The Woodward Graveyard Colvins as follows: Virginia Colvin Cornwell was a descendant of Nicholas Colvin and Susan Elam. Margaret Colvin, wife of J.E. Cornwell was a daughter of Virginia who married Nicholas Green Berry Colvin son of Martin and Margaret (Crosby) Colvin. M. Arthur Colvin was son of Virginia and N. Green Berry Colvin. Virginia was a Cornwell and married a Colvin, after the death of Green Berry Colvin she married a Cornwell and her daughter Margaret married her cousin Dr J.E. Cornwell. He was Clerk of Court of Chester Co. for years losing out the last election. His Mother was Alice Stone. His son Arthur who lives in Washington is very much interested in Family History. Jesse Gladden was brother of My grandmother, Sarah, also brother of Nancy Jane Wright buried in Red Hill Graveyard. Jesse Gladden is grandfather of Kate Wolling. Jesse's wife was a sister of Mrs Jeffaries, her name was Sarah."

Charles Feaster Colvin, brother of W.J. Colvin of Columbia, S.C. died Friday Jan 21st, 1955 at St John's Hospital, Tulsa, Okla. after a months illness. He lived at Sand Springs, Okla. He was the son of the late D.C. Colvin (M.D.C.) and Edith Coleman Colvin of Fairfield Co. He graduated at the Citadel after going to school at Feasterville. He graduated in 1906, after which he taught at Bailey Institute in Edgefield Co for Two years. In 1909 he went to Oklahoma City, later to Tulsa, Okla. He was associated with the Page Industries of Sand Springs, and later with the Okla Light and Power Co. He married the former Miss Dorothy Hudson. He is survived by his widow, One daughter and one granddaughter, two sisters Miss Eva Colvin and Mrs Mary Adams, both of Columbia, and two brothers D.C. Colvin of Gastonia, N.C. and W.J. Colvin of Holly Hill, S.C. He will be buried at Sand Springs, Okla Jan 22nd.

Dabney Oswell McGehee. Physician, Knoxville, Greene Co. Ala. enrolled in 1864 from Greene Co.; son of Zachary M McGehee and Elizabeth Colvin. M.D. in Mobile, Ala. in 1873.

Deed Book U-P235 Attoway R Davis (1850 Census aged 42 from Va.) and Wife Savilla Colvin (aged 22 born in Ala.)

Note- DBC.Sr. 1955 The above Colvins are hard to place but indications from above data would place Savilla as the wife of Edward Colvin, son of William and Martha (Feaster) Colvin of Fairfield Co. SC. From Census of 1850 Savilla was born in 1785, about the correct age for Edwards wife to have been. Thomas, son of Savilla had son named John S (Stone) Colvin, and his brother Allen D had daughter named Frances S (Stone) Colvin. All in Greene Co Ala. in 1860.
