

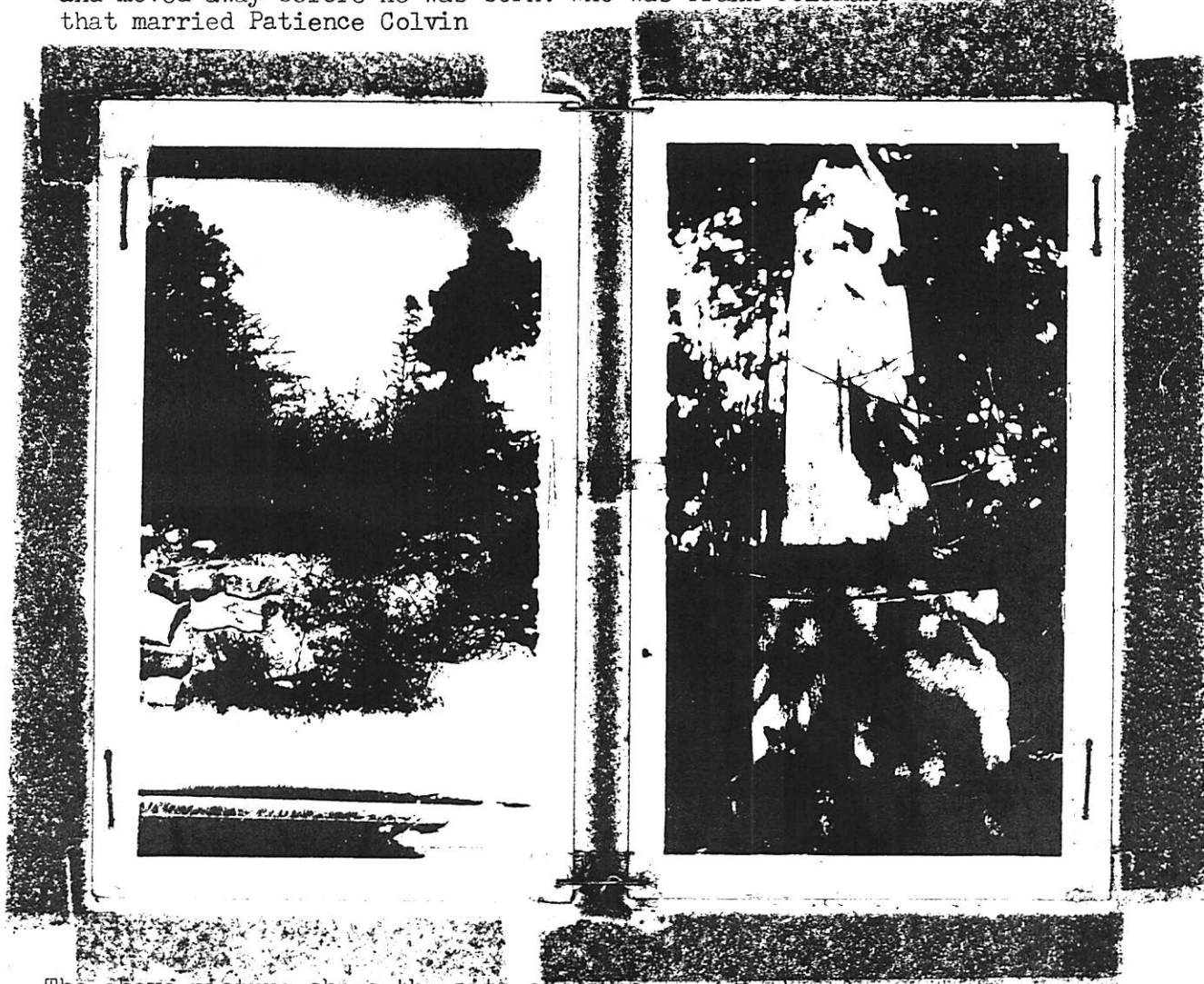

COLVIN NOTES

From a letter from Capt D.R. Feaster, of Princeton, Ark to his brother John C Feaster of Buckhead, Fairfield Co. S.C. dated Sept 11th. 1904:-

" Yes I remember Frank Nelson's cousin Smith. Alex, his name was it not? Frank Coleman's son by the Welch Woman, Bob I believe his name was, married Patience Colvin, sister to Martin, Nicholas, and Col Greenberry Colvin; and only sister. Yes, I have a good memory, and I thank God for it. I am able to do a good many "Chores" as the Yankees put it."

(Note; DBC, Sr. The information I have on the Colvin Family shows that Patience Colvin above married, 1st Frank Coleman, 2nd ? . It also shows that she had the following sisters:- Sarah woman Mayberry (Mabry) Wright; Hannah who married John V Cornwell; Elizabeth who married a Griffin; Mary woman an Egger; and Martha who married a Cockrell. As this family of ten children of Nicholas and Susan (Elam) Colvin were born around 1800 it is probable that D.R. Feaster never knew these girls who likely had married and moved away before he was born. Who was Frank Coleman? or who was it that married Patience Colvin



The above picture shows the site of John Colvin's old home (He came to Fairfield Co. SC in 1774/5) House was real long, built of logs. It was destroyed some years ago by fire. Picture shows part of the old chimney, which was built of huge rocks.
