**Coleman, Jacob**

He enlisted in the Second Regiment on 4 November 1775. He served two hundred fifty-two days as a sergeant under Col. Hugh Horry and Gen. Marion. C.S.; A.A.1362; Y704; N.A.853.

**Coleman, James**

He served in the Northeast St. David's Parish Volunteer Company under Capt. Robert Lide during 1775. Charleston News.

**Coleman, James**

He served ninety-seven days in the militia during 1782 in Marion's brigade. C.S.; A.A.1363; N121.

**Coleman, John**

He served thirty-four days in the militia during 1782. A.A.1364; N120.

**Coleman, Robert**

He enlisted in the Second Regiment on 4 November 1775 as a corporal. On 7 November 1777, he became a sergeant. He was discharged on 8 July 1778. N.A.853.

While residing in Marion District, he served as a sergeant and afterwards as a lieutenant under Capts. Simmons and Weatherspoon and Gen. Marion. He was in the skirmish at Bass's Mill on the Great Pee Dee River under Maurice Murphy. He was also sergeant in the battle at Fort Moultrie. At one time, he was under Capt. Snipes and Gen. Marion as a rifleman. He was in the battles at Monck's Corner and Biggin Church. A.A.1113; A.A.1365; Y1546.

**Coleman, Robert**

He served under Col. Brandon. C.S.; A.A.1113; A.A.1365; X2780.

**Coleman, Robert**

He served as a sergeant under Capt. Aramanous Liles and was with Col. Taylor at Orangeburg and Col. Hopkins at the Forks of the Edisto. C.S.

**Coleman, Seth**

He enlisted in the First Regiment on 4 November 1775. N.A.853.

**Coleman, William**

He served as a private and lieutenant in Pickens's brigade before the fall of Charleston and also provided provisions and nursed sick men during 1781. C.S.; A.A.1366; U245.

**Coleman, William**

He enlisted in the Fifth Regiment on 1 April 1776 and was a corporal on 18 May 1778. N.A.853.

**Coleman, William, Sr.**

He served in the militia under Col. Brandon after the fall of Charleston. C.S.; A.A.1366; X2778.

**Coleman, William, Jr.**

He served in the militia under Col. Brandon after the fall of Charleston. C.S.; A.A.1366; X2777.

**Coleman, \_\_\_\_\_**

He served as a sergeant in the Second Regiment during 1777. S.C.H.&G., XVI, 32.

**Coler, Moses**

He served in the militia under Col. Brandon. C.S.

**Coley, John**

He served in the militia after the fall of Charleston. C.S.; A.A.1367; U227; (A.A.6703); V648.

**Colhoon, David**

He served in the militia under Capt. James Giles and Col. Hill during 1781. Salley, Doc., p. 68.

**Colhoun, David**

See David Colhoon.

**Colhoun, John Ewing**

See John Ewing Calhoun.

**Colk, James**

He served in the light dragoons under Capt. Philemon Waters, Col. John Thomas and Gen. Sumter. C.S.; A.A.1368A; M483.

**Colk, William**

He served in the light dragoons as a sergeant under Capt. Philemon Waters, Colonel John Thomas and Gen. Sumter. C.S.; A.A.1369; M480.

**Colk, William**

He served in the militia under Col. Waters before the fall of Charleston. A.A.1369; X2485.

**Colke, William**

See William Colk.

**Collans, John**

He served as a horseman in the militia under Capt. John Cowan during 1780 and 1783. K204.

**Collans, Robert**

See Robert Collins.

**Collar, Benjamin**

He served in the Orangeburg District Independent Cavalry under Capt. Jacob Rumph. Salley, O., p. 474.

**Collends, John**

See John Collins.

**Collet, \_\_\_\_\_**

He served as a captain and about nine months before the evacuation of Charleston attempted to convey information to General Greene but was arrested. He was held in the Provost until the British withdrew from the city. A.A.1369½B.

**Colley, Andrew**

He served in the militia under Col. Roebuck. C.S.

**Colley, James**

He served as a private and sergeant under Capt. McConnell and Colonel Bratton during 1780, 1781 and 1782. C.S.; A.A.1370; 1176.

**Colley, Mainyard**

See Mainyard Colly.

**Colliatt, Thomas**

He served in the militia during 1782. O294.

**Collicut, Thomas**

His name appears in the Columbia State list without the unit or time of his service. C.S.

**Collier, Isaac**

He served in the Third Regiment under Capt. Field Farrar during 1779. He was taken prisoner on 29 December 1778. S.C.H.&G., V, 154; N.A.853.

**Collier, John**

He served as a private in Marion's brigade during 1782. Gregg, p. 406; A.A.1370A; R328.

**Collier, Thomas**

He enlisted in the Third Regiment on 4 February 1777. On 1 October 1777, he became a sergeant. He was taken prisoner on 28 December 1778 and was exchanged. N.A.853.

**Collins, Daniel**

He served in the militia under Capt. John Moffett and Col. Bratton. C.S.; A.A.1373; P624.

**Collins, Edmund**

He served under Gen. Marion during 1782. A.A.1375; Y262.

**Collins, Gary**

He provided three hundred fifty pounds of beef for the militia during 1781 and may have served in the militia. A.A.1371; N146.

**Collins, George**

He served in the militia from 4 May 1781 to 15 February 1782. A.A.1376; X384.

**Collins, James P.**

While residing in York District, he served under Col. Moffett as a messenger although he was too young to bear arms. From 1780, he served under Capts. John Henderson, John Chambers and Watson, Lts. Bryant and James Venable and Cols. Moffett, Campbell, Irwin Shelby and Cleveland. He was in a skirmish at Lord Hook and the battles at Kings Mountain and Cowpens. (Moved to Ga., Tenn., and La.)

**Collins, John**

While residing in Camden District, he served from 10 May to 26 October 1776 under Capt. Robert McAfee and Col. Neel and was in an engagement with Cherokee Indians on the Tennessee River. His second tour was under the same officers. The third tour began on 15/17 March 1779 and was under Captain Thomas Barron and Maj. Francis Ross and he was in the battle at Briar Creek. Next, he was in a North Carolina unit. He was in the battles at Kings Mountain, Cowpens and Yorktown. From March to October 1782, he was a captain under Cols. Winn, Lyon (?) and Bratton but was not on active duty. (Moved to Ga.) A.A.1377.

While residing in Spartanburg District, he volunteered during 1775 and served under Capt. Barry and Cols. Thomas and Richardson. In 1776, he was under Capt. McElhany and marched against the Indians. In 1778, he was under Capt. Palmer and Col. Brandon and was on the Florida Expedition. He became a captain in the militia on 3 March 1780 under Col.
