

IN THE NAME OF GOD, AMEN. I, JOHN COLVIN of the State of South Carolina, County of Chester
Being weak in body But of sound mind & memory (Blessed be God) Do this sixth day of June in
the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & ninety-three Make and ordain this my Last
Will & Testament in Manner Following - after my debts and Funerall charges are Paid and dis-
charged- that is to say, Imprimus, I give my Two sons Thomas & Tarlton Colvin a Tract of
Land containing one Hundred and fifty acres joining Lands of Thomas Jinkens & William Wood
granted to Allen Burton To be equally divided between them with Refirance to good & Bad.
ITEM I give my son in law, Benjamin Trustee, husband to my daughter Sarah deceased on
her part one shilling sterling.

ITEM I give and Bequeath to my Loving Wife Hannah Colvin all my Negres and their Increase
~~during her life or widowhood together with all the rest & residue of my goods and chattels~~
& Personal Estate, Except one young Black Mare, which I give to my son Daniel Colvin, and
after the death of my wife or day or marriage the Hole of my Estate & its Increase to be
equally divided Between my children as following, William, John, Nicholas, Daniel, Edward,
Thomas, Talton, Rhoda, Mary Charlottee & Levicy Colvin

ITEM I also appoint my wife Hannah Colvin & my son William Colvin Executrix & Executor
of this my Last Will & Testament, and do hereby utterly Revoke, disallow and disannuel
all former Bequaths Wills or Legacies by me here to fore in any wise left or made, de-
clearing Ratifying & confirming this & no other to be my Last Will & Testament
