. C., will show in many places the signature of D. R. Coleman, as a J. P. (Justice of the Peace.)

NOTE made by David Roe Coleman, Sr., June 2nd, 1864:

"My cousin, David Giles Thomas, of the State of Alabama, left for home this morning. He is the son of Athanasious Thomas and his wife, Sarah Crosby, late of South Carolina. April 27, 1854, David Giles Thomas, the son of Athanasious and his wife, Sarah Crosby. My cousin Mary, the daughter of John Roe, of Halifax, North Carolina, Remcoak. John Roe died on Sandy River, in Chester County, in the year 1780, of the smallpox. (Signed) D. R. Coleman." June the 2nd day 18⁵64." Original of note in possession of Miss Julia Faucette, RFD, Blair, S. C.

Letter written by David Roe Coleman to his son, Wilson, of Greene County,
Alabama;

"South Carolina, Fairfield District, June 27, 1835.

Dear Son:

I take the present favorable opportunity to write to you a line in way of remembrance, as I have not had a letter from you for a great while, and inform you that your Father is still living and in good health. (Blessed be God for his mercies). Hoping that you and your family are well. I believe I have not wrote to you since the death of your brother Wiley. His widdow and children are well, and I think are likely to do well. They are very industrious and your namesake, Wilson, is much so. Wiley had but a very short sickness, from Thursday until Tuesday. He was doing very well. I think it was the excessive cold was the cause of his death. I am certain I have never experienced so cold a winter. Our wheat crops are greatly injured, and great many entirely ruined. All the fig trees and chaney trees are killed. The figs will spring up again, but the chaney will not. Our prospects for corn and cotton is very good at this time. The seasons have been very good so far. Your brothers and their families are all well except Chany, Henry's wife. She has had a long spell of sickness that has seemed to threaten insanity, but is getting better. Isabella and her family are well. We expect Isaac and Betty to see us in July. They were all well when we last heard from them. I am in the 71st year of my age. I am nearly as strong as I ever was, but not so active. I take a great deal of exercise, tho I work but little. I go into no excesses except reading. I think one third of the day is spent by me in reading. I live much alone, and think that few men desires peace more than I do, and none love it better. To love God with all my powers and my neighbors as myself is my aim and end. I rejoice that I have lived a life of Temperance (in almost every thing). I have a good pare of spectacles and an excellent little rifle gun, and I think

I kill more squirrels than any man in the neighborhood. This serves as an amusement for me in my vacant hours from reading. Peace be with you, my dear Son. I add no more.

BEAM

The Beams came from Germany, settled on Beaver Creek, perhaps about 1750. They were there before the Colemans and Feasters came. Their graves are near where they lived. Think the first was John. His son, Albert, married Sallie Halsell. They were the parents of Edith and Albert Beam (died June 12, 1847). The latter married Sallie Mayo, who died Jan. 1, 1848, and they had two daughters: "Sukey", who married William Widener, and Elizabeth (Betty) who married Hiram H. Coleman.

The MAYOS were settlers on Beaver Creek. Came from Virginia. The mother of the above mentioned Sallie Mayo was a Richardson, of Virginia.

We, Albert Beam and Sarah Beam, wife, of Fairfield Dist., in consideration of \$552.00 paid by Andrew Feaster, of same State and Dist., sold to him all that plantation or tract of land containing fifty-six acres, more or less, being the 1/6th part of a tract of 275/6 Acres whereon John Mayo, dec'd, formerly resided, and was legally seized of in his own right at the time of his death, and was devised by his last Will and Testament as a life estate to his wife, Elizabeth Mayo, and after her death to be equally divided among the whole of his children, that is: Richardson Mayo, Thompson and John Mayo, his sons, Mourning Floyd, Nancy Mayo and the aforesaid Sarah Beam, the wife of the aforesaid Albert Beam. And whereas there can be no partition of the said lands amongst the heirs of the said John Mayo, Sr., Dec'd agreeable to his will, until after the death of his widow, we the said Albert Beam and wife Sarah do hereby convey to Andrew Feaster, Jr. all our rights and claims to the said tracts of land.

The said land is situated in Fairfield Dist on a branch of Beaver Creek bounded on the South by lands purchased by Thos Means of the heirs of Albert Beam, Sr., Dec'd; on the West by lands owned by the widow and heirs of Jesse Beam, Dec'd; and West and No. West by John Feaster and Edward Meadors lands; East by Jacob Horsch and the said Andrew Feaster, Jr., lands having such shape, form and marks as the plat annexed to the original Grant—this 5th day of March 1818.

ROBERT ROE COLEMAN (third son of Robert Coleman and Elizabeth Roe) was affectionately known as "Daddy Bob." He was born February 1st, 1769, before his parents came to South Carolina, and died "intestate" on or about the 12th day of August 1844". (See Estate Settlement, Fairfield Co., S. C., records, Vol. 46, p. 94), mentions: Son Wiley; children of son Hiram, deceased (Susan, Nancy, Robert, Edward, Hiram); son Jonathan D. Refers to "widow and 5 children of son Hiram Coleman."

Robert Roe Coleman married Nancy Coleman, daughter of Charles Coleman (brother of Robert Coleman) and Polly Mobley, daughter of Clement Mobley and Mary Fox. Therefore, Nancy was his first cousin. He settled near his father and brother, David Roe Coleman. Henry Traylor later bought the place.

On road going to the Bean home, Feasterville, Fairfield County, S. C., a road branches to the right and takes one to the site of the "Sallie D." Coleman (Jonathan D. Coleman) house, which was burned some years ago. This is where Robert Roe Coleman lived. Here there is an old family graveyard. Many graves, but only one has a stone with name and date:

Robert H. Coleman/Oct. 1, 1832/June 24, 1862.

This was the son of Hiram H. Coleman (1803-1837). Robert H. Coleman married Julia Ann Feaster, daughter of Andrew Feaster and Mary Norris. It was customary where there were several in a family of the same given name, for the woman

to be called by her name and her husbands, making a double name. So Julia Ann was called "Julia Bob." Robert H. Coleman died at Augusta, Ga., of pneumonia, during the War Between the States, and she was left with two small sons. She went to Florida with her brothers, where she proved herself a true pioneer woman. On her frequent visits back to Feasterville, she often told ^{of} the Indians about their home, of the wild animals, panthers, etc., which abounded in that wild Florida country, the scream of a panther in the night, as blood-curdling as the scream of a woman in agony. Her home was a center of culture and refinement. She had the only piano in that part of the wild country, taught the first Sunday School on Indian River, and weddings were frequently held in her home, because of the piano, her fine linens, silver, etc. She lived at LaGrange, Fla., near Titusville, in Brevard County.

William Ragsdale Coleman left Mississippi and went to
Texas in 1860, where the lands were new and very productive. He
settled in Lavaca Co., Texas, and remained there until his death.
The families were not pleased with Texas, and wanted to return to

their much loved Mississippi, but the prospect of bountiful crops offset their dislike for the pioneering life which they had to endure. In Miss. he lived in Winston (now Choctaw) County, and sold his plantation in 1863 to Isaiah Daniel Coleman (son of Allen Coleman), and moved to Hallettsville, Texas (Lavaca County), where he died Nov. 21, 1884. He became rich and prominent, was a member of the Legislature. Part of his plantation in Miss. is now owned by Judge J. P. Coleman, Ackerman, Miss., a descendant of Daniel Coleman above mentioned. In traveling from Miss. to Texas, Wm. Ragsdale (Buck) Coleman kept a diary, which was published in the Choctaw Plaindealer, a newspaper published by Judge J. P. Coleman, at Ackerman, Miss., in 1949.

(2nd) Joseph Ragsdale Coleman (son of Wylie Roe Coleman and Sarah Ragsdale (Ragsdell), was born June 3, 1803, died June 16, 1859, and married Feb. 5, 1824, Juliana Banks (Majoribanks), born 3/11/1804, died 12/21/1871. Both are buried at Fellowship Cemetery, near Woodward, S. C. Lived east of Blackstock, but attended church at Fellowship (near the Samuel Moberley, Jr., home). It is said that Joseph was not a church member, but was inclined to the Baptist, so Juliana, who was Scotch Presbyterian, told him she would join with him, if he would join the church, so Baptists they became. There was no Baptist church near, so they would go down on Saturday and spend the night with the Moberleys, and drive home Sunday afternoon. They were both big and fat and had a buggy specially made, to which they drove two horses. Joseph Ragsdale Coleman was evidently an officer in the State Militia. They had musters, and were taught to drill, etc. Some of his commissions, dating back in the 1830's, are in possession of Mrs. J. W. Starnes, Ridgeway, S. C. The inscriptions on graves of this couple, at Fellowship Cemetery, are as follows:

Wylie R. Coleman volunteered to go to Mexico Dec. 8, 1846, and died of illness at Pueblo July 18, 1847. His name is on the iron Palmetto tree monument on the State House Grounds, Columbia, S. C.

Samuel Wyatt Coleman, 3rd child above, is buried in the Strong family cemetery, on Great Falls Road, East of Blackstock, near where Joseph Ragsdale Coleman lived. Two infants of Joseph Ragsdale Coleman are buried in the Allen Coleman Cemetery, east of Blackstock.

BANKS

In Scotland, the name was "Majoribanks", but when they came to America, they Americanized it to "Banks". They were Presbyterians. Many of the Banks went West after the Revolution, some to the Northwest, some to the Southwest.

Samuel Robinson Banks (Majoribanks) was sent to America to find his father, who was an officer in the British Army. He found his grave. In "Half Forgotten By-Ways of the Old South", by Robert Wilson, pages 23, 24 and 25, we find the following regarding the father of Samuel Robinson Banks:

"Sickening on the retreat with the deadly malaria of the Carolina Swamp, he died near Black Oak, and his mossy grave may be seen

today by the roadside, marked by a simple stone and protected from desecration by a wooden paling. It stands near the gate of Woodboe Plantation, which old Stephen Maszyck, the Huguenot, first settled, about 25 miles from Estaw, and forty-three from Charleston.*

Samuel Robinson Banks was so pleased with this country that he went back to Scotland and brought his wife, her mother and sisters, and his cousin, Elen McKeown over here. He was so anxious for his grandchildren to have family bibles that he bought them all bibles, leaving them to them in his will - 44 copies, one of which is now in possession of a descendant, Essie Ida Coleman (Mrs. H. L.) South Jacksonville, Fla. (1951).

Samuel Robinson Banks, being an industrious Scott, established a fuller's business, making Broadcloth, doeskin, and silk hats.

The reference in the above mentioned book to Majoribanks, father of Samuel Robinson Banks, does not give his first name, but simply refers to him as "Major Majoribanks."

Allen J. Coleman. He was said to have been a fine man, well to do, and high type in every way. His will is recorded in Book A-1, Vol. 3, page 194, Chester County, S. C., records, as follows:

The State of South Carolina, Chester District:

IN THE NAME OF GOD, AMEN. I, Allen Coleman, of the District and State aforesaid, being of sound mind and memory, and mindful of the uncertainty of life, have made and published this, my last Will and Testament.

1st. It is my will and desire that my body be decently buried.

2nd. It is my will and desire that all my property, both real and personal, after my lawful debts are paid, be disposed of in the following manner, viz: First, I give and bequeath to my daughter, Elizabeth Gladden, four negroes, which she now has in her possession, namely, Dake, and her three children, and Mary, and also two negro boys, named Joe and Jackson.

Secondly, I give and bequeath to my son, William Charles Coleman, two negro boys named Dave and Abram, which are now in his possession. Also a negro boy named Bob.

Thirdly, I give and bequeath to my daughter, Rebecca Gladden, seven negroes which she has now in her possession, viz, Charlotte and her four children; and Luse and Ellen, also two negroes named Charles and Lucinda.

Fourthly, I give and bequeath to my son, Isaiah Daniel Coleman, seven negroes which he has now in possession, namely, Sam^l Augustus, Wilson, Fanny, Frank, Levi and Mary. Also Ginny and any increase which she may have after this time.

Fifthly, I give and bequeath to my grandson, Ansellum Roe Gladden, one mulatto boy named Sam.

Sixthly, I give and bequeath to my granddaughter, Sarah Coleman Gladden, one girl named Juda.

Seventhly, I give and bequeath to my granddaughter, Sarah Coleman, one negro girl named Esther.

Eightly, I give and bequeath to my daughter, Elizabeth Gladden, one old negro woman named Esther.

Ninthly, It is my will and desire that all the residue of my property, both real and personal, be sold and applied to the payment of my debts, and should there not be sufficient to pay my debts, then it is my _____ and desire that all my children contribute an equal proportion for that purpose, but should there be any over plus, after the payment of my debts, then in that case, it is my will and desire that such overplus be equally divided between my children or their lawful representatives.

Tenthly, it is my will and desire that all the above named negroes which are now in my possession and which I have willed to my children remain on the plantation whereon I now reside until said plantation is paid for, said negroes to be under care of my son-in-law, James Gladden, and my son, Isiah D. Coleman, executors of this, my last Will and Testament.

Signed, sealed and published this eleventh day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty four.

Then on ~~February~~ ^{Sept. 10,} 1814, he deeds to Henry Jonathan Coleman, "the place on which I now live, containing 520 acres, more or less, on Fork of Little River. Deed Book Z, p. 333. On same date he deeds to Wiley Coleman, his brother, other land, stating they "being joint purchasers of said land, in 1810." Deed Book Z, page 334. Evidently he was moving to Greene County, Ala., at that time.

Mrs. Jennie I. Coleman and her sister, Mrs. Charles W. Faucette, kept a diary in their trip to Georgia, Alabama and Mississippi, in 1919, making notes on the relatives visited, etc., from which we quote:

"In Greene County, Ala., we find the descendants of Wilson Henry Coleman, who emigrated from South Carolina when a young man. His brother, David H. Coleman, and two uncles, were already here..... Wilson Henry Coleman died Oct. 26, 1846, and is buried near his old home, by the side of his uncle Frank Coleman, of whom he was very fond....so the graves are in a solitary spot....."

NOTE: The two uncles referred to are in all probability John Roe Coleman and, we are certain, one is the grave of Francis Roe Coleman, son of Robert and Elizabeth Coleman.

BOOK 12.

Zeveable Coleman, 12th child of Robert Coleman and Elizabeth Roe, was born Nov. 28, 1789, and died very young. Is buried at the feet of his parents.

BOOK 13.

HENRY JONATHAN COLEMAN, 13th child of Robert Coleman and Elizabeth Roe, was born June 22, 1799, and died Feb. 3, 1861. On December 31, 1818 he married Mary Feaster, daughter of John Feaster and Drucilla Moberley, the ceremony being performed by his oldest brother, David Roe Coleman.

He was a soldier of the War of 1812, and among the pension and bounty land records in The National Archives, Washington, D. C., is a file # WO 10 397, COLEMAN, Henry Jonathan, relating to claims based on his War of 1812 service. The National Archives General Land Office records show that under the act of Sept. 28, 1850, Warrant No. 14829 for 80 acres was issued to Henry J. Coleman on Sept. 8, 1851 for his services. Other grants also were made to him for this service, on record in above office. He enlisted at Winns Bridge, S. C. (near Winnsboro, and served from Oct. 6, 1814 to February 28, 1815, as Private in Capt. William Nevitt's Company of South Carolina Militia.

Henry Jonathan Coleman acquired nearly 2000 acres of land, and owned 40 or 50 slaves. Everything they wore or ate was made on the place -- cotton, wool, and hogs. The negro women during the winter months spun the cotton and wool, and wove the cloth for white and black.

He was a hatter by trade, as well as a first class farmer. His slaves wore good clothes, and had plenty to eat. As a hatter, he made fine hats, beavers, etc.

Mary Feaster, daughter of John Feaster and Drucilla Moberley, was born January 10, 1798, and died Nov. 18, 1873. She was granddaughter of Mary (Polly) Wagner and Samuel Moberley. See MOBERLEY and WAGNER.

They had sixteen children, and raised eleven (9 son and 2 daughters). Six entered the Confederate Army, and two survived. Children:

John Feaster Coleman and Sallie Gladden were cousins, and her parents objected to the marriage for that reason. They fell in love when very young. Sallie told her parents she would wait until she was 21 years old, and if she still felt the same way, they would marry then. They waited, and married. Two weeks before the last child was born, he died of typhoid fever, and Sallie was so grieved that she had no desire nor will to live. Her family tried to persuade her that she should live for the sake of her children, but she died April 8, 1856. They were second cousins, lived at Feasterville, and are buried at the Feaster Cemetery. Little Sarah Edith Coleman was a little more than one month old, was taken and raised by her grandparents, Mary Feaster and Henry Jonathan Coleman, Sr. She was a great pleasure to them, as well as her Uncle George W. Coleman. In 1857 or 1858, she was carried by them to Preston, Ga., to visit Sarah Caroline Coleman Mitchell, the baby's mother's sister. "Mammy", as the grandmother Mary (Polly) was called by the grandchildren, was in good health, Edith was a beautiful plump, sweet baby. Sarah Mitchell's first baby, Ella, was a sweet baby, but very frail. All enjoyed so much being together.

Sallie Gladden Coleman, knowing she would die, had "willed" her fourth child, Mary Rebecca Coleman, to her sister, Sarah Caroline Coleman. The latter was then engaged to marry Beverly C. Mitchell. When her sister

in-law- died, leaving her the child, she told Mr. Mitchell she had been asked to take the child, and if it did not suit him, she would release him from their engagement. He replied that he did not want to be released, "She will be our little girl," and so they were married, and raised the child as their own. Mr. Mitchell had a nice home, and was kind to all.

His son, Henry Coleman Mitchell, received an appointment to West Point, but had to decline on account of measles, which impaired his eyesight. He has been city alderman of his home town. Franklin Preston Mitchell was postmaster of Americus for twelve years. Ella inherited her mother's talent for music and painting, Sallie was very much like her mother. Henry Jonathan Coleman Jr (1831-1874) entered the Buckhead Guards and witnessed the bombardment of Ft. Sumter. His enlistment soon expiring, he reenlisted in Wm. Preston Calhoun Coleman's company, was captured at Ft. Stedman, on Lookout, Md., and paroled in 1865. He received a severe wound at Kinston; a grape shot took him square in the cheek, went around under the flesh and came out of the back of his neck. His widow left the state, the nickname "Hattie Foot Piece" still clung to the place.

(10th) FRANCIS WILLIE COLEMAN, 10th child of Henry Jonathan Coleman and Mary Feaster, was born May 23, 1893, and died unmarried.

(11th) WILLIAM PRESTON CALHOUN COLEMAN, 11th child of Henry Jonathan Coleman and Mary Feaster, was born at Feasterville, Fairfield County, S. C., June 28, 1834. He attended the Arsenal School in Columbia S. C., and was graduated in medicine in New York. He practiced in Louisiana, came back to this state and married Miss Jane Sacrest, of Lancaster Court House, S. C. His brother, Dr. Robert Williams Coleman, had persuaded him to come back and take part of his practice, and he settled on the Hart Means place (beyond the Feaster Burying Ground, going toward Blairs), house still standing and owned by Lee Fee in 1950. He was a violinist of such sweetness and power that it should be mentioned. Gov. Means induced him to raise a company for the War Between the States. He got his brother, Dr. Benjamin Franklin Coleman, from Louisiana, to take the first lieutenantcy. Means was the Colonel, 17th Regiment. Its operations were first at Charleston, then

they went to Virginia.

After the Battle of Malvern Hill, Andrew Mobley and John Banks swapped places with George W. Coleman and Allan Griffin Coleman, so that they might be with their brothers, they having been transferred to the 6th Regiment.

At

~~After~~ the Battle of Second Manassas, Capt. Preston Coleman had his leg shot off and was carried from the field by his brother, Dr. Frank Coleman. His leg was amputated above the knee. He died from the effects of typhoid fever after a lingering illness at his residence in Fairfield District, Feasterville, S. C. He was Captain of Company B, 17th S. C. Volunteers. Was an unusually handsome man. Died January 31, 1863. No children.

(12th) ALLEN GRIFFIN COLEMAN (12th child of Henry Jonathan Coleman and Mary Feaster) was born Oct. 24, 1835, and died July 7, 1864, being killed on the front at Petersburg, Va., and buried in a cemetery there. He was educated at Kings Mountain Military Academy, went through the entire war, and was shot mortally July 7, 1864. He was considered the best soldier of his regiment, Major William Betsell told W. W. Dixon, at Union, S. C., in 1896. He spoke in highest terms of this soldier afterwards, saying to Col. Fitz Hugh McMaster, that if he had a thousand such men as Allan Griffin Coleman, he would not be afraid of any line of troops in battle. He received a severe wound at Malvern Hill. Died single.

Capt. E. J. Means organized Buckhead Guards. Henry Jonathan Coleman, Jr., Allen Griffin Coleman, and George Washington Coleman joined at Buckhead, S. C., the 6th S. C. D.

the 6th South Carolina Regiment. Left for Charleston April 11, 1861. Were there at the firing on Fort Sumter. They volunteered for 90 days. After the expiration of the 90 days, came to Summerville, S. C. to re-organize. Allen Griffin Coleman and George W. Coleman, brothers, volunteered again for twelve months. Served that time, then reorganized at Orange Court House, Virginia. Boykin Lyles was made Captain. Volunteered for three years, or until the end of the War. Allen and George W. Coleman served in that Regiment until the Battle of Malvern Hill, then swapped with two men to go to the 17th (and then to the 6th S. C. Regiment) under Captain Preston Coleman's (brother of Allen and George W. Coleman) Regiment. John Hugh Means was Colonel of that Regt. (17th). Joined and went in battle the next day. Col. Means killed that day. Capt. Preston Coleman was shot in leg, which had to be amputated. His brother, Lt. B. Frank Coleman (M. D.) was left there with him. As soon as he (Preston) was able to travel home, Lt. Frank Coleman came to our Regiment at Brucetown, Va. (17th Regt.)

Lt. B. Frank Coleman was taken sick when there only fifteen days, and died. Is buried at Cranes Chapel (or Stones Chapel), a little church at Brucetown, Va. Allen G. Coleman was killed on battlefield at Petersburg, Va. Was shot one day and died the next. He is buried in cemetery at Petersburg, Va. Henry Jonathan Coleman, Jr. was captured at Fort Steaman. George W. Coleman was with his company and served until April 1, 1865, was captured at Five Forks, Va., then carried to Point Lookout, Maryland, and put in prison. Was paroled, came home, reaching South Carolina July 4, 1865.

I, Robert Coleman, of the State and District aforesaid, being of sound mind and memory, though weak of body, do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in the manner and form following: That is to say, I give to my sons David, John, Robin, Wiley, Allen, Griffith and Solomon Coleman, one cow and calf each, the finest of my stock of cattle. I give to my son Frances and Daughter Elisabeth Coleman the tract of land whereon I now live, to be equally divided between them, shear and shear alike, to them and their heirs forever. I give to them also all the rest and residue of my stock of cattle, hogs, sheep, etc., for the purpose of paying my debts and legacies, Together with what debts may be owing to me. Also all my household furniture, plantation tools, etc., for the same purpose -----

I give to my son, Henry Jonathan Coleman, my negro woman Rachel, to him and his heirs forever. Also, three hundred dollars, to be paid to him by my executors when he shall come to the age of twentyone years, the said three hundred dollars to be raised by debts owing to me, if there shall be so much owing. But if not so much, the balance not raised thereby, to be raised out of my stock, household furniture, plantation tools, etc., given above to Frances & Elisabeth. I give to my daughter, Sarah Mobley, one horse, the only one I now own, to her and her heirs etc. Also, one feather bed and furniture to be paid to her by Frances and Elizabeth, my son and Daughter. It is my will and desire that the whole of my property above mentioned given to Frances and Elisabeth Coleman, together with the whole of debts owing to me, be the fund out of which all my debts be paid, together with the balance which the debts owing to me shall fall short, in raising the

Three Hundred Dollars as above given to Henry Jonathan; it is my will and desire that my son Henry Jonathan shall learn the Hatting Business, with one of his brothers, Wiley or Griffith.-----

IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF I have hereunto set my hand the thirtieth day of Sept. 1809. It is my will that my sons Wiley and Frances shall execute this my will.

Robert Coleman purchased lands to the north of the Moberleys and Hans Wagner, and part of this land remained in the Coleman family until 1944. Edrington's History of Fairfield County, states:

"The second daughter (of John Feaster) Mary Feaster married Henry Jonathan Coleman, by whom she had 16 children, eleven of whom lived to be grown - nine sons and two daughters. Truly it may be said that Feasterville Township was benefitted by the issue of this marriage. It gave to the township three of the very best physicians, two of whom, Doctors Preston and Franklin Coleman, gave up their lives in Virginia for the "lost cause." Allan Coleman lost his life at Petersburg, Jacob F. died at Wilmington, N. C. in 1864. Dr. R. W. Coleman, better known

as "Dr. Bob", was one of the best nurses that ever lived. He married Nancy McConnell and had several children."

After the War of 1812, Henry Jonathan Coleman resumed business, and soon became one of the largest landowners of Fairfield County. He had contracts to construct certain sections of the Spartanburg, Union and Columbia Railway, and it is said that for the immense work he completed, he received worthless script. His son, David Roe Coleman, had his eyes injured while blasting for his father in the construction of this railway, and was sent to the Blind Institute, in Boston.

Edrington's History also states that Allan Coleman and his wife Sallie (daughter of Charles Coleman, brother of Robert) settled, lived and died on Rocky Creek, in Chester County. That Allan Coleman's wife presented him with twin daughters, and a neighbor named Gladden had twin sons, and they married.

The Colemans and Feasters were long lived, and splendid types of physical manhood, the average weight about 220 lbs., and most of the Colemans over 6 feet tall.

Elizabeth Coleman, second daughter of D. R. Coleman should certainly be given mention as a pioneer. She married Isaac Nolan and moved to Indian Springs, Ga. After her marriage she rode from her father's to Indian Springs on horseback, there being no railroads in those days, and very poor dirt roads, — a horseback ride of 300 miles. She became the mother of ten (10) children, and at the age of 80 years was living in Smith County, Texas. Truly a pioneer woman!

While many of the children of the first Colemans pioneered on West to other states, even to the far West, seeking their own homes and fortunes, many descendants remain today on and near lands first settled by the Colemans, though these lands have changed from the rich wilderness of 1775 to bare red hills. Robert and Elizabeth Coleman now lie in the old

Coleman family burying ground, at Feasterville, Fairfield County, South Carolina.

Robert Fitz Coleman, eldest son of David Hoe Coleman and Edith Beam, married Susan Feaster, daughter of John Feaster and Drucilla Moberley, and was thus the first Coleman to ally his family with the Moberleys and Feasters.

Comrades Starke and Lynch, of Newberry County, S. C., being with him. ~~There~~ Their relatives lived there and they stopped by to see them. Capt. Metts was of Newberry, too, and not a better man nor soldier. Cousin Mose has a picture of himself with four fine hound dogs. Three of them were same strain, of the old Cockrell fox hounds, brought to this country by old Mose and Jim Cockrell. They would trail a negro 70 hours after, and never swap tracks. Got \$25,000 for catching a negro. Was a great hunter. Has killed 6 wild turkeys one shot. His father killed 9 at one shot. Game of all kinds in abundance then - deer, squirrels, turkeys and wolves and bears. All now gone and very few. His father used to hunt bears in Mississippi Valley. Now and then wolves are seen yet.

4. Abner Coleman
5. John (called Major John) md. Polly Rainey

All the land came to be owned by Solomon Coleman and Major John Coleman. The former owned the part joining Mrs. Jennie I. Coleman's place on the East, and lived in the house that John A. F. Coleman ("Farmer John) lived in in 1904, he buying the land from Harry D. Coleman.

2. Solomon Coleman and Betty Elam had following children:

1. William Coleman md. Drucilla (Drucie) Coleman, dtr of Susan Feaster and Robert Fitz Coleman. She was born 1812. William Coleman moved to Randolph County, Ga., and had several daughters, and only one son, Henry, who lived at the old place. William was a member of the Legislature of Ga. in 1873. I (Jennie I. Coleman's note) saw him in Atlanta then. He was a large man of pleasant manners. Was an ardent Universalist, built a church himself on his place, and had a Convention meet there. Was called "Judge Coleman". The Confederate War coming on reduced his property, causing changes that crippled the growth of

Universalism everywhere in the South. He and his family went into Spiritualism, and were very happy in the belief. His son Henry had one son, I believe. Several of the daughters never married."

2. Martin Coleman (son of William Coleman) married Eliza Coleman, another daughter of Susan and Robert Pitts Coleman. Martin died within a few months after marrying, and his widow married (2nd) James Brannan (3rd) John G. Arnette (4th) Wealey Mayfield.
3. Isaac Coleman married Judith McShan, a niece of John Feaster (son of Andrew Feaster and Margaret Fry Cooper) They went to Louisiana and lived there many years. Had two sons, neither married. The daughter, Nelly, came back here and married William Tucker, of Union County. He had considerable property. She had two daughters, Mrs. Clara Fant, and Ada _____ (can't recall her married name). One son, William, did not marry. Daughter Nannie married William Jeter, and Lou married John Jeter (cousins) of Union County, S. C. They also were men of property at the time. The three daughters thus marrying and settling in Union Co., S. C., the parents, Isaac and Judith Coleman came back from Louisiana to live with them, and died there a good many years ago. They, too, were Universalists. Nannie left three sons, Dr. Iranus, Clarence and Tom, and one daughter, Eva, who married Paul Jeter. They live near Carlisle, S. C. The sons married, too. Louella and Adella were twin daughters, so much alike their friends could not tell them apart. Luella, married John Jeter, had one son, Isaac Coleman Jeter. Adelle married a native of Vermont, Colonel Twitchell, went north and died, leaving one son, Isaac Coleman, of whom we know nothing.

4. Iley Coleman, living in 1863, married a lady of Charleston. He was a lawyer in Memphis, Tenn. For some unknown cause he killed himself by jumping in a well. In 1863 she (Iley) was in Memphis, Tenn. (See Estate Settlement of Solomon Coleman, Fairfield County, S. C. records.)

5. Mary (Polly) the only daughter, married her cousin, Wylie W. Coleman, and they moved to Winston County, Miss. (He was son of Wylie Coleman). Had one son -

1. Mortimer, lived at Winston Co., Miss. Was a member of the Universalist Church there, a man of considerable wealth, and a member of the Legislature. Had no children.

(3) Elizabeth Coleman (dtr of William Coleman and Nancy Butler) married John Butler, and had a child (only son):

1. Martin Butler

(5) John ("Major Johnny") Coleman, son of William Coleman and Nancy Butler, married Polly Rainey. He owned the land called the "Reuben", Johnny Major, and Nancy Ed tracts. His descendants have died out of this vicinity. One grandson lived near Fairburn, Ga., and had several sons, but we know nothing of them.

Solomon Coleman, died about 1863, left an estate of \$25,000. His house was still in use in 1906, always known as the "Solomon House". His place was bought by Henry Alexander Coleman, and in the division of his estate, the Solomon farm fell to "Aunt Asa Manning" of Ga., who got the rent from it till her death. Then her daughter, Cornelia, inherited it. She sold it to Harry David Coleman. He lived on it in the old house, making good crops on the old land for several years, then sold to John A. F. Coleman. He did well there for two years.

Solomon Coleman was considered a queer kind of man, but above the average. He married Frank Betty Elm and raised a large family - very tall, large men were his sons.

COLEMAN DEEDS, ETC.

Fairfield County, S. C., records, Winnsboro, S. C.:

Deed Book L, page 436: Deed of Gift, William Coleman to Elisabeth Butler, William Coleman, Sr., to my lovely daughter, Elizabeth Butler, wife of John Butler, and her eldest and only son, Martin Butler—plantation whereon John Butler and wife are now living, being part of 500 acres originally granted to William Masyc—bounded by lands of David Roe Coleman, etc." Dated May 16, 1818.

Book Z, page 499, Feb. 13, 1818: William Coleman to Akner Coleman, "land on which I now live, being part of tract granted to me in the year 1772, adjoining land of John Winn, on Beaver Creek."

Deed Book Y, p. 546, 1817: William Coleman to my son Solomon Coleman, plantation whereon he now lives, 145 acres, being part of tract granted to William Masyc, and conveyed by him to Robert Coleman, and by Robert Coleman to William Coleman, on head branch of Beaver Creek. Plat shows Chester Road runs through this land.

Book P, p. 236: 1803.. Robert Coleman to William Coleman, part of land granted to Wm. Masyc, 19 Oct. 1772, and conveyed to Robert Coleman, Sr., bounding David Coleman's land, William Colemans, etc.

Book DD, page 126: 1819. Stephen Coleman to David R. Coleman, conveying land granted to Rymphrey Wady in 1772, and by him conveyed to Robert Beam, who conveyed the said 100 a. to Robert Coleman, Sr., deceased, who by his last will and testament devised the same to the aforesaid Stephen Coleman.....

Book O, p. 191 - 1803: Francis Coleman and wife, Margaret, of State

of Georgia, County of Jefferson, land granted to John Martin in 1770, transferred to Francis Coleman 23rd of January 1772, and one tract granted to Francis Coleman 11th February 1773, beginning at a point on Ephraim Lyles line. (NOTE: Robert Coleman's son Francis was not born until 1786, so probably Robert had a brother Francis already here).

Book Y, p. 295: 1817. Deed from John A. Coleman and wife, Mary, of District of Fairfield, State aforesaid, to Robert Fitz Coleman, releasing all "their right, title or claim that they have to the real estate of Albert Beam, late of said district, and deceased, the said real estate consisting of land whereon the said Albert Beam formerly lived, and which real estate has never been divided agreeable to the laws of this state, the said Albert Beam having died intestate, leaving children and grandchildren, the son and daughters of his son, Elijah Beam, who died before his father; the said Albert Beam; that is, John Beam, Jesse Beam, Albert Beam, and William Beam, sons; also, Edith Coleman, the said Mary Coleman, wife of the said John Coleman; Sarah Beam and Dorcas Beam, daughters; also Ferdinand Beam, Edith Beam and Nancy Beam, g-children, and son and daughters of the said Elijah Beam, deceased; and whereas the said John and Mary are equally entitled to an equal share of said real estate with the rest of their brothers and sisters and their aforesaid nephew Ferdinand, and nieces Edith and Nancy, son and daughters of our deceased brother, Elijah Beam; ,,,,lands situated on Beaver Creek. Deed to Robert Fitz Coleman.

Book Y, page 326, 1817: David Coleman, Ferdinand Beam, Edith Beam, Nancy Coleman, late Nancy Beam -- to Robert Fitz Coleman, all right to the estate of their grandfather, Albert Beam, deceased, having died intestate, leaving children and grandchildren, that is; sons John Beam, Jesse Beam, Albert Beam, William Beam; daughters, Edith Coleman, Mary Coleman, Sarah Coleman, and Dorcas Beam; grandchildren, Ferdinand Beam, Edith Beam and Nancy Beam, now Nancy Coleman, sons and dtrs of Elijah Beam. Renunciation of dower states "Nancy, wife of David Coleman."

Fairfield County records, LOCATIONS BOOK (Plats) "A", page 177:

Nov. 30, 1784, No. 504: To ROBERT COLEMAN.

State of South Carolina. Pursuant to a warrant from John Winn, Esq., C. L. I. (?), I have measured and laid out unto ROBERT COLEMAN a tract of Two Hundred and Fifty Acres of land situate in Camden District, on Bonneys Fork of Beaver Creek, bounded SWerly by land laid SErly, on land laid out NWERly, on land laid out to William Coleman. NEerly land laid to William Colaman, etc."

1804 Book P, page 11. Robert Coleman to William Coleman "land on Bonney's Fork of Beaver Creek, of Broad River, being part of 250 acres of land granted to the said Robert Coleman, etc."

The above is land of Robert Coleman and Elizabeth Roe Coleman. Part of this land was still in possession of descendants of the Coleman name (Mrs. Jennie I. Coleman) in 1929.

Other early Fairfield County Coleman records.

Box 43, folio 669. Estate Settlement.

ROBERT COLEMAN, 1828, names widow (no name), and children: Charles, Robert, Priscilla, Anne, John, Elizabeth, Hardy, Martha.

Will Book 2, pages 117 & 118, Feb, 25, 1796: Will of ROBERT COLEMAN.

In the name of God, Amen, I Robert Coleman, of the State of South Carolina, and County of Fairfield, Farmer, being very weak of body, but in perfect mind and memory, thanks be given unto God, calling into mind the mortality of my body, and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this my last will and testament, that is to say principally and first of all, I give and recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God, who gave it, etc..... I give devise and dispose of my estate in the following manner and form: First, I give and bequeath to Susannah Coleman, my well beloved wife, one sorrel mare, seven head of cattle, etc.....

I lend to my well beloved wife, Susannah Coleman the third part of one hundred acres of land during her life.... I give to my well beloved children, Thomas Coleman, Sarah Chapman, Mary Parker, Cloey Nobley, Fanny Nobley, Nancy Nobley and Susannah Picket, etc.....I give and bequeath to my well beloved children, Stephen Coleman, Mourning Coleman, Tabitha Coleman, all my personal Estate except what I have given away which is above mentioned.To my well beloved son, Stephen Coleman, one hundred acres of land whereon I now live.....I make constitute and appoint William Chapman and Isiah Nobley my lawful executors....". Dated 31 day of March 1795. Recorded Feb 15, 1796.

Book I (Deeds) p. 31: " Robert Coleman, Sr., and wife Susannah, quit claim deed to "a grant from the State unto William Jones, of a plantation, 200 acres, situate in Craven, now Fairfield Co., on South side of Little River and whereas the said Robert Coleman, since the decease of the said William Jones. hath intermarried with Susannah Jones. widow and relict of the said

William Jones, deceased, "...gives all dower rights, etc. 1794.

Book I, page 79: Quit Claimdeed from Abraham Jones and his wife, Mary, to all their interest in the said tract of land, said being bounded by land of John Lashley. Said land at present the legal property of Abraham Jones, "he being the oldest son and heir at law to all real property of the above mentioned William Jones, etc.".....

Deeds of Gift in 1796 (after the signing of his will, but before it was probated (that is, before his death): From the above Robert R. Coleman, separate deeds as follows: "To my daughter, Morning Coleman, my son-in-law, William Chapman, son-in-law, Isaiah Mobley, son in law, William Mobley, daughter, Teritha Coleman, son Stephen Coleman."

Deed Book Y, p. 198. Stephen Coleman to Robert Coleman, Jr. ---conveys land "conveyed to Albert Beck, and by Albert Beck to Robert Coleman, the father of the said Robert Coleman and by him devised by his last will and testament to the said Stephen Coleman, on branch of Beaver Creek and Reedy Branch. Dec. 7, 1808. (WITNESSES: Robert F. Coleman, W. F. Coleman).

According to note by Mrs. Jennie I. Coleman, Robert Coleman who md. Elizabeth Roe, lived on land he owned on Honey's Fork. From the above, Robert Coleman (wife Sussannah), might have been the father of Robert (wife Elizabeth Roe). Robert Coleman, Sr., wills it to Stephen Coleman, who conveys it to Robert Coleman, stating it was willed to him by Robert R. Coleman, "father of the said Robert Coleman." That seems to indicate Stephen and Robert were brothers. Edrington's Notes on Fairfield County state that ^{Solomon Coleman md dtr of} ~~Stephen Coleman~~ carried a "distant cousin". The Robert Coleman family records state ~~he~~

that Solomon Roe Coleman, son of Robert and Elizabeth Roe Coleman, married a daughter of Stephen Coleman, name not known. One of the old records also states that Robert had a brother Stephen. NOTE: Could it be that Stephen and Robert were half brothers? The same father, different mothers? Above will of Stephen's father, and deeds above, indicate that the old Robert Coleman lived in the same vicinity as our Robert Coleman in 1795, near Feasterville.

Colemans of other counties of South Carolina.

From Mrs. Dave Coleman, Jonesville, Union County, South Carolina:

There were five Coleman brothers who landed in what is now the state of Virginia. Two, it seems, went West, and we know nothing of them or their families, but three of them came south and finally reached this section. Two of them, namely, Christopher and Bartley, settled near where the town of Jonesville, S. C., now stands. One, so the story goes, went to the lower part of the state. We believe his name was Robert. We are fairly certain that the names of the three original brothers were Christopher, Bartley and Robert. We have in our possession the original land grant from the King of England granting land to Christopher in the year 1774. It is from this Christopher Coleman that the Jonesville Colemans are directly descended. He is mentioned as "Christy" in "Hershee Robinson, by John F. Kennedy, and it seems that he ran a tavern known as "Christy's", that he was a loyalist and that the British soldiers ate breakfast at his place the morning after the battle of "Grindal Shoals." He married Mary Marshall. Later, because of the unpopularity of the loyalists, he left and some think he later died in Charleston, S. C. We have no record of Christopher's family except for Robert.

Robert Coleman, son of Christopher, married Elizabeth Smith, sometimes called Treassy. We have old family bible listing his family as follows:

There are two old family burying grounds near Jonesville, but stones have no inscriptions.

From Mrs. Lucy Coleman Brunnett (Mrs. W. W.), 1510 Belmont St.,
 Jackson, Miss.:

"My ancestor, Robert Coleman, came over from England about the middle of the 18th century, first to Virginia, then on down to South Carolina. A brother, Bartley, came with him, though Bartley went up into Pennsylvania, and it is said, became very rich. Robert Coleman lived in Union County, S. C., died there June 18, 1823, and is buried near Jonesville. His wife was called "Trecy". She died July 15, 1838. These dates taken from an old family bible now in possession of one of their great grand sons. Their childrens names are - Threasa (who lived to be 96 years old), Abner, Bartley, Nancy and Reuben.

Bartley Coleman, my grandfather, is buried in the same cemetery where his father is buried. This is the Robert Coleman (above) who served with Brandon's Regiment. Tom Coleman was an older brother, who came over from England at the same time my ancestor came.

From Mrs. J. B. Garrard, LaGrange, Texas:

My great-grand father was John E. Coleman, born in August 1789, in Laurens District, S. C. The following is from his bible:

"William Coleman was born in 1765 or 66, died 12th day of August 1828. He and his wife Lucy Coleman died in 36 hours of each other of Typhus Fever, and were buried in his then residence (where George Holditch now lives) in Laurens District, South Carolina... Don't know just when Lucy Bailey married William Coleman. There are records in the S. C. Historical Commission that William Coleman, Sr. and William Coleman, Jr., received pay for their services in the Revolutionary War. The old bible does not say where he lived.

Part D.

STEPHEN COLEMAN, is mentioned in will of Robert R. Coleman (also signs as Robert Coleman, Sr.), and is also named in will of Susannah Coleman, widow of Robert R. Coleman. The Robert Coleman-Elizabeth Roe records state that their son, Solomon Roe Coleman married _____, daughter of Stephen Coleman, a cousin. Solomon Roe Coleman settled the estate of Stephen Coleman's mother. See Estate Settlement. This all we know of Stephen Coleman.

Part E.

THOMAS COLEMAN is mentioned in will of Robert R. Coleman (also signs as Robert Coleman, Sr.) One Charity Coleman, born 1/22/1772, died 7/29/1855, married 1801, is said to have been the daughter of Thomas Coleman. She married Stephen Crosby, (born 11/19/182, died 3/20/1856). They are buried in Crosby family cemetery back of present home of Mrs. W. T. Boulware, Sr., on Highway 215, at Chester-Fairfield county line, These dates, etc., are established with the D. A. R. under National No. 179043. Stephen Crosby's parents were Thomas Crosby, born abt 1751, died 3/4/1791 (Revolutionary soldier) and his wife Margaret Dennis or Davis (born 12/17/1757, died 2/18/1825, married 1770). The THOMAS COLEMAN place was later owned by David Roe Feaster, and then by Martin Dennis Calhoun Colvin. This is at Feasterville, Fairfield County, S. C.
