outlined in the topic about Pvt. Benjamin James Taylor. Edward Lee Taylor was born 16 November 1839.

Edward Lee enlisted in Allen's Artillery 11 September 1862 at Chaffin's Bluff on the James River. This is where Captain Allen's company was during much of the war and near where Coleman's Artillery from Brunswick County was stationed.

Edward Lee served as a teamster for the post quartermaster through most of the remainder of the war. On The Retreat, he fought his way to Amelia County where he participated in the Battle of Saylers Creek on 6 April 1865. He was wounded so severely in his right hand in this battle that surgeons had to amputate it. The Union Army paroled him at Burkeville Junction between 14 and 17 April 1865.

Edward came home when he was able to do so and returned to farming. [456] In March 1869 he married Sallie J. Turner and they had five children: James Edward Taylor (19 Jun 1871) died in childhood, Miles Taylor (30 Jun 1873), David W. Taylor (26 Apr 1876) died in infancy, Turner Ashby Taylor (12 Apr 1880), and Sallie A. Taylor (4 Jan 1884) died in infancy. They also reared Sarah Agnes Turner, called unofficially his "adopted daughter." [457]

Edward Lee was an active member of Williams Methodist Church and served for many years as steward. He and his family lived in Red Oak District of Brunswick County. In 1880 his brother Richard Henry Taylor *, Confederate veteran, was living with him and his family.

Edward Lee applied for a Civil War pension in 1888 giving his address as Turner's Store Post Office. In his pension application he recalled his service in Captain Allen's company, his wound at the Battle of Saylers Creek, and the loss of his right hand. He was now 48 years old.

Edward Lee's wife, Sallie, who was born August 1844, died 1 February 1917. The old Confederate, known locally as "Pomp" Taylor, passed away in November of the same year. They lie buried on his old place near the railroad depot of some years back called Grandy.

Mr. Taylor's obituary, which appeared in the local paper, described him as a very outstanding citizen, one who was very active in his church for many years and greatly loved by the people of his community. It said, "He entered the War Between the States in 1861 and continued in service until the close of the war. He lost an arm in defense of his beloved Southland. He was a brave and faithful soldier on the battlefield, and in all other relations of life he did his part well."

Edward Lee's son Miles Taylor married Minnie Ella Rawlings, daughter of Robert Rawlings* and Mary Armistead King, 29 April 1900. They had three children: Olive Taylor, Christine Taylor, and Robert Edward Taylor (— 1973). While Edward Lee Taylor was born in Lunenburg County he and his family lived in Brunswick County.

Olive Taylor married Elliott D. Nunnally (— 7 Aug 1961) who is in Greenlawn Cemetery in Newport News, Virginia. Olive lived in Hampton, Virginia, with her daughter Susan (Nunnally) Sarro. She also had a son, Allen Edwin Nunnally.

Christine Taylor married Loyal Vernon Gwyn (— 19 Jul 1967) who is in Pleasant Grove Methodist Church Cemetery. Christine lived in Portsmouth and was a reporter for *The Ledger-Star*.

Edward Taylor, a railroad telegraph operator and station agent, married Theresa Belchard of Arizona. They had two daughters, one of whom had asthma, so they moved to Arizona and lived in Tucson. He lies buried in Arizona. His widow married Clyde F. Eddy.

Turner Ashby Taylor married Inez Ozlin of Lunenburg County. Ashby and Inez had five children: Jane Elizabeth Taylor who married Turner S. Goodwyn 27 December 1927 and lived in Dundas, Virginia. Sue Franklin Taylor who married J. Samuel Jones and lived in Lynchburg, Ozlin Lee Taylor who married Margaret Bridgers Price. Robert Miles Taylor who married Hazei Gill and lived at Meredithville, and Charles Perry Taylor who lived in Richmond, Virginia.

PVT. HENRY CLAY TAYLOR (1839 – 1923) was a son of George Washington Taylor and Eveline G. Hawkins who wed in Brunswick County in 1835 (his marriage bond dated 19 December). [458]

When the census was taken in Brunswick County in 1850. George W. Taylor, age 36, and Eveline, 35, were living in the northern part of Brunswick County. They had five children: Robert Alexander Taylor*, Henry Clay, age 10, who was born 2 June 1839, Sarah R. Taylor (c1842 — 1908), Norborne Thomas Taylor*, and Lucy Q. Taylor (c1848 — 3 Sep 1921). Susan Elizabeth Taylor (— 1920) was born after the census was taken in 1850.

Eveline Taylor died in childbirth 1 March 1854, and George subsequently married Martha Jane Epperson, daughter of David Epperson and Patsy Moore identified in the topic about Pvt. David J. Epperson. George died 6 March 1879.

In 1860 the family was living near Crichton's Store in what today is Meherrin District. Henry was a school teacher before the Civil War.

All three sons served in the Confederate Army. Neither Sarah nor Susan married.

Lucy Taylor married Walter Paul Rawlings, son of Rev. Nicholas Rawlings, 23 December 1874. They had a daughter Eva Maud Rawlings (Sep 1879) who married Russell Carpenter in 1902. and one other baby that died in infancy. Eva and Russell were parents of Madeline Carpenter, Thelma Carpenter, Joe Carpenter, and Bobbie Carpenter. Walter Paul Rawlings and his wife, Lucy, are in Rock Methodist Church Cemetery.

Henry Clay Taylor was exempted 15 March 1862 from service in the Confederate Army because of dyspepsia. Later, however, when required to enlist in Confederate service, he joined the *Ebenezer Grays* and served in Co. E, 56th Virginia Infantry Regiment. The Army discharged him from the *Ebenezer Grays* 19 June 1863, probably because of a recurrence of his illness, but he apparently did not leave the Army, as General Lee was preparing to march into Pennsylvania. According to family tradition, Henry went with the Army and was in the famous charge toward the Union lines at Gettysburg.

⁴⁵⁶ In the topic about Col. Frederick Samuel Bass, Dr. Pritchett wrote that Bass' sister Margaret Bass married one Edward Taylor in 1860. The Bass family lived near Lunenburg County and possibly this was Edward's first wife.

On 14 March 1864 Henry enlisted in Co. B, 56th Virginia Infantry Regiment, the *Mecklenburg Spartans* from Mecklenburg County. He served in this company to the end of the war and surrendered at Appomattox Court House 9 April 1865. Army records describe Henry as 5 feet, 11 inches tall, with fair complexion, brown hair, and gray eyes.

Henry came home from the war, and it is said that he was one of the Confederate veterans who never liked to talk about the war. He said little about his wartime experiences.

On 14 December 1871 Henry Clay Taylor married Lavinia Augusta (Nash) Walker, widow of Marcus H. Walker who fought in the Civil War and died in Federal prison. Lavinia was of the Nash family outlined in the topic about Pvt. James Jasper Nash.

Henry Clay and Lavinia, called "Miss Veenie," lived in the Biackridge community in Mecklenburg County. Their home was called "Aspen Grove," and their three children were born there as follows: Henry Vernon Taylor (11 Oct 1872 — 29 Mar 1937), Iva Estelle Taylor (6 Nov 1876 — 27 Dec 1967), and George David Taylor (27 Dec 1879 — 29 Jan 1959). Henry ran a store and post office that was the beginning of Blackridge.

The old Confederate Henry Clay Taylor lost his wife, Lavinia, 23 August 1905. He lived on, and passed away 21 March 1923 at about 84 years of age. They lie buried at Olive Branch Baptist Church near Blackridge.

Henry Vernon Taylor married Rosa Lee Wilson (— 3 Aug 1957) and they lived in the Blackridge community where he was an active member of Olive Branch Church. He and Rosa, who had no children, are in Olive Branch Baptist Church Cemetery.

Iva Estelle Taylor married Oscar Blackwell Cook (20 Apr 1860 – 17 Apr 1919), son of William Pennington Cook and his wife, Mary Sterling Smith, at "Aspen Grove" 18 December 1895. He died in Chesterfield County, Virginia, and Iva Estelle at South Hill. They are in Olive Branch Baptist Church Cemetery.

Iva Estelle and Oscar had ten children: James Bryan Cook (— 1954), William Henry Cook, Mary Lavinia Cook who did not marry, Robert David Cook, Bernice Blackwell Cook, Frances Elizabeth Cook who died at five years of age, Susan Blanche Elizabeth Cook, Mabel Claire Cook, John Oscar Cook (— 19 Jun 1957), and Pauline Jennings Cook.

James Bryan Cook married Maude Doma Moseley, daughter of James Walter Moseley and Lucy Jane Ford, 9 December 1922. They were parents of James Bryan Cook Jr. of Chester, Virginia, who held a position with the commonwealth in Richmond and contributed to this story, Phyllis Page Cook who married Peter Madison Axson Jr. 14 April 1951, Walter Blackwell Cook who married Grace Azilee Tumlin of Greensville, South Carolina, 27 April 1957, and was executive vice president—operations, Quaker State Oil Refining Corporation, and William Manning Cook.

William Henry Cook married Alice Glass Fowlkes from Danville 23 May 1936. They had a son William Henry Cook Jr.

Robert David Cook married Elsie Elizabeth Allgood in Washington, D.C., 26 June 1937. They had two children: Reginald Owen Cook and Robert David Cook. Bernice Blackwell Cook married John Melvin Farmer from Halifax County 4 June 1931 and they had no children.

Susan Blanche Elizabeth Cook married Matthew Montague Rainey at LaCrosse 16 June 1937. They were parents of Margaret (Rainey) Taylor and Matthew Montague Rainey Jr.

Mabel Claire Cook married Robert Fulton Ferrell at Petersburg 22 December 1931. They were parents of Anne Claire Ferrell. Elizabeth Fulton Ferrell, and Nancy Leigh Ferrell.

John Oscar Cook married Louise Crymes Pully at Emporia 13 October 1938. They were parents of Gladys Hutchens Cook, John Oscar Cook, and Mary Iva Cook.

Pauline Jennings Cook married Aubrey Duffer at LaCrosse 24 May 1942. They had one daughter, Judith Carol Duffer.

George David Taylor, Henry Clay Taylor's third child, became a dentist and lived in Richmond. He married Emily Hay and they had no children. Dr. Taylor is in Oakwood Cemetery in Richmond. His widow, Emily, lived in Richmond.

PVT. JAMES A. TAYLOR (c1835) was a son of John W. Taylor and Elizabeth J.W. Buckner who were married in Brunswick County in 1823 (his marriage bond dated 24 February). They lived before the Civil War in the southern part of Brunswick County where John was a carpenter.

When the census was taken in Brunswick County in 1850, John W. Taylor, age 50, and his wife, Elizabeth, 45, were living with two sons, both of whom would later serve in the Confederate Army: Napoleon Bonaparte Taylor* and James A., age 15.

James A. Taylor served in Co. F. 12th Virginia Infantry Regiment, the *Huger Grays*, organized in Greensville County in April 1861. The men enlisted 6 June 1861 for service in the war and served through the entire conflict.

James fought in many bloody battles and came finally to the Battle of the Wilderness fought north of Richmond 5-7 May 1864. In this battle a Minié bullet hit James Taylor in his hip where it remained the rest of his life. This probably ended James' service in the Confederate Cause.

Incidentally, the Minié bullet was invented by Capt. C.E. Minié of France. Armies used it through much of the middle of the 19th century.

On 20 December 1865 in Mecklenburg County, James married Virinda (Jones) Kidd, a widow who was a daughter of James B. Jones and wife. Martha —. They evidently lived in Mecklenburg County for some time. In 1880 they were living in the South Hill District and had three children: John Taylor (c1866), Jacob Taylor (c1870), and Walton Taylor (c1872). With them was Virinda's son by her previous marriage to Bart Kidd, Samuel Kidd, age 20.

James' wife, Virinda, died after 1880 and on 12 February 1890 he married Susanna Florence (Parrish) House, a widow. He was now 55 and she was 35 years of age, and they lived in Brunswick County. They had a son named James R. Taylor (21 Feb 1894).

James Taylor was living at Gholsonville in Brunswick County in 1894 when he applied for a Civil War pension. In his pension application he recalled his service in the *Huger Grays* and his wound at the Battle of the Wilderness.

We have not learned when the old Confederate died or where he lies buried. He was dead before 1903 and probably is laid to rest in a family cemetery in the Gholsonville community, or beside his wife. Virinda, in Mecklenburg County.
